Janet Houts thanked BOCC for letting her speak. She didn't have a lot of time to review the minutes because they were put out late on Friday and she was reviewing the Agendas. She spoke on the comparisons between the Fire and Sheriffs that the budget was 2 million for the sheriff and in the minutes it does not state anything at all. She would like the minutes corrected on those basis..

8. DISCUSSION (No Action): Committee/Staff Reports-

Legislative Lobbyist Yvonne Murphy- She read a letter in to the record: Good Afternoon, I am Yvonne Murphy

May I take this opportunity to thank the Commission and the citizens of Storey County for allowing me to serve as your legislative lobbyist from January 2009 thru August 2012.

Over that period of time, I had the privilege and honor of working with devoted Storey County employees; all of whom were exceptional in their duties.

Additionally, I was pleasantly surprised as I developed several friendships with both individuals and families-giving me a much deeper insight and connection. This is something I will hold dear for many years to come.

That said, during this past legislative session, though I no longer officially represent Storey County, as a friend. I continued to monitor issues that could impact this unique and very special community.

And, for the record, I report my observations to my client (and your Commissioner) Lance Gilman.

In closing, as I venture forward into my life and career, I look forward to teaching and attending the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University where I will study 21st Century Public Policy.

To that end, I'd like to leave you with a quote from Albert Schweitzer (who said):

I don't know what your destiny will be, but the one thing I do know is; the only one amongst you who will be truly happy are those who have sought and found a way to serve.

Deputy Recorder Roberta Martinoni-

Talked on the legislative bill that passed regarding redaction, it gives counties more time to get all personal information such as social security numbers redacted. She added that the Recorder's office is doing great, they are very pleased with Marney Hansen as the Recorder's Office new employee, business is picking up less defaults and more deeds coming through, an indicator our economy is picking up. Chairman Sjovangen said he was glad that the redaction bill passed.

Community Services Director Deny Dotson-

He thanked the department heads and businesses that sent their employees on the FAM tour last week they had 65 people for the tour. He spoke on 4th of July; lots of planned fireworks, parade, Comstock Cowboys, Wine Walk, and a fast draw competition at the south end of town across from the Fourth Ward School. Positive numbers for the month of March means they are doing a decent job in town \$10,000 bump from a year ago with room tax and sales tax.

Chairman Sjovangen says he likes these FAM tours it gives everyone a chance to see their county.

Administrative Office/Senior Planner Austin Osborne-

Appreciated the BOCC continuing Item #11 Comstock Chapter/AFSCME Local Union contract. They all agreed to look back over the contract one more time and fix all grammar. Also thanked the union for being very cooperative and enjoyable to work with.

Austin has received nine applications for the planner job they are all well qualified.

He needs to do more research on planning in regards to SB374 which would amend NRS 453A with medical marijuana dispensaries, it hasn't been approved by the Governor yet. They'll be things that the county will have leverage on regarding zoning and regulations. The bill allows them in commercial zones. The way the bill reads Storey County would be able to have one dispensary. He just wants to start planning for when it does come across his desk, because they will need to update codes. He will update BOCC as soon as more information is available.

Public Works Director Mike Nevin-

Louise Peri Park improvements are almost completed they are waiting on NV Energy to make a decision on the street light placement across from the park. He has been working with Austin regarding a job description/announcement for a seasonal maintenance for that park in Lockwood; he hopes to fill that position by first of July. He thanked Marilee and John Miller for all they have done down there on a volunteer basis with opening and closing of the park gate and keeping an eye on things down there.

Local pool opened for the season on June 8th, there were some broken plumbing problems that got resolved but it is open. Handicap restroom and lift project are 99% completed. They had a walk through on Friday. Cherie and Mike from Miles Construction are doing the final accounting of the grant and match funds. There will be a determination on how much will be left for the purchase of the portable lift which is a very important part of the project. The grant was originally for \$152,000.00 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding and we provided a \$20,000 match. The grant fund got cut by \$20,000.00 so there wasn't much left to work with and that was a prevailing wage project.

Public Works has been involved with St. Mary's Art Center; the board has asked Public Works for assistance on some improvement to the driveway and parking lot. That project is about 75% completed; they had to move on to the next project. (Due to flash flood)

On June 10th they were hit hard and heavy with some severe thunderstorms and flash floods with damage they had not seen in recent years the main damage was to Six Mile drainage, TRI (Portofino drainage area). He thanked Storey County Chief Gary Hames with his assistance in providing help with the dozers and operators.

Chain link fence behind the Courthouse will be replaced with a new solid redwood fence next month. State Office of Historic Preservation is providing grant funding. The reason for this is so there is no view into the courtroom for security reasons. They allocated \$15,000 towards the project got a good quote from a Tahoe Fence in Moundhouse for \$3,500.00. Cherie is working with the company to use the remaining grant funding to start some work on the west wall to make it safer. Mike added it is getting to the point of being unsafe.

Chairman Sjovangen asked Mike if the Highlands people have asked him about paving Cartwright.

Mike has had some initial discussions about it with Pat Flanagan and Jim Stewart to see what they want out there and what they will be able to do. He will sit down and have a meeting with them before they develop a scope of work out there to see if they are in agreement to pay for some of the materials that are going to be required. They are basically talking about approaches

on Delta and crack sealing and a sealant over the crack sealing. As long as nothing pops up he hopes to get on it soon.

Merilee Miller Rainbow Bend-

Had pictures (pictures available in the Clerk's office) of the dying grass and goat heads, she feels there is not enough water pressure to water these areas. Mike feels that GID need to do something about the pressure and he will talk to Doug and Steve about it also. John Miller commended Mike Nevin and all his crews for making the park look like a park. It is being used by several families.

Comptroller Hugh Gallagher-

Internal Financial Statements ending in May 2013, these are unaudited but gives us an idea on where we are as to the budget for all of our departments to make sure from now until the closing which is in 12 days they don't get surprised by anything and that they use diligence in there expenditures and that all revenues get recorded properly. This statement for the end of May reflects a couple of figures that are very positive in going forward. Our overall general budget is about \$900,000 more than we anticipated last year. He feels that is a very good number. Personal property taxes and centrally assessed was about \$214,000 over and above what we had budgeted he feels that is a good number understanding the assessed evaluation, CAP values, he credited Jana Seddon, Tobi Whitten and Vanessa DuFresne on getting numbers out before taxation is. The number we had before taxation was only about \$214,000 less what he came up with, they have a lot more time and stuff to go over then we do. He feels those three ladies should be commended. Merchandise licenses were up \$9,000 from before which means something is going on, special use permits are about \$10,000 over and above what was budgeted, sales tax is up about \$8,000, Assessor fees was up \$46,000 which was a very good surprise. This is an indication businesses are starting to pick up. Utilities fees are up. Vanessa has done a great job at trying to invest things to get a bigger bank for a buck that was about \$28,000-\$29,000 over and above what we thought we were going to get considering the interest rate. Penalties for personal and real property taxes were about \$98,000, which was a lot less than before which indicates people have enough money to pay their taxes.

Vanessa and Hugh went to a GFOA conference in San Francisco; he talked about the courses they attended 1) Office and Management of Budgets it was about federal grants and improper payments 2) Lt. Governor of California Gavin Nelson spoke about wanting to get citizens involved in the government. Hugh is going to do a power point on the current budget and the process of the budget sometime in July with the members of the Highland, Mark Twain and Rainbow Bend Lockwood. He hopes this will help everyone understand the budgeting process. 3) Course on audited financial statements trying to get the audited financials out and approved by the county commissioner's within 120 days, he said that is a real stretch but not impossible. Trying to get all the revenue and expenses in before we close the book which is usually 60 days he wants to try to do it in 45 days. He is going to try to do new things like PBC's (Prepared By Client) which take the accounts that are done by the outside auditor and do it internally which saves money by not having to pay the auditor to do it.

Sheriff Gerald Antinoro-

Spoke about sheriff's office volunteer Chaplin Gary Bowers passing away last week, his services will be on the 29th in Carson City he has been with the department since 2009 and he will be missed.

He talked about the VCTC obtaining a liquor license, they have received the packet and the back ground investigation has started, he feels the only way they can issue them a license because they are not recognized as an independent entity or independent business the license would have to be issued as part of Storey County so between now and it being put on the agenda he told the Commissioner's to really think about wanting to be in the alcohol business because if something happens they will be responsible. The only other way would be if they were under their own entity.

Fire Chief Gary Hames-

Pump testing has been completed for the type I & II apparatus, they all passed with a few amendments to the gallons per minute ratings from the factory, they found they were rated at 1500 but they are passing test at a 1000 so they are declining.

They have completed county wide a sand table exercise for all county personnel, it was based on a wild land fire in Gold Hill just above what used to be the Cabin in the Sky it ran into the old fire from 1983, it was excellent training. This was the 6th year of doing one with wild fire, and he is hoping to do one for an earthquake next year.

Fire restrictions going into effect today by BLM and NDF, they received notification of it late last week. Storey County will be tagging on to it starting June 28th there will be a press release going out in both papers.

Chief Hames thanked Mike Nevin for letting him use equipment for fuel reduction projects.

He will be getting a press release out regarding the U-Call/U-Haul program; anyone doing fuel reduction can use the trailer to haul off the brush at any time. They will be purchasing a chipper soon so he told the public to haul brush to Highlands Fire Department and Mark Twain and they will be throwing it in to the chipper instead of burning it.

County Manager Pat Whitten-

Reminded everyone that there was only 12 days left to get your ambulance subscription in. He added that CFOA is going on in Carson City this week.

District Attorney Bill Maddox- let everyone know they are shorthanded until January so please be patient with them. He spoke about Judge Ed Reed who has passed away. He was a great Nevadan.

9. **DISCUSSION (No Action):** Greg Hess, Mary Walker and Maggie Lowther – Recap and highlights of the recently concluded 2013 Legislative Session and Special Session.

Pat Whitten told BOCC that Maggie Lowther was at the CFOA conference.

Mary Walker, with Walker & Associates and Storey County Lobbyist, explained the Legislative Coalition which consists of four counties Storey County, Carson City, Douglas County and Lyon County was started 14 years ago, Storey County being involved with it for 7 or 8 years. Basically, when they go to the Legislature and testify on behalf of four counties instead of a single county. Mary thanked Pat for being a strong information gatherer for them. She said they had a wonderful team which consisted of Pat Whitten, Greg "Bum" Hess, Maggie Lowther, Chairman Sjovangen, Hugh Gallagher she really appreciated all the cooperation they received. She stated there were 1,123 bills this session and 404 bills they were monitoring. She feels this is the most successful session in many years. Most of the bills they were supporting became law most of the bills that were detrimental to us were either killed or amended. Some of the bills that they were supporting she talked about AB68, SB3, SB452, SB272, AB511. They spent a lot of time in defense on bills that would have been detrimental to us AB157, SB217, AB423, SB316, AB139, AB286 she was happy with all the outcomes. She talked about the Governor's budget and contrary to what happened in 2011 a lot of cost shift down to us, this time around, because of request to the Governor and Mike Wilden about getting some alleviation from the past push down to us in 2011 and for Storey County they got the assessments decreased by 7%. She spoke on the internal session for the next 18 months those issues that were primary importance and are very complicated issues they can't be dealt with in a four month period, so now over the next 18 months the legislature is going to have a series of studies in regards to a verity of issues it's going to be on water, property tax, health care, funding of community college which is very important one because they are trying to get the counties to pay for the community colleges and not the state. She said it is very important to be involved the next 18 months, because she said the first question at the 2015 is going to be where you were the past 18 month.

Mike Walker spoke on water resources SB400 with the mining coming back to Storey County it will be valuable to our county. He also thanked the Storey County Staff for all their help.

Greg "Bum" Hess thanked Mary and Mike for all their help.

Pat Whitten commended them all on their hard work.

Chairman Sjovangen called a 10 minute recess at 3:14

Chairman Sjovangen called to order at 3:24

Pat Whitten explained this happens at the end of June every year these set the salary grade ranges for

Non-represented employees, it also acknowledges the NRS statues pay for the Assessor, Recorder, Sheriff, Clerk/Treasurer, District Attorney, Commissioners. There is one elected office plus a non-represented and that is the Justice of the Peace that you do have discretion authority to set. From the original resolution that was provided in the packet there has been two notable changes 1) After talking to the Sheriff there is no need for Court Bailiff or no need for Lieutenant 2) IT Director.

Mr. Whitten read Resolution No. 13-373 into record:

A Resolution Setting Salaries of Elected County Officers and Employees fixed by Ordinance or Resolution per NRS. 245.043 for Elected Officials and NRS 245.045 for Appointed Officials.

Effected July 1, 2013

Mark Phillips stated that per NRS Appointed Officials need to file financial statements he feels Austin Osborn, Greg Hess and Joe Curtis should all be filing financial statements. Chairman Sjovangen asked Mark what this had to do with this resolution.

Janet Houts wanted to know why the VCTC is on this resolution if they are their own entity.

Pat Whitten explained that even though the VCTC is its own separate local government, we have been working with taxation. VCTC employees under one or more Attorney General Opinion are considered employees of Storey County. VCTC pays portions of the salary for Community Services and Tourism Director, 100% of salary and benefits Tourism and Marketing Manager, but under AG opinion still considered Storey County Employees. Commissioner's still set their salaries.

Chairman Sjovangen said it would be the same for Fire Chief too.

Mr. Whitten recognized Mike out in the audience. They have wanted to do this for a long time. It is going to save a lot of money. Pat Thanked everyone that helped make this happen. He said it will be in effect July1, 2013.

Janet Houts presented questions regarding the 473 and 474 and salaries. Mr. Whitten answered her questions. Janet Houts thanked Mr. Whitten for answering her questions.

16. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Approval of Resolution 13-374 for the dissolution of NRS NDF Fire Protection District. The new Wildland Fire Protection Program (WFPP) will replace the need for the NRS 473 NDF Fire Protection District.

17. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Approval of Resolution 13-376 augment the NRS 474 Storey County Fire Protection District Fund.

Pat Whitten spoke on the augmentation being an isolated fund like Chief Hames has with the 474 district being able to minimize the augmentation with flexibility with in the funds. But the Chief operates a great Wildland Fire Protection Program of his own with the dozer operations and those out of district assignments create a large fluctuation that trigger these kinds of augmentations.

Hugh Gallagher spoke on the augmentation out of the 474 fire fund of \$384,566; this is a result of our Mutual Aid program which is a special revenue fund that they created in July 1st of this year. Previously, they were putting it in the fire emergency fund because they needed to know what was being paid and coming in at the end of incidents outside the county. So which means everything in his budgeted items made a great amount of increase then normal so this augmentation will take care of some of that, so anything that comes in with mutual aid fund will go in to its own fund. He said that upon their approval they approve the \$384,566, which is higher than the anticipated to go against salary, wages, services, supplies and capital outlay as they have on the resolution.

Janet Houts had questions on the financials and performance. Mr. Gallagher answered her questions these increase in this revenue go towards salaries in the amount of \$67,000, which was used for fires outside this county. They were billed for separately for this county. So there is an increase of revenues from those fires that were outside this county that he Fire Chief had to absorb with in his fire district. We are now taking revenues that are higher than we thought because of those charges. Now they will budget for those items that were not previously budgeted for in his original budget, because they did not know what kind of money the fires would be, they didn't want to anticipate that because they are a separate incident outside the county. So they have done this for his salary, wages, services, supplies and capital outlay. This will not be the case next year because they have a special fund for all those expenditures and revenues for all the fires outside this county.

Mrs. Houts had more questions on sending employees outside this county and their salary. Her and Mr. Gallagher continued their discussion regarding the salaries employees receive while on assignment outside the county.

Motion: Approval of Resolution 13-376 augmentation of the NRS 474 Storey County Fire Protection District Fund. **Action:** Approve **Moved by** Vice-Chairman McBride **Seconded by** Commissioner Gilman

Vote: Motion carried by unanimous vote (summary: Yes=3)

18. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION**: Acceptance of fuel bids for vehicle and propane.

Pat Whitten commended Jennifer McCain on her hard work on putting together these bids. He explained they went out for a 3 year bid this year. They bid on regular unleaded, mid-grade unleaded and diesel fuel. They opened bids last Thursday at 10:00 am it included, Jennifer McCain, Comptroller Hugh Gallagher, Public Works Director Mike Nevin and himself and two representatives from two of the bidding companies when they publicly opened the bids. Presently we are getting fuel from Flyers. (Spread Sheets are available in Clerks Office). Carson Valley Oil came in at \$.08 a gallon at all locations except Lockwood. Flyers were asked if they would be willing to just serve just Lockwood and they came back with \$.12 a gallon. Mr. Whitten asked the Commissioners when they award the fuel bids to Carson Valley Oil with exception to Lockwood they include Flyers to do Lockwood.

Motion: Approval of acceptance of fuel bids to Flyers bid for Lockwood for vehicle gas and diesel and award Carson Valley Oil for all other locations of fuel bids for vehicle. **Action:** Approve **Moved by** Vice-Chairman McBride **Seconded by** Commissioner Gilman

Vote: Motion carried by unanimous vote (summary: Yes=3)

Mr. Whitten spoke on bids for propane we are currently with Ferrell gas at \$.24 over RAC rate in Sparks. This is for the County and School District, zero dollar tank rentals, zero fees for Haz-Mat or surge charges. Our employees last year received a \$.50 over RAC. Vice-Chairman asked that they get a resident rate also during the bids (Spread sheet available in clerk's office on different bids). He asked that if they award Ferrell Gas the bid, that the residents contact them to get the rate. He also explained that it might be the cheapest because everyone's rates change so much.

Janet Houts asked if they will be sending notification out to all the residents.

Mr. Whitten said they will work on press release.

Pat Flanagan questioned the RAC rate, he said it changes a lot. How do we know they are fulfilling the commitment over the RAC rate.

Jennifer said every time the propane RAC rate changes Jay e-mails her the changes.

Motion: Approval of acceptance of the propane bid to Ferrell Gas for a 3 year contract. **Action:** Approve **Moved by** Vice-Chairman McBride **Seconded by** Commissioner Gilman

Vote: Motion carried by unanimous vote (summary: Yes=3)

19. RECESS TO CONVENE AS STOREY COUNTY WATER AND SEWER BOARD

20. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION**: Approval of resolution 13-379 providing for an increase in the water and sewer rates.

Mike Nevin gave a brief overview of an annual occurrence this happens at the second meeting in June this is setting of the annual rates for the Storey County Water and Sewer System. The rates increases are for residential base rate \$4.11 for and \$5.90 for commercial for water and for sewer its \$4.02 for residential and \$7.09 for commercial.

Mr. Whitten stated that this should be the last year of the operational increases for the sewer, but bottom line there will be more increases on the sewer on the debt service side of it.

Janet Houts had questions on increases. Mr. Nevin answered her questions.

Motion: Approval of resolution 13-379 providing for an increase in the water and sewer rates. **Action:** Approve **Moved by** Vice-Chairman McBride **Seconded by** Commissioner Gilman

Vote: Motion carried by unanimous vote (summary: Yes=3)

21. RECESS TO RECONVENE AS THE STOREY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

22. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Renew, extend or allow to expire a lease on County owned property known as the Gold Hill Depot between Storey County and Gold Hill Historical Society.

Chairman Sjovangen stated he received an e-mail from Kim Fegert wanting this item continued. Request was denied.

Pat Whitten explained that the County has been leasing the Depot to Gold Hill Historical Society they had a 20 year contract but renew it every 5 years last time it was renewed was August of 2008. Mr. Whitten's recommendation is not to renew the contract and he said they could extend it

until August 30, 2013 then ask the Gold hill Historical Society to vacate it and we need to do exploratory talk with vested interest as well as the Gold Hill Historical Society and go out to bid and have a RFQ that says what you would like to do. He gave several reasons why not to renew the contract and reviewed several documents that are available in the Clerk's Office.

Kim Fegert, Gold Hill Historical, handed out documentation to the Commissioners he started by reading a letter dated 10-14-2011 from Stephen Drew:

Kim:

You beat me to an e-mail reply. A personal thank you to you and your Gold Hill Historical Society cohorts for rolling out the red carpet and giving the V&TRR History Conference attendees a rare behind-the-scenes look at significant restoration-in-progress! I trust you realize you were amidst a most appreciative audience. Your opening presentation and openness to Q & A were "spot-on." You were articulate and capably "stand and delivery." You very eloquently make the case for what you did and why you did what you did. You are an excellent spokesman for your organization. Hats off...congratulations...and our renewed thanks! The Sunday field trip to Gold Hill was a highlight of our conference. And we've already booked the Gold Dust West for the same weekend next year.

It was a pleasure working with you on our little booklet. I hope you like the way it comes out. (Skipped down to end of letter)

Again, Kim, our profound thanks. It was a great pleasure to work with you on the booklet and field trip. The interest of our members in the Gold Hill Depot is only increasing. We'll look for excuses to work together again in the future.

Kindest personal regards, Stephen

Kim continued talking about the booklet regarding the improvements of the building. He went on about the work they have been done and not haveing the support from the V& T manager for the best 10 years. He feels it's a personal issue. He feels they have done the County well. When they took the building over from the county it was worth firewood, now it's worth over \$350,000, he has done it all on his own time he has made not one dime on it.

Chairman Sjovangen wants to give others a chance to talk on it.

Judy Cohen had some questions regarding why they are not renewing his lease when he has done work on it.

Pat Whitten answered by saying they want to take a fresh approach at it. He said Mr. Maddox said this is really a lousy lease with no milestone or benchmarks that would governor on a county building. His recommendation is not to rush on redoing this lease, but to look and reassess their options over the next 3-6 months. He would like to see what Kim and Tom Grey, Jim Clark and others have to bring to revitalize it and make it the treasurer it can be.

Chairman Sjovangen added some personal observations over the past year. He sits on the V &T Rail Commission he said at one of the meetings Mr. Fegert went on under public comment for 40 minutes berating Mr. Grey and insulted every one of them that sat on the Rail Commission. He said it was an inexcusable act and the last meeting he did it insulted them again. He said we can no longer operate the rail road under this behavior. His recommendation is its time to move on. He told Mr. Fegert he has done an excellent job on the Depot, but his behavior has been inexcusable for the past year. His opinion is he wants him out of there and out of the picture.

Mr. Whitten spoke on some remarks that are in the packet as public record that Mr. Fegert had wrote to the Nevada Commission of Reconstruction of the V & T Railway on October 5, 2009 saying they planned on being open for business on the summer of 2010, being it is almost summer of 2013 this is one reason he gave his recommendation about not renewing the contract, because the progress of the building is just not happening in a timely manner.

Commissioner Gilman spoke on a personal observation the V & T Railroad and the expansion and the opportunity of tourism and the entire project for Storey County and Virginia City is a critical one and he feels it is a very important one their personal group including himself have sent funds approaching \$15,000.00 to the V & T Rail road fund. They are committed to excellence and professionalism of the operation. He does support a professional and successful operation. One of the outcomes he had heard that was appealing to him was to step back and re-evaluate and request proposals from a variety of individuals and keeping with a bidding process. He feels with Kim's experience would definitely be qualified to submit his vision of plans to the commission. He feels not renewing his lease but take a fresh look at it and consider him a qualified entity to resubmit to the community.

Kim Fegert spoke about the comments on the obscene gestures, at that time he addressed that he asked if there was any possible truth to this, because it would be insane of them to act in such a childless manner. He said no one in their organization has ever done such a thing. He said he put out an award of \$250.00 for anyone that could provide evidence of this. He spoke on his relationship with Mr. Grey tried to bury his letters that he wrote to support the Depot. (Available in packet) he went on to tell about all the improvements in and around the depot that they have done that would benefit the community. He is frustrated because he has pictures of the depot back in 1983 he can testify that it was nearly ready to fall down and now it's a fine structure now. Quite a bit of his own funding came through the State of Nevada through the Cultural Affairs Commission for which he has signed covenants that make him responsible to keep it up and that's what they have done.

Chairman Sjovangen said he was going to cut him off because he was drifting off of the conversation.

Mr. Whitten spoke on the gestures. He received a letter from Mr. Grey that Everett Schropshire's son was here visiting and he is a rail fan. He saw the locomotive at the Gold Hill, he stopped and got out and ask three men standing there if he could take some pictures, one of them was an engineer said to him could he not read the NO Trespassing signs and he could take pictures from the county road.

Mr. Fegert replied to that letter and has a copy of the letter he wrote you. Mr. Whitten stated that he has not seen that letter.

Chairman Sjovagen called for a motion being that there was no further comment. Vice-Chairman McBride said there is no doubt about the work that has been done, however based on the correspondence testimony heard today and conversation had with rail members he moved to allow the lease to expire. Commissioner Gilman added that he encourages Mr. Fegert to be involved in the future of the depot and to continue to work with the County.

Motion: Allow the lease to expire on August 30, 2013 **Action:** Approve **Moved by** Vice-Chairman McBride **Seconded by** Commissioner Gilman

Vote: Motion carried by unanimous vote (**summary:** Yes=3)

Chairman Sjovangen told him that he needs to get all personal items out by August 30, 2013; any large items need to be inventoried. In case things that were donated need to be accounted for. He wants him to provide Deny Dotson with keys.

4. Staff summary:

The purpose of the Comprehensive Regional Water System Report (Report) is to provide a regional overview of the water supplies and future water demands in the watershed. Included in the report is an analysis of changes in runoff patterns for the Carson River, discussion on the possibilities of developing water leasing and water banking programs, discussion on regional water conservation programs, and discussion on potential regional water system interties. It is important to note that this Report is not intended to supersede any water purveyors' Water Master Plan, but rather to provide a regional overview. The Report is available on the CWSD's website at: http://www.cwsd.org/newcms/userpages/2013CompRegWtrSystemPlan.aspx.

Highlights of the Report:

- The runoff patterns for the Carson River have been changing over the last 70 years. Part of the changes is due to climate impacts and part may be due to changes in agricultural practices.
- Currently, all the water purveyors can meet their immediate and near future water needs. Some
 water purveyors will have issues meeting their water needs in thirty years. Potential threats that
 could impact all the water purveyors are changes to water quality standards or possible groundwater
 contamination.
- Every water purveyor currently has a water conservation program, although some are more robust than others. Even though every water purveyor does have a water conservation program more can be done to educate and promote the wise use of water. One of the most cost effective ways of meeting future water demands is linking various water systems together. To do this in an organized fashion it may be worthwhile for the various water purveyors to meet in an informal or formal setting to open communication on how they can meet the future municipal water needs of the watershed by working together.

4. Staff summary:

DISCUSSION: In 2008, Carson Water Subconservancy District (CWSD) and the five counties located along the Carson River (Alpine, Douglas, Carson City, Lyon, and Churchill) adopted the Regional Floodplain Management Plan (RFMP). At that time Storey County was not a participating agency with CWSD and, therefore, the RFMP was not presented to the county. This RFMP was the result of a large collaborative process involving the Carson River Coalition River Corridor Working Group, floodplain administrators and staff from each of the five counties, and other interested stakeholders. The goal of the RFMP was to identify activities and projects that could reduce future flood damage to the watershed and the residents. As part of this process 38 suggested actions were identified (see attached list). It should be noted that these are suggested actions with no requirement that the counties who adopted the RFMP to implement all the projects identified in the plan.

Edwin James and Brenda Hunt from CWSD will give a brief overview of the RFMP. One requirement of the RFMP is that it be updated every five years. Ms. Hunt will also provide a presentation on the revisions and updates in the draft document. The revisions follow the Table of Contents of the original 2008 document to assist a reader in understanding the supplemental document content. The update is also being completed to assist those counties that participate in FEMA's Community Rating System (CRS) program, namely Carson City, Douglas County, and Storey County. The update includes the Risk MAP Charter that was signed by CWSD, counties along the Carson River, FEMA, and several other state and federal agencies. The Charter represents a good-faith effort by all parties to share data, communicate findings, and plan mitigation activities to protect communities within the watershed from flood risks. The Charter does not bind a county to do any particular program but ensures that FEMA and local county governments work together. Attached is a copy of the Charter.

Purpose:

Working in a close collaborative effort, Carson Water Subconservancy District (CWSD), FEMA Region IX (FEMA), U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), U.S. Geological Survey (USGS), U.S. Department of the Interior Bureau of Reclamation (USBR), State NFIP Coordinator, State Hazard Mitigation Office, and other partners (as listed on page 5) will identify, assess, communicate, and plan for flood risk within the Carson River Watershed (watershed), which includes portions of Alpine County in California and Douglas, Carson City, Storey, Lyon, and Churchill Counties in Nevada. The flood risk information provided can be used to enhance hazard mitigation plans, make informed decisions to improve resilience after flooding, protect the beneficial functions of floodplains, and raise awareness about local flood risks.

This charter:

- Details the long-term flood hazard mapping vision for the watershed;
- Describes the desired mapping, assessment, planning information, and planning products;
- Describes the assistance that CWSD and FEMA will provide;
- Summarizes local flooding concerns and indicates areas where floodplain changes are expected; and
- Describes the roles and responsibilities of the CWSD, FEMA, and other signatory partners.

Watershed Vision:

In 2008, all counties along the Carson River adopted the "Carson River Watershed Floodplain Management Plan" (FPM Plan) that describes the long-term goals and objectives for floodplain management. These goals are based on identification and mapping of floodplains to create a broad-based awareness of flood hazards and provide the data necessary to support community floodplain management programs. The mapping program will provide many benefits to watershed communities, property owners, and citizens. These include:

- Increased public awareness and action to reduce risk to life and property;
- Ability to build upon flood hazard data and maps produced during the Flood Map Modernization (Map Mod) program;
- Assess present and future risk;
- Address gaps in flood hazard data to form a solid foundation for risk assessment and floodplain management and provide entities with information needed to mitigate flood-related risk;
- Protection of the natural and beneficial function of drainage-ways and floodplains, including trail corridors, parks, recreational areas, wildlife habitat, flood storage, and groundwater recharge; and,
- Encouraging "Good Neighbor Policies" throughout all communities within the watershed.

Mapping and Assessment:

The watershed experiences flooding incidents on an average of every five years. Types of flood hazards include riverine and alluvial fan flooding and debris flows. Major flood events are typically the result of rain-on-snow events. Flood storage in the upper watershed is limited and available storage is not regulated. Therefore, flood flows are not actively managed and large flows can occur downstream. The watershed contains areas of open floodplains that are continually under threat of change and development. The FPM Plan calls for the protection of the natural function of these floodplains, especially lands within Carson Valley, which provide the bulk of the flood storage for the entire watershed.

Based on previous studies, information obtained during community public meetings for the development of the FPM Plan, and discovery meetings for mapping activity statements, a Five-Year Master Mapping Plan was developed for the watershed. The plan identifies the sequence of work to be performed in order to meet the goals and objectives for floodplain mapping and associated assessments and is consistent with the community goals described in the FPM Plan.

Regulatory Products:

FEMA will provide Alpine, Douglas, Carson City, Lyon, and Churchill Counties with the following updated regulatory products to support floodplain management and flood insurance administration.

- Flood Insurance Study (FIS) Report: The FIS describes the county's flood history and provides technical information on the study.
- Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM): The FIRM identifies the county's flood hazard zones, base flood elevations, and floodway boundaries. This map is also used to determine where flood insurance may be required.

Flood Risk Products:

CWSD and partners will work closely with FEMA to produce the products listed below which identify locations and causes of flood hazard changes and quantify the risks associated with those changes. This will allow Alpine, Douglas, Carson City, Lyon, and Churchill Counties to use these updated data and products to make informed hazard mitigation, land use and development, and emergency management decisions.

- Changes Since Last Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM): Changes since the last FIRM identify areas where the floodplain, floodway, and/or flood zone designations have changed since the previous flood study. Engineering factors that may have contributed to any changes will also be identified.
- Areas of Mitigation Interest: Areas of mitigation interest identifies areas where
 conditions may contribute to the severity of the flood hazard and associated
 losses. These include areas with a history of flood claims, hydraulic or other
 structures that contribute to backwater impacts, and areas experiencing land use
 change or development.

FEMA Resources to Support Flood Mitigation Actions:

FEMA encourages floodplain management activities that exceed minimum requirements through programs such as the Community Rating System (CRS). The watershed currently has two CRS communities, Douglas County and Carson City. FEMA also offers Hazard Mitigation Assistance grant programs that fund eligible mitigation activities which reduce disaster losses and protect life and property from future disaster damage. Information on these programs will be provided, along with other related State, Federal, and association resources throughout the project.

Communication and Coordination:

FEMA, CWSD, and partners will work together to establish a consistent flow of information about project status, timelines, and next steps. In addition to regular status reports, CWSD will coordinate with the counties, cities, and other entities in the watershed. CWSD will establish a Flood Mapping Project Management Team (PMT) that will meet on a regular basis to ensure that the goals of this charter are implemented in a coordinated manner. The PMT includes representatives from all counties, cities, Federal, State, and other governmental entities throughout the watershed. CWSD is also the coordinating entity for the Carson River Coalition (CRC), a large watershed-wide stakeholder group. The CRC will be provided opportunities to review and comment on mapping programs and the implementation of the living river concept as described in the adopted Carson River Watershed Regional Floodplain Management Plan.

FEMA will work with Alpine, Douglas, Carson City, Lyon, and Churchill Counties to enhance their ability to communicate flood hazards and associated risk to people who live and work within the watershed.

Specific meetings for each phase of mapping include:

- PMT Meetings: These meetings will focus on setting project expectations, roles and responsibilities of the PMT, and on validating and gathering data.
- Community Coordination Officer (CCO) Meeting/Open House: Local
 officials will be provided with FIS and FIRM information and requirements for
 map adoption. Meetings will be closely followed by open house meetings where
 FEMA, CWSD, and local community officials will present project results to local
 citizens and explain the impact that the results will have on development,
 planning, and flood insurance.
- Flood Study Review Meeting: Local officials, State, Federal, Tribal, and nongovernmental entities will be provided the opportunity to view and comment on
 drafts of the engineering analyses and flood risk data. This meeting may also
 include highlights of hazard mitigation planning and implementation of best
 management practices to reduce flood hazards in the watershed.

Roles and Responsibilities:

This Risk MAP Charter represents a good-faith effort by all parties to share data, communicate findings, and plan mitigation activities to protect the communities within the watershed from flood risk. It is not legally binding nor does it preclude a community from participating in the FIRM appeal process. The parties listed in the signature block

below agree to collaborate on flood hazard identification activities, risk analysis products, and will consult with each other to integrate contributions into flood hazard identification efforts. It is intended to provide a common "Good Neighbor" strategy to address flood hazards and increase resilience within the watershed.

FEMA and CWSD will provide local officials with regular updates on project status, the data and products described above, and outreach guidance to include local awareness of flood risk. These efforts will better enable local communities to take action to reduce risk, through the adoption of the maps, development or enhancement of mitigation plans, and increased communication with citizens to inform them of their risk and the steps that they can take to mitigate that risk.

Alpine, Douglas, Carson City, Lyon, and Churchill Counties, and other entities will provide input and updates throughout the study process to verify data and ensure that the information accurately represents their communities.

CWSD, FEMA, and local officials agree to communicate as needed over the course of each project outlined in the mapping program to review project milestones, outcomes, and impacts. CWSD and the PMT will meet at least twice a year to discuss, plan, and coordinate all mapping program projects.

If for any reason an entity who is a signatory to this document wishes to withdraw their participation from the Risk MAP Charter, they may do so at any time by submitting a written request to CWSD.

4. Staff summary: Storey County Public Works and the Storey County Water System have been working with the County's Engineer of Record, Farr West Engineering on a pipeline improvement project for the purchase and installation of automated air release valves to be installed on strategic locations along the Siphon and pipeline from Lakeview Estates to Virginia City. Engineering and design were completed in July 2013. The project was put out to public bid on August 2, 2013. Bids were received and publicly opened on August 22, 2013. Bids ranged from a high of \$334,008 to a low of \$205,012.76. The lowest responsible bidder was Coon's Construction. In order to bring the low bid within range of the project estimate of \$175,000 - \$178,000, a change order needed to be issued reducing the sites from 18 to 15, saving \$27,969.26.

As you are aware, bids for the Virginia City Siphon Pipeline Improvement Project were opened on August 22, 2013 and Coons Construction LLC was determined to be the lowest responsible and responsive bidder. Coons bid submittal was reviewed and was found to meet all project requirements. References were checked and found to be very positive; they come highly recommended. Furthermore, Coons Construction meets the qualifications presented in Instructions to Bidders, Article 3, of the contract documents which is to say that together with their subcontractors they have been engaged in this general class of work and have a history of completing projects successfully. They and their subcontractors are licensed and bonded.

Based on the above information, we recommend the Storey County Commissioners award to Coons Construction the base bid for an amount of \$205,012.76 less an immediate negative Change Order of \$-27,969.26 for a total award amount of \$177,043.50. The budget for construction is \$177,043.50 which leaves no money for contingencies. Near the end of the project, if further funds are required, we will negotiate with Coons Construction and request additional funds be approved by the County Commissioners. As of now, we do not expect any construction change orders and believe Coons Construction will work with Storey County Public Works to adequately address any concerns without increase to the contracted amount.



Whereas proper notice has been given of the intention to act upon a resolution authorizing the creation of a fund, now therefore, it is HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Storey County, State of Nevada, hereby approves creation of the Jail Fund for the purposes stated above.

RE: Brothel Licensing Fees

In 2011, the Wild Horse Brothel's license was revoked due to a violation of Storey County ordinance. Following the revocation, the license holder, Mr. Lance Gilman, applied for an expansion (or re-licensing) of the Mustang Brothel to cover two physical plants that had been previously prohibited until the 2009 revisions of the ordinance. The Mustang Ranch was "relicensed" in 2012 to cover both buildings, including the former Wild Horse Brothel.

During the re-licensing process, Mr. Gilman and his legal counsel was informed there would be a licensing fee adjustment due to now covering what had formerly been two brothels, which the ordinance had not considered when it allowed for licensing of contiguous properties under a single license.

In conversations subsequent to the 2012 re-licensing of the Mustang Ranch, discussion of an acceptable rate has taken place yet no set amount has been established nor has it been brought back to the board for discussion. It would be my recommendation that the established brothel license fee be maintained, with the addition to the licensing fees schema to cover contiguous properties at a rate of ½ of the existing fee rate.

Example: Mustang Brothel – Primary building \$75,000.00

Additional building \$37,500.00

Total fee for the Mustang Brothel license: \$112,500.00

While the Mustang Brothel is used in the example, this fee schedule would apply to all current and new brothel operations. I would further suggest this fee schedule become effective January 1, 2014.

I. KEY TERMS & DEFINITIONS

- 1.1 Large Parcel. NRS 278.471 defines a "Large Parcel" as a parcel which is at least one-sixteenth of a Section as described by a government land office survey; or, forty acres in area, including roads and easements. NRS allows Storey County by ordinance to govern the division ten acre or larger parcels, including roads and easements; however, Storey County does not currently have an ordinance allowing this. The requirements under NRS 278.471 do not apply to Large Parcels of one Section or 640 acres.
- 1.2 Merger and Re-Subdivision. NRS 278.4925 defines a "Merger and Re-Subdivision" as the merging and re-subdividing of two or more contiguous parcels of land or lots without reversion of the preexisting parcels to acreage. The recording of the re-subdivided parcels or lots on a final map, parcel map, or map of division into large parcels, as appropriate, constitutes the merging of the preexisting parcels into a single parcel and the simultaneous re-subdivision of that single parcel into parcels or lots of a size and description set forth in the final map, parcel map or map of division into large parcels, as appropriate.
- 1.3 Tentative Map. A survey map that is filed with the planning commission for its review and to which conditions in accordance with NRS 278.471-278.4713 may be applied.
- 1.4 Final Map. A survey map that is filed with the Board of Storey County Commissioners following action by the planning commission. The Final Map may contain conditions and modifications that were imposed by the planning commission and the Board. The Final Map must be filed with the Board within one year of filing with the planning commission, unless waived per NRS. Once approved by the Board, the Final Map is recorded with the County Recorder's Office.

II. BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS

2.1 Planning Commission action. At the planning commission hearing on August 15, 2013, the planning commission heard testimony from the applicant and county staff (no public comment was received). The applicant provided diagrams, photos, and maps of the subject property and the proposed changes. Discussion between the commission, staff, and applicant included access concerns, reasons why the applicant was proposing the changes, and the overall scope of the application. There was no public comment or opposition presented regarding the proposal. Staff presented an addendum to the planning commission; it amended the conditions of approval by adding a condition pertaining to access to Parcel 2. Said condition read: "5. Access. The filing of the Final Map with the Board of County Commissioners shall be accompanied by a statement that there shall be no sale, transfer, division, or merger of Parcel 1 and/or Parcel 2 shown on the Final Map unless legal and permanent access to Parcel 2 is established by deed or delineated on a Record of Survey. This statement shall be recorded with the Office of the Storey County Recorder to accompany the deeds for said real properties." The planning commission accepted the addendum and those modifications were to be incorporated into the County Commission recommendation (see Section 2.2 below for condition modification). County staff read into the record its recommended findings to be included with a motion for approval. The

planning commission voted unanimously (all planning commissioners were present) to approve the project in accordance with the stated findings as recommended by staff.

- 2.2 Background. The applicant proposes to combine then subdivide two existing Large Parcels to create two additional parcels and two remainder Large Parcels. The purpose of the land division is to create two parcels that are contiguous to existing developed land and provide for potential future commercial expansion. At its August 15 hearing, the planning commission conditioned a deed restriction provision to Parcels 1 and 2 (see Figures 2.2 and 2.3). It required Parcel 2 access to be delineated on a Record of Survey prior to sale of either Parcels 1 or 2. Since Tentative Map approval, staff and the applicant agreed on alternative access to Parcel 2 through an existing right-of-way in abutting Washoe County. Accordingly, the recommended conditions of approval in this report contain no provision for deed restrictions for access.




Figure 2.1: Vicinity showing existing subject parcels (approximate)

- **2.3** Existing conditions. Shown in Figure 2.1, there are currently two existing parcels of approximately 8,545 and 400 acres in area. Both parcels are vacant. Parcel 1 abuts Heavy Industrial Zoning and uses. Parcel 2 is surrounded by vacant land zoned F Forestry.




Figure 2.2: Existing conditions before merger/re-subdivision. See full map in Appendices A-C.

- **2.4 Proposed conditions.** The applicant proposes to combine an existing 8,545 acre parcel and an existing 440 acre parcel to then re-subdivide creating four parcels. The new parcels will be approximately 187 acres and 74 acres, and the two remaining parent parcels will be approximately 8,284 acres and 440 acres (see Figures 2.2 2.4).
- 2.5 Access and easements. The submitted map delineates existing easements crossing subject properties, including utility easements for NV Energy power line transmission, and access easements serving new Parcels 3 and 4. Proposed access easement to Parcel 3 was reviewed by the Storey County Fire District and county staff. They meet the purpose of NRS 278.4713; however, substantial grading for access will be necessary before development may occur. The following summary on access corresponds to the illustration in Figure 2.4:
 - Parcel 1: Primary access to this parcel is from the Canyon Way public right-of-way.
 - Parcel 2: This parcel is accessed from the historic "Immigrant Road" abutting subject property from neighboring Washoe County. The Washoe County Board of Commissioners recognized the "road" as a legal public right-of-way in 2006.
 - Parcel 3: This parcel is accessed from a 25' wide easement located along the north boundary of Parcel 4. That easement is connected to another easement crossing the north abutting parcel to Avenue of the Colors (see Appendix D, Grant of Easement).
 - Parcel 4: This parcel is accessed from a 25' wide easement crossing the north abutting parcel to Avenue of the Colors (see Appendix D, Grant of Easement).
- **2.6** Water source. There are no submitted plans to develop the subject properties with uses requiring domestic water. Thus, requirements for dedication of water rights to the county pursuant to SCC 16.24, in accordance with NRS 534, do not apply. For this reason, the applicant is also not required to file a Point of Diversion Map with the State Division of Water Resources.




Figure 2.3: Conditions after merger/re-subdivision. See full map in Appendices A-C.




Figure 2.4: Close-up excerpt showing main elements and details of merger and re-subdivision. See full map in Appendices B and C.

III. KEY ISSUES

The Tentative and Final Maps comply with the provisions of NRS 278.471-278.4725 in that they create less than five parcels, delineate required information by statute, and provide necessary easements for access to each subject parcel and for utilities.

IV. LAND USE COMPATIBILITY

Table 4.1 demonstrates existing land uses and zoning designations in and around the subject property. The land division maintains conditions allowable in the I-2 Heavy Industrial and F Forestry Zones, which are applicable to the subject land and surrounding land. Uses for which the reconfigured land will provide are consistent with the use designations in the Storey County Master Plan.

In addition to access for each respective property owner, the access easements may be utilized for wildland fire suppression. There are no evident conditions created by this proposal that would cause public safety risks.

VI. APPLICABLE CODES & REGULATIONS

- **6.1 Minimum acreage.** The subject properties are zoned I-2 Heavy Industrial and F Forestry. SCC 17.35.050 and 17.32.030 requires parcels in the I-2 Heavy Industrial Zone to be no less than 3 acres and no less than 40 acres in the F Forestry Zone. The parcels created and reconfigured in this application will exceed these minimum land area requirements.
- **6.2 Tentative Map.** NRS 278.471–278.4713 regulates the division of land into Large Parcels. The applicant must file a Tentative Map with the planning commission for the subject property and submit an affidavit stating that property taxes will be paid by filing of the Final Map (see 6.3 Final Map) as required by NRS 278.4725(8)(c).

The map must be entitled "Tentative Map of Division into Large Parcels"; additionally, the title will be suffixed with "Merger and Re-Subdivision". The map must be prepared and certified by a professional land surveyor; must show the approximate, calculated, or actual acreage of each lot; and show the total acreage of the land to be divided.

Any roads or easements of access which exist, are proposed in the applicable master plan, or are proposed by the person who intends to divide the land, must also be delineated on the map. Easements for public utilities that provide gas, electric, and telecommunications services and for any video service providers that are authorized by NRS 711 to operate video service network in the area must be shown...and public utilities that provide water and sewer services; easements for irrigation or drainage, and any normally continuously flowing watercourses; an indication of any existing road or easement which the owner does not intend to dedicate; the name and address of the owner of the land.

- **6.3 Final Map.** Pursuant to NRS 278.4725, the Board of County Commissioners with recommendation by the planning commission will take final action with an approval, conditional approval, or disapproval of a submitted Final Map. The action of the Board must be based on the requirements of NRS 278.472 which state the following:
 - The map must be:
 - o Entitled "Map of Division into Large Parcels Merger and Re-Subdivision";
 - o Filed with the Board of Storey County Commissioners no later than 1 year after the date that the Tentative Map was first filed with the planning commission*;
 - o Prepared by a professional land surveyor;
 - o Based upon an actual survey by the preparer and show the date of the survey and contain the certificate of the surveyor;

^{*}The applicant submitted a waiver of NRS 278 requirement that the Tentative Map be heard within 60 days of application to the planning commission. Therefore, the applicant must submit the Final Map to the Board of County Commissioners within one year of action by the planning commission.

- Clearly and legibly drawn in permanent black ink upon good tracing cloth or produced by the use of other materials of a permanent nature generally used for this purpose in the engineering profession. Affidavits, certificates and acknowledgments must be legibly stamped or printed upon the map with permanent black ink;
- o 24 by 32 inches in size with a marginal line drawn completely around each sheet, leaving an entirely blank margin of 1 inch at the top, bottom, and right edges, and of 2 inches at the left edge along the 24-inch dimension;
- o Of scale large enough to show clearly all details; and
- o The particular number of the sheet and the total number of sheets comprising the map must be stated on each of the sheets, and its relation to each adjoining sheet must be clearly shown.
- This map must show and define:
 - o All subdivision lots by the number and actual acreage of each lot;
 - Any roads or easements of access which exist and which the owner intends to offer for dedication, any roads or easements of access which are shown on the applicable master plan and any roads or easements of access which are specially required by the planning commission or the Board of Commissioners;
 - o Easements for public utilities that provide gas, electric and telecommunications services, and for any video service providers;
 - o Easements for public utilities that provide water and sewer services; and
 - o Any existing easements for irrigation or drainage, and any normally continuously flowing watercourses.
- Additionally, the Final Map filed with the Board of County Commissioners must be accompanied by a written statement signed by the Storey County Treasurer indicating that all property taxes on the land for the fiscal year have been paid.

VII. MASTER PLAN

The proposed division of land conforms to and does not conflict with the goals and objectives of the Storey County Master Plan including: maintaining a healthy environment for all residents of the county (Chapter 9, Goal 1); and ensure land use plans are compatible with the zoning map, master plan, and previous planning decision (Chapter 9, Objective 1.1). There are no proposed land uses or land use changes, or changes to parcel size or configuration that would allow land uses not currently allowed by the underlying zoning and Master Plan designation.

VIII. FINDINGS

- **8.1** Motion for approval. The following are found to be factual regarding the Final Map of Division into Large Parcels—Merger and Re-Subdivision under the recommended conditions of approval in Section IX of this report. A motion for approval should include at a minimum these findings and may include other findings deemed appropriate and factual by the body.
- 8.1.1 NRS 278.471-278.4725 regulates the division of land into Large Parcels.
- 8.1.2 NRS 278.471 defines a "Large Parcel" as a parcel which is at least one-sixteenth of a section as described by a government land office survey; or, forty acres in area, including roads and easements.
- 8.1.3 A Merger and Re-Subdivision is defined in NRS 278.4925 as the merging and resubdividing of two or more contiguous parcels of land or lots without reversion of the preexisting parcels to acreage. The recording of the re-subdivided parcels or lots on a final map, parcel map, or map of division into large parcels, as appropriate, constitutes the merging of the preexisting parcels into a single parcel and the simultaneous resubdivision of that single parcel into parcels or lots of a size and description set forth in the final map, parcel map or map of division into large parcels, as appropriate.
- 8.1.4 This approval is for a "Final Map of Division into Large Parcels-Merger and Re-Subdivision". This title and the process by which the map is approved comply with NRS 278, including NRS 278.471–278.4725.
- 8.1.5 The conditions created by this map do not conflict with existing applicable zoning regulations, including minimum parcel size and building setbacks.
- 8.1.6 Conditions created by the map comply with the land use restrictions and entitlements underlying regulatory zone, are as stringent and not in conflict with federal, state, and county regulations, and will not cause or facilitate impacts that do not already exist to surrounding existing land uses.
- **8.2** Motion for denial. Should a motion be made to deny the requested Final Map of Division into Large Parcels-Merger and Re-Subdivision, the following findings of fact with explanation why should be included in that motion.
- 8.2.1 The proposal conflicts with one or more requirements of NRS 278.471–278.4725.
- 8.2.2 Conditions created by the map conflict with existing zoning regulations, including minimum parcel size, building setbacks, or other zoning regulations, or the land use designations of the Storey County Master Plan.
- 8.2.3 Conditions created by the map cause or facilitate impacts not already existing to surrounding land uses.
- 8.2.4 The map does not provide sufficient access or access easements to one or more of the subject properties.

IX. CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

The conditions of approval and action taken on the Tentative Map by the planning commission and the action taking on the Final Map by the Board County Commissioners must comply with NRS 278.471-278.4725 and 278.4925. The following conditions comply with the NRS:

- 1. The Final Map shall conform to the requirements of NRS 278.471-278.4725 and NRS 278.4925 including, but not limited to, filing of Final Map within 1 year of approval of Tentative Map*, map title, survey, and map requirements. If the Final Map is not filed with the Storey County Recorder's Office within 1 year (12 months) from the date of Tentative Map approval by the planning commission, this approval shall become null and void. (*The applicant submitted a waiver of NRS 278.472(1) requirement that the Tentative Map be heard within 60 days of application to the planning commission. Therefore, the applicant must submit the Final Map to the Board of County Commissioners within one year of action by the planning commission.)
- 2. As required by NRS 278.4725, the Final Map must also show and define the following:
 - All subdivision lots by the number and actual acreage of each lot;
 - Any roads or easements of access which exist and which the owner intends to offer
 for dedication, any roads or easements of access which are shown on the applicable
 master plan and any roads or easements of access which are specially required by the
 planning commission or the Board of County Commissioners;
 - Easements for public utilities that provide gas, electric and telecommunications services, and for any video service providers;
 - Easements for public utilities that provide water and sewer services;
 - Any existing easements for irrigation or drainage, and any normally continuously flowing watercourses.
- 3. The filing of the Final Map with the Board of County Commissioners must be accompanied by a written statement signed by the Storey County Treasurer indicating that all property taxes on the land for the fiscal year have been paid.
- 4. The Final Map shall not cause building or structure setback distances to become non-compliant with the setback requirements in the respective zones.

X. POWER OF THE BOARD AND PLANNING COMMISSION

The Board of County Commissioners has the power to make planning and zoning decisions for Storey County and has created the planning commission to advise the Board as provided in Title 2 of the Storey County Code ("SCC") and NRS 278 and 278A. The planning commission must perform all duties and functions delegated to a county planning commission by the terms of NRS 278.010 to 278.630, inclusive, and SCC Chapter 2.12 (Planning Commission). The planning commission is advisory to the Board. The planning commission must hear applications on special use permits, variances, and appeals of administrative decisions, changes to the county master plan, zoning districts, amendments to SCC Title 18, and all other appropriate subjects and make recommendations to the Board. After considering the planning commission's

recommendation, the Board by majority vote may approve, approve with conditions, or deny the application, or return the recommendation to the planning commission for further consideration.

XI. PROPOSED MOTIONS

This section contains 2 motions from which to choose. The motion for approval is recommended by staff and planning commission in accordance with Findings under Subsection 8.1. Those Findings should be made part of that motion. Motion 2 for denial may be made and that motion should cite one or more of the Findings shown in Subsection 8.2. Other findings of fact determined appropriate by the Board should be made part of either motion.






