13. DISCUSSION ONLY (No Action - No Public Comment): Committee/Staff Reports

Joe Curtis, Emergency Management Director:

- On October 15th, at 10:15 A.M., an earthquake preparedness exercise will be held throughout County offices as part of a State program, Great Nevada Shake-Out. Earthquake and general preparedness information will be sent to County employees on regular basis between now and October 15th.
- No definitive information has been received from the State regarding FEMA and/or SBA

as to what will be made available, if anything, to the County to assist residents affected by recent flash-flood events.

- The Nevada Seismology Lab has a series of cameras mounted at seismograph sites throughout the State. These cameras have been instrumental in spotting small wildland fires before they grow. Placement of a seismograph at TRI has been discussed which would provide a view of the area for emergency purposes. Another location would be on Ofer Peak above Virginia City. There is a seismograph located near the big flagpole at the south end of town.
- The Virginia Fault, which is significant, runs from Dayton through Virginia City. This area is riddled with faults and there is a history of three large earthquakes in the area.

Deny Dotson, Tourism Director:

- Mr. Dotson distributed up-dated maps with some of the newer attractions and new photos. An electronic version is being worked on so that it can be shared locally.
- Hot August Nights kick-off was held last weekend. The event staff and Board members
 were impressive in their handling of this event. They asked for input from many of the
 businesses. The few complaints were handled by them with a high level of professionalism.
 There were approximately 230 cars on Saturday. We hope to secure the event for next year
 and years to come.
- The Hot August Nights Poker Run will come through Virginia City on Thursday, August 6th. Parking for participants will be on the east side of C Street.
- The next event is Labor Day weekend.
- The new arena is being prepared and will be ready for the camel races. The bleachers should be completed by the end of next week. Thank you to Public Works, Comstock Mining and County Manager Pat Whitten, for assisting in the preparations of the arena.

Commissioner McGuffey complimented Mr. Dotson on the Hot August Nights event. Feedback indicates it was a tremendous success. All issues were taken care of right away.

Chair McBride received feedback from participants who thought Virginia City was more appeasing and hospitable than the Lake Tahoe location. All comments were positive.

County Manager Pat Whitten agreed that there was a high level of professionalism from Mr. Dotson and the Hot August Nights staff. The hard work is greatly appreciated.

Cherie Nevin, Community Services Director:

- The Virginia City Highlands Awareness Day was well attended. Vice Chair Gilman and Commissioner McGuffey were present. Win Buck, Virginia City Highlands resident, organized a great event.
- A Town Hall meeting will be held August 27, 6 PM to 8PM, at the Mark Twain Community Center. Dinner will be served. A question and answer period will follow. Hopefully an income survey will be available at this meeting. Residents are urged to complete this survey
- Ms. Nevin is meeting with the UNR Center for Regional Studies as they are interested in assisting the County facilitate the income survey.

• A quad-County hazmat exercise is planned for October 17th with Ardagh Company in TRI. A grant has been received to prepare this exercise. The first planning meeting has been held and the County is working with All Clear Consulting in this preparation.

Commissioner McGuffey thanked Ms. Nevin for her work on the Awareness Day event in the Highlands.

Mike Nevin, Public Works Director:

- The chip and cape seal project is underway. The cape portion will begin next week on Waltham Way in TRI, the following week the week of the 17th the Highlands, Virginia City, and after that Mark Twain Estates. Any striping or other punch list work will be completed the week of August 24.
- The Nevada Department of Transportation is doing a project on I-580 near Lakeview and Eastlake. While researching records for the new Marlette Agreement, it was discovered when the highway was built in 1963 the Department of Transportation had plans and was in contract to replace the 10 inch water line that runs under the highway the County's water line, the high-pressure part of the siphon. The replacement was never done as was verified in 2006 when there was rupture in the line. With the current NDOT project, this is the opportune time to replace the water line. The Marlette Water System has met with NDOT and NDOT has agreed to replace that water line. NDOT will bear the entire expense. Completion is anticipated by late October mid November.
- The Marlette project includes the rehabilitation of 3 additional catchments on the east side of the Sierras along with upgrades. The work will be done by Horizon Construction. It is anticipated that the Marlette System could catch an additional 325 gallons per minute with this rehabilitation.
- The swimming pool will close for the season on Sunday, August 23rd.
- The first of the new Virginia City welcome signs has been installed on the north end of town.

Austin Osborne, Senior Planner/Administrative Officer:

- Sign enforcement is being done on C Street while we are in the process of working on the Master Plan. All neon signs on the boardwalk and around town will be asked to be removed. If someone wants to have these signs, a request must be submitted for a Special Use Permit with the Planning Commission for review.
- A mobile hot-dog vendor has submitted a request for a Special Use Permit in order to operate in town. Recommendations will be submitted to the Planning Commission and then to the Board of Commissioners.
- The County has retained Nevada Association of Employers as its new unemployment administrator. The unemployment administrator manages the unemployment cases, processes all paperwork, notices and legal compliance, and verifies unemployment cases for legitimacy.
- Mr. Osborne is still working with Washington and BLM on the Lands Bill. The Carson City BLM is to be commended as they are working to get this done. A meeting is set with the BLM next week to look at all of the details.
- Next Planning Commission meeting is August 20 at the Courthouse. Items to be discussed will include the comprehensive zoning update. A Master Plan workshop will also be held.

• At the meeting in the Highlands last Saturday, many residents came forward with zoning and Master Plan questions and comments. Everything was positive with no negative comments. This was a great opportunity for people to learn what is going on across the County.

Gerald Antinoro, Sheriff:

- National Night Out will be held this evening in Virginia City at Miners Park and at Louise Peri Park in Lockwood.
- There have been a few instances of foals being roped in the Highlands. Volunteers have successfully removed the ropes from the foals. Any information regarding these incidents would be appreciated. It is a felony to steal the horses that belong to the State of Nevada. Both the Sheriff's Office and Department of Agriculture are investigating.

County Manager Pat Whitten:

- The Public Works crew was invaluable in working at the fairgrounds. Thank you to Mark Segal, a building developer at TRI, who also helped.
- More news from TRI construction is anticipated on a lead acid battery manufacturer with an announcement to come any day.
- Beginning August 10th, Station 75 in TRI will be staffed by two fire-fighter/paramedics round the clock. There may be additional funding opportunities to increase that staff from two to four.
- Work continues with retired Congressman Porter and Congressman Amodei and his staff, Stephanie Walker, on resolving the issue of needing a zip code at TRI. Work is expanding on this issue. Deputy District Attorney Loomis has brought forward the Marketplace Fairness Act.
- Regarding the flooding in Mark Twain, the County hopes to have a short-term mitigation plan available at the August 27th meeting at the Mark Twain Community Center.
 Mr. Whitten presented a short video taken by resident Rex Barker on one of the days of flooding.

Mike Nevin commented that next week the County will be working with Lyon County Public Works to clear 18 culverts along routes in the Mark Twain Estates area. Three culverts have been cleared to date. This should alleviate some of the strain and stress of the high flow. Heavy downpours can still cause damage.

14. BOARD COMMENT (No Action - No Public Comment)

Commissioner McGuffey:

- The Commissioners attended the Lockwood Earth Day, which had a very good turnout. The community garden was toured. The garden does need some attention. Vice Chair Gilman will be addressing this issue.
- At the V & T Commission meeting, sale of the Draco property was discussed and it looks like this deal will close. The V & T Railway was presented with a certificate for the "best place to take out-of-towners".
- The Desert Race from Las Vegas to Reno takes place August 15th. The race stops in Dayton and visitors come to Virginia City.

15. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Approval of resolution 15-430 authorizing a medium-term obligation installment purchase agreement in the amount of \$725,000 for a 2011 HME, Ferrara, 110' Quint Platform Ladder Fire Truck.

County Manager Whitten said this ladder truck has much higher capabilities than the existing ladder truck. The Tesla building is in excess of 70 feet high. As part of the General Services Agreement, Tesla agreed to reimburse the County for payments made through financing of this truck over 9 years. This resolution is required by the Nevada Department of Taxation even though there is a guaranteed source of repayment.

This truck is being purchased through a broker. Delivery to the County should be within 60 days.

16. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Contract with State of Nevada, Department of Health and Human Services for provision of Medicaid match services and providing terms on which Storey County will be billed by the State for its share of Medicaid expenditures.

Deputy District Attorney Keith Loomis presented this item. This is a statutorily mandated contract under which the State will provide Medicaid services, in which the Division of Welfare determines eligibility. The County's obligation is to allow those entities to provide the services and to make payments for some of the benefits provided.

Under the statute, the head of Health and Human Services makes the determination as to how much the County pays. There is a maximum cap of 8 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation. The amount the County has been paying has been less than the 1 cent per \$100, established through the Board of County Commissioners. This more than covers the obligation.

This is a renewal of a current contract.

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

- (a) The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex or national origin. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited, to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. - (e) The contractor will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, rules, regulations, and orders, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the USDA Civil Rights Office, and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- (f) In the event of the contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be cancelled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the contractor may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts or federally assisted construction contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by Law.
- (g) The contractor will include the provisions of paragraph 1 and paragraph (a) through (g) in every subcontract or purchase order, unless exempted by the rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to Section 204 of Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the USDA may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance: Provided, however, that in the event the contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the USDA, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interest of the United States.
