10. DISCUSSION ONLY (No Action - No Public Comment): Committee/Staff

Shaun Griffin, Community Chest:

- Thank you to everyone who attended the spring benefit it was a great success.
- A community reception will be held on June 23rd at 6PM to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Community Chest. The location of the reception has not yet been determined.

Ron Englebrecht, Mark Twain Community Center:

• General cleanup work is progressing well at the Community Center. New appliances have been purchased for use by the public.

- The Veteran's Memorial is being worked on concrete block has been completed. Approximately \$3-4,000 in donations of work and materials have been received.
- Beautification projects are in the works.

Public Works Director Mike Nevin:

- Within the next couple of weeks throughout Virginia City and Gold Hill, Public Works will be
 working with Broadbent & Associates doing some archaeological digging to determine what
 may exist under the ground in certain locations. This is in anticipation of the wastewater
 improvement program to start next spring. The work should be complete within two or three
 days.
- Sometime before mid-June, the striping of the TRI roads, with the exception of USA Parkway, and Six Mile Canyon will be completed. The stop signs and bars in Virginia City will be done next week.
- The swimming pool is scheduled to open on June 12th.

Community Relations Director Cherie Nevin:

- Reminder this Thursday, Friday and Saturday are residential dump days at Virginia City transfer station. Open 8AM to 4PM.
- Along with volunteer residents in Lockwood, work is being done to get the garden back up and running.

County Manager Pat Whitten:

- Thank you to staff for being brief today.
- Three special guests are here today from the high school government class Colt, Callie, and Megan. Thank you for attending.
- The agenda will need to be flexed today awaiting Congressman Amodei's arrival.

Administrative Officer/Planning Director Austin Osborne:

• The next Planning Commission workshop on the Master Plan will be held May 19th in Lockwood. The meeting may be moved from the Senior Center to the Rainbow Bend Center depending on attendance.

11. BOARD COMMENT (No Action - No Public Comment)

Commissioner McGuffey:

- Recently a meeting was held with the V&T Rail Commission, the Carson City Mayor, and Carson City Manager regarding the ¼ cent tax collected from Storey County used in the operation of the V&T. It was found not all of the funds are going where they should be. This practice has been stopped and a Memorandum of Understanding with Carson City is being rewritten so that both counties are putting in fair amounts. The funds are used toward the rebuilding of the steam trains.
- The Fraternal Order of the Eagles State Convention was held last week in Virginia City. Thank you to Storey County for assistance in making this convention a great success. Thank you also to Commissioner McBride and Congressman Amodei for being the opening and closing ceremonies guest speakers.

Chairman McBride:

- Read from a letter published in the Reno Gazette regarding Storey County being the "richest per capita county in the United States".
- Longtime resident Gene Graves recently passed away condolences to the family.

The following items taken out of order:

15. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Consider approval of Memorandum of Understanding with Nevada Department of Taxation and Nevada Tax Commission to authorize Storey County Officials to review records of Department of Taxation to determine whether there has been a proper reporting of transactions subject to sales and use taxes within Storey County.

Deputy District Attorney Keith Loomis: This item was previously approved, however the Department of Taxation expressed concerns about specific terms of the agreement. These concerns have been addressed and additional language has been included in this revised memorandum of understanding. The basic changes are that the Department of Taxation will provide the requested information within 45 days and will have more of a review authority over the request by the County to correct issues regarding zip code identification of sales and use taxes.

No public comment.

Commissioner McGuffey: Forty-five days seems excessive.

County Manager Whitten: The Department's concern is the demand on staff and they are trying to be as cooperative as they can. This is a huge leap forward as the County has not been able to audit these records in the last 15 years. It's anticipated that it will not take 45 days. The County will be pretty discriminate in what is selected for audit which will be on a spot basis.

Chairman McBride: This is monumental for the County to get to this point and should give the County peace of mind that sales and use taxes are being collected correctly.

Mr. Whitten: This is one component. Work continues through Congressman Porter's effort to fix the zip code issue.

Motion: Approve Memorandum of Understanding with Nevada Department of Taxation and Nevada Tax Commission allowing Storey County Officials to review records of Department of Taxation and authorize the Chairman to sign, **Action:** Approve, **Moved by:** Vice Chairman Gilman **Seconded by:** Commissioner McGuffey, **Vote:** Motion carried by unanimous vote, (**Summary:** Yes=3)

16. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Consideration and possible approval of site license agreement allowing Hot Spot Broadband dba SkyFiber Internet to use Storey County's water tank as a location on which to place a portion of SkyFiber's wireless internet access equipment.

Deputy District Attorney Keith Loomis: The Board previously approved a licensing agreement for High Speed Networks Moundhouse, LLC, to place equipment on the County's water tank near Public Works. High Speed Network was bought out by SkyFiber. This agreement allows the

licensing of SkyFiber to install its equipment on the same water tower for basically the same terms given to High Speed Networks.

Mr. Whitten: This installation, for those that choose, lights up Gold Hill in its positioning. Therefore, this is a critical dish installation.

No public comment.

Motion: Approve site license agreement between Storey County and SkyFiber allowing SkyFiber to place equipment on Storey County's water tank, Action: Approve, Moved by: Vice Chairman Gilman Seconded by: Commissioner McGuffey, Vote: Motion carried by unanimous vote, (Summary: Yes=3)

12. **DISCUSSION ONLY:** Honorable United States Congressman Mark Amodei discussing updates on federal matters of interest in general and specific to Storey County.

Chairman McBride introduced the Honorable United States Congressman Mark Amodei.

Congressman Amodei stated the purpose of this discussion is to update the Board and the County on items directly related to Storey County and on issues not directly related but of concern to the County.

Some issues being worked on include:

- Another Storey County Lands Bill: Congress does not act as "gatekeepers" for lands bill purposes. If a resolution comes from a County Commission stating what they want to do, then we process those. Storey County is the only county in the State where most of the land is privately owned, giving more flexibility on what the County does with its tax base.
- Zip code issue: Pitney Bowes has been requested to do zip plus 4 and send it to the State. Congressman Amodei will ask the State where they are with this. When the Commission is ready and a resolution is sent requesting assistance in obtaining a zip code, assistance will be given.
- Natural gas pipeline: We are happy to encourage any natural gas providers to come up to this area.
- Meeting with Carson City BLM District Office this month. We are looking for a full briefing on the progress of the conveyance of the items for Comstock Mining.
- Wild horses: There are issues regarding the number of horses on BLM land, including issues with managing cattle and sage hen implications. Discussions regarding wild horses will be heating up. The status quo is unacceptable it's time to look at areas where resolutions have worked.
- I-11(interstate from Phoenix to Las Vegas): NDOT has indicated a possible extension of this interstate could follow the route of Highway 95 north. The idea of I-11 was to provide a route from Mexico to Canada through the central west. Congressman Amodei discussed the possible connection of Yucca Mountain to the construction of I-11. Nobody in Nevada wants a nuclear landfill. There needs to be discussions on doing something meaningful. Research is being done regarding reclamation of nuclear waste to be utilized in other things turning into a commodity instead of waste. The title to Yucca Mountain is held by the BLM. If Yucca Mountain is re-opened, a land transfer to the Department of Energy will be required. If this

comes up, we will ask to have the right-of-way for I-11 from north of Las Vegas to the Idaho border as part of it (the land transfer). Congressman Amodei reviewed potential routes for I-11. It appears I-11 may go through Fallon. If Yucca Mountain does not re-open, the land transfer will be put on the shelf.

Public Comment:

Nicole Barde, Storey County resident: When discussions regarding wild horse issues come up again, will the wild horse advocacy groups have an opportunity to sit in or participate in some of those discussions to come up with a viable solution.?

Congressman Amodei: In Congressional District 2, while he is in office, there will be a couple of wild horse town hall meetings. Probably one east on I-80 and one in this area. The rules will be – tell us what you think, what are the ideas, what's working and what's not. Another request will be for the Resource Committee to have a field hearing in Nevada. Everything is on the table – what needs to be done to move off the status quo.

Ms. Barde: Is it all range animals, including cattle – or is it a horse issue that will be addressed? Which agency is the point agency for this conversation?

Congressman Amodei: It's probably going to be everything – anything on the range. BLM is the primary jurisdiction agency.

Mr.Whitten: Thank you to Congressman Amodei and staff for leadership and for making resources in Washington DC available to the County. More has been done during the Congressman's tenure in Washington DC than in the history of Storey County.

Commissioner McGuffey thanked Congressman Amodei for being the guest surprise speaker at the Eagles Convention and asked about the "monuments bill" signed by the President. This bill took away potential income from grazing, mining, hot springs from very poor counties. Has the Congressman been in the loop?

Congressman Amodei: The monument issue is a process issue – when there is no coordination with State or local people. In this instance it was 700,000 acres – and with all due respect to Senator Reid – he wanted to cut off access to Yucca Mountain. Whether it was politically motivated or not, there was no process. We have legislation that tries to establish a process and transparency. Congressman Amodei reviewed the resource issue and the pressure on the range – drought, wildland fire. Most likely there will be more "monuments" before the end of the year. Congressman Amodei explained how the Northern Nevada Economic Development Bill passed through Congress to the Senate and ended up in the National Defense Authorization Bill – a bill that was moving.

13. **DISCUSSION ONLY:** Storey County Federal Lobbyist and US Congressman (NV-Ret) Honorable Jon Porter providing updates on federal matters of interest in general and specific to Storey County.

Chair McBride introduced the Honorable Jon Porter who served approximately eight years in the State Senate and three terms in Congress.

Congressman Porter stated that as a member of the State Senate and the Congress he represented the entire State, as well as the rest of the country. Serving as Storey County's Federal lobbyist is an extension of his public service. Congressman Porter's goals are to help Congressman Amodei, Senators Reid and Heller - the full Nevada delegation. This is done by doing a lot of the ground work on their behalf and making sure the delegation is aware of what is going on and the issues in Storey County. This would include matters like the zip code issue.

Congressman Porter met with County department heads discussing current issues in the County. The goal on behalf of the County is to bridge local, county, state, economic development, travel, and tourism, and provide perspective and information to the Nevada delegation.

Congressman Porter also works with Senator Amodei's Chairman, the Chairman's staff, and other members of Congress around the region to make sure things are accomplished. This is a unique approach – most lobbyists work only with their State delegation.

Some of the political issues of today are:

- The Presidential race is a wake-up call to Washington that people are unhappy and want transparency. Campaigning is better than 200 years ago;
- The Senate race in Nevada is critical to the country;
- The congressional race in southern Nevada is also critical;
- These races are important because who's elected in the Nevada delegation is important to Storey County. Congressman Porter interacts with candidates on both sides of the aisle.

Congressman Porter discussed the following issues directly related to Storey County:

- Possibly to help with the cable situation and provide options;
- Public lands issue working closely with the regional areas;
- Regional issues have been presented to Congress and will be done again;
- Zip Code looking at options and trying to find a solution;
 - 1. New zip code areas have been created around the country and in the State;
 - 2. If a move is made to create a new zip code and it is not successful, there is a 10 year period in which it cannot be requested again. Every step is being made to make sure everything is lined up so the request does not fail;
 - 3. Working with former Nevada Congressman Jim Bilbrae who sits on the U.S. Post Office Board the only member on the Board;
 - 4. The Governor's office is willing to assist in any way possible;
 - 5. Pitney Bowes is involved;
 - 6. Another approach is to possibly expand the zip code boundaries;
- (Interstate) I-11 is very important as explained by Congressman Amodei. I-11 expanding to northwestern Nevada is a win, wherever it goes. There will be many meetings to discuss the route. It is imperative that Storey County continue to be part of the conversation.
- Yucca Mountain Congressman Porter feels this is going to happen. Senator Reid has been successful, working with the White House, to prevent this from happening. There will a lot of activity when Senator Reid retires and there is a new President. Storey County needs to be at the table and part of the conversation when it starts again. This will be a high priority for Nevada.

Public Comment: None.

Commissioner McGuffey: Yucca Mountain is in which county - Nye? If Yucca Mountain was to go through, would Nye County be the beneficiary of taxes or income generated?

Congressman Porter: It is in Nye. As far as taxes or income, most likely it will be only what the State wants to have happen. A lot of officials do not want to talk about, but debate is encouraged. Who owns the land? Who owns the right-of-way to I-11? If there are ways the Federal government helps Nevada because of Yucca Mountain – it could be for universities, hospitals, veterans, or whatever the State would choose.

Commissioner McGuffey: Regarding the zip code issue when talking about expanding the coverage, would that be the 89440 zip code to make it County-wide?

Congressman Porter: Yes. It's very controversial to create a new zip code. The postal system has serious problems. There are parameters that have to be followed – if it is messed up, it will be 10 years before it can be done again.

Chair McBride called for recess at 11:45 AM

Meeting reconvened at 12:00 PM

14. **DISCUSSION ONLY:** Lindsay Chichester, Extension Educator from University of Nevada Cooperative Extension, introduction and program updates.

Lindsay Chichester with University of Nevada Cooperative Extension introduced herself and discussed her background. Upcoming Cooperative Extension events include the Nevada Junior Livestock show in Reno next week. This is Wildfire Awareness month and Cooperative Extension has a living with fire program. The 4-H Camp materials have just been released – Cooperative Extension has a long-standing tradition of sending 4-H members to camp at Lake Tahoe.

17. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Approval of check 85107 to the Bucket of Blood Saloon in the amount of \$4,500.00 for parking lot lease.

Chair McBride, having a pecuniary interest in this item, recused himself and abstained from discussion and vote.

Vice Chair Gilman presented this item.

County Manager Whitten: This is routine regarding the existing lease and is for the regular quarterly payment to the Bucket of Blood Saloon.

Public comment:

None

Motion: Approve check 85107 to the Bucket of Blood Saloon in the amount of \$4,500.00 for parking lot lease, **Action:** Approve, **Moved by:** Commissioner McGuffey **Seconded by:** Vice Chairman Gilman, **Vote:** Motion carried by unanimous vote, (**Summary:** Yes=2)

Chairman McBride asked if there were any other changes to the agenda.

County Manager Whitten noted that on item 8 of the Consent Agenda, the District Attorney has asked that it be noted the date of cancellation of the June 3rd Board meeting should actually state June 7th. The June 3rd date was a typographical error.

18. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION**: Approval of Resolution #16-437 declaring May 2016 as Wildfire Awareness Month in Storey County.

Fritz Klingler, Storey County Fire Marshal, said this is the time of year where the Board is requested to approve a Resolution declaring one month of the year to be Wildfire Awareness Month. Thank you to Cherie Nevin, the Nevada Cooperative Extension Group, and Living with Fire for help in getting the information to the public. Public safety and community organizations get together and celebrate the month of May as Wildfire Awareness Month.

Fire Department personnel will be knocking on doors and doing 30' assessments. Advance preparation in homes is always stressed.

Fire Marshal Klingler read the Resolution:

Whereas, wildfire significantly impacts Nevada's environmental, economic and social well-being; and

Whereas, residents of Nevada's fire-prone communities need to accept responsibility for living in high fire-hazard areas; and

Whereas, residents need to work together to prepare their homes and community to survive wildfire and commit to becoming a Fire Adapted Community; and Whereas, when whole communities implement appropriate pre-fire activities they improve the survivability of their individual homes and community during wildfire:

Therefore be it proclaimed, that the Storey County Board of County Commissioners supports the month of May 2016 as Nevada Wildfire Awareness Month and this year's theme: Create Unity – Fire Adapt Your Community! as a means for education and a call for residents of Storey County to take action to reduce the wildfire threat to their homes and help their community move toward becoming a Fire Adapted Community.

11. DISCUSSION ONLY (No Action - No Public Comment): Committee/Staff

Planning Director Austin Osborne:

- The tentative time line for completion of the Master Plan is:
 - 1. May 19th Planning Commission Workshop in Lockwood
 - 2. June 2nd Planning Commission approval
 - 3. July 19th County Commission, 1st reading
 - 4. August 2nd County Commission adoption. If approved, the housing moratorium will become null.
- The Master Plan is being reviewed and proof read.
- Notices going out today regarding weed abatement of noxious weeds in Six and Seven Mile Canyons, Gold Creek, Gold Canyon, and American Flat.
- After the third year of spraying, spot spraying is all that is necessary. The native grasses and sagebrush are coming back.

Commissioner McGuffey: Is there anyone waiting for the moratorium to end?

Mr. Osborne: There is no confirmation of that. However there are indications that there is some in interest the moratorium coming to a close.

Tourism Director Deny Dotson:

- Early results on ticket sales indicate that the Chili on the Comstock event was double over the last few years. The event did very well.
- The Memorial Day Parade will be held on Saturday, May 28th. The steam train kicks off the same day the long and short lines will be running.
- June 4th the Reno Tahoe Odyssey will take place with 3,500 runners. A portion of C Street will be closed between Taylor and Union Streets just for the morning hours.
- Later in the day on June 4th, Street Vibrations-Spring Rally will come through and there will be "bike only" parking on C Street on that same day.
- Taste of the Comstock will be held on June 11 and will be combined with mining, single jack competition. Interpretive signs will be placed on mining equipment throughout town.

Communications Director Dave Ballard:

• Last month some offices were cut-over to a voice over IP (phone) system. This includes the Sheriff, District Attorney, and the jail. Any issues have been fixed and the system is

successful so far. The biggest thing with this equipment is - after purchase the monthly service is a substantial reduced cost over AT&T.

- Team Mobile is providing the next generation wireless 911 equipment. Basically, if 911 is called from a Team Mobile phone –the same information will be given to 911 as AT&T, Verizon and Sprint.
- There was a significant internet failure yesterday in dispatch, the courthouse, and a few other
 areas. This was brought on by AT&T as part of their plans to phase out copper wire. Some
 DSL services were discontinued. Service in the courthouse was re-connected by evening.
 People who have DSL will most likely have to move it to U-Verse before it (DSL) is cut out
 completely.

County Manager Whitten: Thank you and compliments to Dave Ballard and James Deane for a great job in handling the issues with the internet failure.

Community Development Director Dean Haymore:

- The Gold Hill Depot project should be complete by Memorial Day.
- The final (USA Parkway) groundbreaking meeting was held with NDOT and Ames Construction. The County will provide a couple of vans for transportation to the groundbreaking site.
- All business license renewals approximately 1,200 have been sent out. There are approximately 400 new licenses just this year.
- Interviews will be held tomorrow for a new inspector.

Mr. Whitten: Very proud of the work being done at the Gold Hill Depot with Mr. Haymore's involvement. This will be an exciting venue with a lot of possibilities for use as a wedding location and other events.

Comptroller Hugh Gallagher:

• The final budget review will be held at a Special Commission Meeting on Tuesday, May 24th.

Fire Chief Gary Hames:

- Due to software issues, the monthly report just came out. Hopefully, this report is beneficial to everyone.
- Fuel reduction burning continues this morning in Six Mile Canyon. Some piles on the north side will be left until fall as it is not burning clean enough.
- The next area for fuel reduction will be along Geiger Grade and out into Bailey Canyon.
- Spring weeds are out of control. Residents are reminded of the "You Call-We Haul" program. Trailers are booked out for several weeks in advance, but are still available. This program is working very well.
- Volunteer Recruitment press releases and notices are out.
- The first Junior Firefighter Olympics is being planned and will be held all day June 2nd at the Miners Park baseball field. This year will be for middle school level kids, next year the high school and elementary school will be included.

County Manager Pat Whitten:

Mr. Whitten reviewed information from an important meeting with USA Parkway stakeholders:

- Everyone is invited to attend the groundbreaking of USA Parkway, June 7th at 3PM. Drive out to the pavement end and instructions will be given on how to proceed.
- Information has been given out regarding the groundbreaking to various groups and media.
- USA Parkway is being structured as a design/build not wasting time to build waiting for design of certain phases very important in the process.
- Mr. Whitten is very confident that Ames Construction is the right company for this job and are very easy to work with. Ames has indicated they are on time for a late summer 2017 opening.
- Designs are in preliminary phase work in process.
- NDOT was exceptionally complimentary of Ames Construction.
- Expect a high-speed roundabout where USA Parkway comes out on Highway 50 near the northwest corner of the airport fence.
- Work is broken down into three phases. Phase one is six miles total which will begin
 immediately after groundbreaking, if not before. Safety improvements will be made to some
 portions of Storey County road. The second phase will be about eight miles. The last phase
 to occur spring 2017 will be the roundabout at Highway 50. Wildlife crossing and migration
 patterns will be addressed.
- This was a \$76 million dollar bid all State funded. If Federal funding was included, the permitting process would be more intensive.
- It is the impression that existing speed limits will be adhered to.
- Aesthetic landscaping will be included.

Mr. Whitten continued:

- The Nevada Tax Commission approved the Memorandum of Understanding that will allow County representatives to review sales and use tax returns for accuracy. This is a 2-year agreement.
- Internal policies for reviews are being developed.
- During review, we will be very attentive to the amount of purchase and who should be reporting sales tax.
- This is a milestone a project that has been worked on for almost 15 years.

12. **DISCUSSION ONLY (No Action - No Public Comment):** Review of the 3rd Quarter 2016 Unaudited Budget to Actual Review.

Comptroller Hugh Gallagher reviewed the 2016 3rd quarter budget. Overall, the third quarter is consistent with where it ought to be. Revenues have increased since 2014 and are tracking at 94%. Third quarter expenses are less than last year and are all well within range. All department heads have done a great job. There were no significant deviations from the budget that cannot be explained.

Emergency Management is the only overage in expense and was the result of an emergency situation relative to firefighter crew in July 2015. Contingency funds have not been accessed but will be looked at and may be utilized to prepare for some emergencies such as the Emergency Management situation.

Chairman McBride noted that department heads and elected officials have done a great job keeping budgets in balance and managing funds.

13. BOARD COMMENT (No Action - No Public Comment)

Commissioner McGuffey:

Nevada State Eagles Convention presented Virginia City with a certificate from the State
Aeries. Commissioner McGuffey read the certificate thanking the Virginia City Aerie for
hosting the convention. Attendees at the convention had a great time and complimented the
town, restaurants, railroad, and shops.

Chairman McBride:

- Longtime resident Carl Small passed away and will be missed by his friends and neighbors.
- 14. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Consideration of and possible action to approve the transfer of the County's allocation of authority to issue private activity bonds to the Nevada Rural Housing Authority in the amount of \$208,217.19.

Deputy District Attorney Keith Loomis introduced Bill Brewer, Deputy Director of Nevada Rural Housing Authority (NRHA).

Mr. Loomis:

- Each year the Federal government gives States a certain amount of authority to issue private activity bonds. Nevada received approximately \$300 million.
- The State allocates 50% of this amount to local governments and is distributed on the basis of population.
- Storey County's allocation is approximately \$208,000. Interest on these bonds is tax exempt.
- A qualifying project can be asked for under this program. Nevada Rural Housing Authority comes to the counties and government entities with smaller amounts and requests transfer of the allocation.
- In this case, the funds will be used for mortgage credit certificates to allow low-income, first-time homebuyers to qualify for loans.

Bill Brewer:

- This partnership started in 2006 to bring homeownership to rural Nevada. Cities and counties were asked to transfer their portion of the bond to NRHA which were pooled. Mortgage products are issued to help families get into housing.
- 4,500 families have been served over the last several years.
- In 2015, a taxable program was implemented for NRHA loans that can be coupled with mortgage credit certificates – a tax credit to the homebuyer on income taxes.
- NRHA appreciates the County's consideration of this request.

Chairman McBride: Has NRHA asked Storey County to transfer this allocation in the past?

Mr. Brewer: Storey County has been approached several times since 2006, but has not been for several years because there was enough State bond cap to fund programs for some time. This year local communities are being requested to transfer if they can.

Mr. Whitten: Historically, Storey County has responded to this request when asked. The funds always go to good projects across the State.

Chairman McBride: If the County does this transfer, there is no utilization for the funds on County level?

Mr. Whitten: Right - this is the understanding. Staff recommends approval.

15. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Approval and acceptance of a National Park Service Historic Preservation Grant award in the amount of \$25,088.00 for Training at the 2016 Historic Preservation Forum and Storey County Courthouse Building Safety improvements and authorization for Cherie Nevin to sign all associated grant documentation.

Community Services Director Cherie Nevin stated that a National Park Service Historic Preservation Grant administered by the State Historic Preservation Office was recently applied for. This grant will enable the County to attend the 2016 Historic Preservation Forum in Alabama – a conference held every other year. The County has never attended this forum. The State said this would be a great opportunity for County personnel and members of the Comstock Historic Commission.

The second part of the grant is specifically for seismic retrofitting of the County Courthouse building. A cost estimator will be retained to give a cost of the retrofit.

The grant is for approximately 50% of what was requested and comes with a match. The match is only on the Courthouse work not the travel.

Commissioner McGuffey: The match is approximately \$6,700?

Ms. Nevin: Yes, it may be a little more. There may be some cost savings on the travel budget.

Chair McBride: There are a couple of individuals on the Comstock Historic Commission Board who are planning to attend.

16. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Amend the Cooperative Agreement for the Creation of Nevadaworks by and among 13 counties of the State of Nevada and the Nevadaworks in order for the agreement to conform to the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014.

Administrative Officer Austin Osborne said there was a presentation on this item a few months ago. At that time, the Commission requested Nevadaworks go to the other counties and see how those counties felt and then obtain signatures before Storey County took action. All of the other 13 counties in Nevadaworks jurisdiction have signed the Memorandum of Understanding.

A brief background on what Nevadaworks is:

- The U.S. Department of Labor and the Department of Education have monies available to go the States.
- This money can be used to help people find work. The target group are persons who are at risk and who have barrier to employment youth that are very young for employment to senior citizens and disabled persons.
- The funds go to the State and the State sends the monies on to Nevadaworks for the
 northern counties for determination on where the funds should go such as local
 organizations that are both public and private non-profit that provide education, training,
 employment services, rehabilitation, and other different groups.
- Mr. Osborne sits on the Nevadaworks Board and serves on the sub-committee that sorts through the applications.
- Nevadaworks is now working under the Workplace Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014.
- This Memorandum changes language to comply with the new law under the new title.

Chair McBride: How much does this cost Storey County?

Mr. Osborne: This is not Storey County's money. The Memorandum of Understanding is simply for Nevadaworks to take money from the Federal government, from the State and use that money so it's not an obligation from Storey County to provide to Nevadaworks. Nevadaworks works hard with organizations to provide employment of people in Virginia City, TRI, and elsewhere in the State.

Mr. Whitten: Just yesterday, along with Vice Chairman Gilman, Mr. Whitten was asked about workforce availability. When thinking about Nevadaworks, along with other organizations, this is a collaborative network.

Two second readings may be recommended on this ordinance due to the number of changes and to insure all issues are discussed and decided appropriately.

Mr. Morris read the Ordinance:

This is an Ordinance amending Storey County Code 5.12 Sale of Alcoholic Beverages and Section 8.28.025 Alcoholic Beverages, to revise the procedure for issuing and revoking liquor licenses and providing for other properly related matters.

Mr. Morris asked if there were any questions. If not, approval of this first reading of the ordinance is recommended.

Chairman McBride: Has read the ordinance and will read it several more times to insure understanding of the entire ordinance. This is a good start.

Mr. Morris: There was a workshop in November, which was a good start with a lot of interest in issues presented. More information will be added prior to the public hearing.

Sheriff Antinoro: There are some issues on the re-write regarding fingerprinting and background of civil applicants that have come up as far as all civil processes. Should this be discussed here or before the next meeting? A couple of different alternatives are posed on how to conduct that.

Mr. Morris: This is one of the issues that needs additional information to be added so that people understand it. Discussion should be at the next meeting – June 21st.

Some of the language changes are to ensure that requirements of statutes are being followed. Mr. Morris encourages people to read this ordinance and if there are any questions, advise Mr. Morris prior to the next hearing so the appropriate information can be brought forward.

Mr. Whitten: The suggestion this was an antiquated ordinance is an understatement. Mr. Morris has found certain items that no other jurisdiction in the State is complying with – but Storey County will be. Thank you Mr. Morris.

Planning Director Austin Osborne said the title indicates this is an ordinance to put a hold on any large-planned unit developments, subdivisions exceeding four parcels, and other large developments until the Master Plan is done. The Master Plan is nearly complete – in the proof reading stages, appendixes and supporting attachments are being put in. One more workshop is scheduled in Lockwood. Planning Commission approval will be requested before submission to this Board. This item is for the moratorium to be extended for only 90 days. If the Master Plan is approved early, the moratorium expires at that time. This (moratorium) does not apply to parcel maps dividing parcels of four or less, building permits, special uses, variances, and other planning applications.

21. PUBLIC COMMENT (No Action)

John Warner, an Honorable Veteran of the U. S. Navy: Appears today regarding obtaining a Sheriff's card for employment. Some of the Storey County policies has made it troublesome for an employee to obtain work. The lack of communication between parties has cost Mr. Warner a job. Elected officials are here to serve the people and, in this case, protect and serve. Mr. Warner feels he is being bullied and manipulated by someone in a power position. Mr. Warner questions why a Sheriff's card is being pulled from him for lack of meaningless information previously obtained by the (Sheriff's) department. The fact he was involved in another person's accident that put him in the wrong place at the wrong time, never charged with any crime related to this person or their

accident, nor did anything wrong. In all the years, he worked in Washoe County with work permits, this has never come up or been an issue. In Storey County to resubmit an application and pay an additional \$63 fee, is disturbing to an individual that's gone through tough hardships. Why another fee for information the Department already has. This is gouging of a client and complete waste of time. Why isn't this process more simplified so honorable vets or any other good standing citizens can achieve a Sheriff's card and employment desired. Mr. Warner feels he has to jump through hoops to accomplish a simple task. Not everyone has the means to pay double fees or drive all over the county because the Sheriff feels he is much greater than other individuals. He couldn't return a phone call to an honorable veteran putting him to work. The job has been lost resembling a good chunk of change. What if someone took your job away and you had no idea when you might start up again? This being said, Mr. Warner hopes we can learn to work together more efficiently and positively to achieve our goals in the future.

Equality and fairness should be the forefront of American standards, honor and integrity should be commonplace in our society and conducted in everyday life. Sadly many individuals finding themselves elected in positions of power, somehow lose focus on the real tasks at hand. Mr. Warner believes he has found himself in this situation and ask if we can change the ways in judging people for mistakes, instead praising them for accomplishments. He feels demonized instead of glorified. This is sad. To think if the Commandant of the Marine Corps, the highest ranking Marine Corps official could take a moment out to acknowledge me, you'd think a lowly Sheriff in Storey County could return a phone call. It is disturbing how difficult this has to be. It has cost a lot of money and hardship.

Kris Thompson, Project Manager at TRI: Here as fellow veteran of Mr. Warner and talked to him briefly before the meeting. Mr. Warner brought a scrapbook of his days as a Navy sailor - one Mr. Warner did not mention that is interesting - is he was serving on the USS Blueridge, the command vessel for the Commander of the 7th U.S. fleet, a 3-star command position. Those fellows command over 100,000 troops. Mr. Warner was found competent enough and quality-entrusted enough to go on that command ship. For veterans to have to chase down the Sheriff in Storey County, to try and get him on the phone, to have to go to the office to find out why the work card was pulled, and then basically being told you can't find out why because of confidentiality rules - Mr. Thompson would suggest that something needs to change soon with the management of work cards in Storey County. If you're looking at the motivation behind why the employees at a certain business in this county keep getting stiff-armed by the Sheriff's Department, this is a good example. This is a stipulation entered into between the Ethics Commission and Lance Gilman dated April 20th. The Sheriff in Storey County had made four charges in an ethics complaint 18 months against Lance Gilman arising out of an incident arising in a meeting here. Those charges were investigated. The Ethics Commission, seeing charges coming from the senior law enforcement officer of the county, gave it great weight and credibility. There was a lengthy interview between of Mr. Gilman, a lengthy investigation between the Ethics Commission and Mr. Gilman, and this stipulation was the Ethics Commission finding no violations in anything Lance Gilman did or said. Not one of the charges made by Sheriff Antinoro were sustained. To get the Ethics Commission after 18 months of investigation to fully dismiss four charged that were brought is almost unheard of. It shows how baseless the charges are. Mr. Thompson submits that the stream of folks coming in simply to get a work card in Storey County and things like this, the charges made against Mr. Gilman - using a badge as a political weapon - are ample evidence that something else is driving these actions of the Sheriff's Department. Mr. Thompson asks the Chairman, the Commission, the County administration, the District Attorney's Office, respectfully put their minds to this issue and figure out if there isn't a better way to do the work card administration in this county so that continued collateral damage like John don't continue to occur – who is simply trying to get a job.

The meeting was called to order by the Chair at 10:00am.

6. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION:** Consideration and possible approval of appointment of Anne Delahay as the appraiser to appraise the value of the parcels of real property associated with and on which is located the V and T Freight Depot in Virginia City.

Deputy District Attorney Keith Loomis presented this item. The County is moving ahead with possible purchase of the V and T Freight Depot. Two appraisals of the property were done in 2010. A requirement for making an offer to purchase property on behalf of the County is that an appraiser be appointed by the Board to appraise the property. Appraiser Ann Delahay is familiar Virginia City and has done recent appraisals in the area. Ms. Delahay recently presented her background information to the Board when re-appointed to appraise the courthouse parking lot.

Mr. Loomis continued that sometime in the future efforts need to be made to clear the title to the property.

Chair McBride: Ms. Delahay is becoming somewhat of an expert on properties on the Comstock.

- There are very few changes from the tentative budget. There is a decrease in Ad Valorem because of the 10-year rule being imposed.
- Revenue from charges for services increased significantly due to \$846,000 from negotiations with Tesla and additional income from a BIA contract.

• Changes from the tentative budget have been made to Buildings and Grounds, Pools and Parks, and Roads.

Mr. Gallagher reviewed the 474 Fire District Fund. Expenses were increased to cover the anticipated cost of property and casualty insurance. No change in the Fire Emergency and Mutual Aid Funds.

13. DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION: Final Budget Hearings for FY 2016/17

Mr. Gallagher proceeded with the next General Fund Departments beginning with Equipment Acquistion Fund. All departments remained the same with the exception of:

- Equipment Acquistion: Increase in expenditures over the tentative budget as a result of transferring vehicles from the Community Development and Sheriff Departments;
- Administrative: Appropriations decreased as a result of transferring the cost property casualty insurance to Sheriff, Roads, and 474 Fire District.
- There is a reduction of \$38,841 in the Contingency Account.

Chairman McBride: The reduction in the Administrative budget is a bookkeeping clarification in moving the insurance into the departments where it is actually used.

Mr. Gallagher: This is the first step when looking at cost allocations where those expenses in the General Fund are applicable to the special revenue funds which may be adjusted from time to time. This is done by many governments.

The final budget has a deficit of \$889,000, down from a deficit of approximately \$1.7 million. The reasons:

- Capital Outlay has increased with the majority being BIA (Bureau of Indian Affairs) expenses attributed to the BIA contract. The County does receive funds;
- Services and Supplies increased and includes a historical grant in Building & Grounds;
- Community Development increased for personnel services for building maintenance;
- District Attorney increased for professional services;
- TRI Payback increased in anticipation of payment of the public/private partner.
- Contingency is at \$371,000.

The County has been in the negative before. Funds will only be expended on items that are needed. Every department head understands this is the process. Expenses need to be anticipated, but based on the past quarterly actual to budget meetings, the County has been very frugal on expenses.

Mr. Gallagher continued that this budget is as good as it can get at this time and does not anticipate this will be the bottom line on June 30, 2017. The budget should be in a positive unless there is some sort of catastrophe.

Austin Osborne clarified: Under purchasing and equipment acquisitions as told to Mr. Osborne, two of the vehicles under equipment acquisitions for the Sheriff's Office are true 4-wheel drive vehicles to be capable for patrolling in the Highlands and such places. The vehicles are Ford Intercepters. Follow up questions indicated these vehicles were true 4-wheel drive – not 2-wheel or all-wheel drive. Mr. Osborne spoke with a local Ford dealer who indicated that these models are all-wheel

drive with the Highway Patrol version. The standard Ford equivalent vehicle is all-wheel drive with selective type breaking. It is not 4-wheel drive and is not meant for off-road.

Mr. Osborne is providing this information so that the Board in clear on which vehicles are being purchased.

Sheriff Antinoro: In checking out the State website, what the bids are and alternative availability, it said that a 4-wheel drive unit is available as an option. Another Ford dealer assured the Sheriff that it was a 4-wheel drive vehicle – that's what he went by.

County Manager Whitten: Through Mr. Osborne's assessment, the vehicles are more than likely 4-wheel drive.

Public Comment:

Nicole Barde, Storey County Resident: The (budget) process improves every year – this was very smooth and the materials are excellent. What percent of the 13% increase in expenses is due to Tesla support or TRI impact to the County?

Chair McBride: Looking at the amount from the General Services Agreement (GSA)?

Ms. Barde: Total.

Mr. Whitten: A fair question would be – what are the revenues from Tesla versus the expenses on Tesla through the GSA and ordinance partially abating building plan review and permit fees. Working with Community Development and Chief Hames, it is indicated that even though occasionally we hit the upper edges of revenue meeting the cost, overall it is neutral. You can look at the Government Services Agreement plus the amounts of revenue projected under those partial abatements of review and permit fees, and those should be the County's costs – at most.

Ms. Barde: Is the money received from Tesla under the Agreement on par with the expenses? Potentially, the expenses may exceed what the agreement with Tesla is. This would be detrimental as there is no way to recoup that. If Ad Valorem is going to stay flat, that will hit the County sooner than later. Have revenue and expense cost projections been done for the next three or four years? It does not look like expenses will go down.

Chair McBride: On what are you basing the assumption that the County's expenses due to Tesla will go up?

Ms. Barde: They (Tesla) will continue to "eat, and eat, and eat". So much has been given to them, they are getting used to the County responding in 30 seconds or less. Can the County continue to respond in that fashion? The County has been very good in supporting TRI and Tesla. That level of service has set an expectation that the County continues to perform at that level. Does the County have the revenues to do that – if not, there's a need to start "throttleing" back.

Mr. Whitten: Based on what we know today adjusted for the next three to nine years, the answer is "yes". There are inflationary clauses in the GSA for items such as the Sheriff's deputies, both of who are now fully funded under the Tesla agreement, and staffing of the two-person, paramedic-fire crew

at Station 75. Should the pace and volume pick up, there are provisions in the GSA and possibly in the ordinance, that would allow the County to re-negotiate with Tesla. The County has just so much staff time for Tesla, if that increases the agreement can be re-opened or the County can put on the brake. Certain items were not abated that could have been. On the average every two weeks there are about 10 to 15 Tesla-related (business) licenses. These are annual licenses that are not abated at all. The County is two years in to the major abatement cycle which are real and personal property taxes. This is an investment that will ultimately reap great rewards in 2024.

Ms. Barde: Between now and then there will be rocky roads, the County needs to at least have an eye on when that may happen and how to react. If the revenue is not coming in or the services exceed the agreement, the County needs to know so the agreement can be re-negotiated.

Mr. Whitten: All of these points are agreed to. This is not just for Tesla but to all projects going on at TRI, with emphasis on the bigger projects. The County's economic development team meets every week to discuss project management at the Park.

Ms. Barde: Mr. Gallagher mentioned that there have been overages in prior years for investment purposes, however there is an expense trend line going up and a revenue trend line that is flat.

Mr. Whitten: The County has the best budget team ever. The philosophy is to be ultra-conservative in the projections of revenues. It may seem flat-lined, but there is reason to believe there will be increases which are discussed every week. The team tries to be all-inclusive, all-seeing on the expense side. Just because it's in the budget does not mean a department will get it. Larger expenditures require a two-step approval from the County Manager and the Comptroller after assurance there are the revenues to match that the expense.

Chairman McBride called for recess at 10:50 AM

Meeting reconvened at 11:00 AM

Vice Chairman Gilman stated in the interest of caution and at the recommendation of the District Attorney, having a pecuniary interest in the Tahoe Reno Industrial Center, and a personal lawsuit against Sheriff Antinoro, for those reasons recuses from vote and discussion on the budget, and asks the District Attorney to review this decision with Ethics and give a turn-around shortly as to what his decision is or should not be in regards to the budget.

District Attorney Langer: The District Attorney's Office will request an opinion from Ethics on this issue.

Motion: Approve the Storey County FYE 2016/17 Final Budget less the Water and Sewer System Budget, and the 474 Fire Protection District budgets, **Action:** Approve, **Moved by:** Commissioner McGuffey, **Seconded by:** Chairman McBride, **Vote:** Motion carried by unanimous vote, **(Summary:** Yes=2)

5. BOARD COMMENT (No Action - No Public Comment)

Commissioner McGuffey:

- St. Mary's Art Center approved its 2016-17 budget.
- St. Mary's has started a mattress drive to replace the old mattresses at the art center. Contact the director, Arika.
- Fourth Ward School is preparing to open for the season on June 10th.
- The V & T Commission met and approved the 2016-17 budget. \$500,000 was removed \$300,000 for the repair of an engine; \$100,000 from Storey County; and, \$100,000 from Carson City. It was agreed this amount would be matched on an annual basis. This was brought about by the V & T relying heavily on the Storey County ¼ cent tax to keep operations going. Nothing was being spent in Storey County as intended. A new agreement is being developed. The train is starting to run on "its own feet". However, the V & T still relies on some money to fix the old trains.
- A NACO meeting was held last week. The Board was asked if NACO was going to back the ballot question regarding proposed fuel tax. There was no response. NACO has asked the counties to submit pros and cons of putting this issue on the ballot.
- Another issue discussed at the NACO meeting was Planning 2.0 where counties and voters would determine what BLM does with County land. BLM currently has total control of the land. Counties have been asked to submit proposals regarding this issue to BLM.

Chairman McBride:

• The next regular Commission meeting on June 7th has been cancelled due to the groundbreaking of USA Parkway being held that day. Governor Sandoval and the Director of NDOT will be in attendance. This is the first highway being built in Storey County for many years.

7. DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION: Worked card appeal/revocation hearing for Cheryl Ray

Commissioner McGuffey indicated this matter should be heard as the Brothel Board.

Donnie Gilman, representative of the Mustang Ranch, presented this item. This is an appeal of the denial of Ms. Cheryl Ray's work card. Mr. Gilman discussed Ms.Ray's work card application and length of employment.

District Attorney Langer: For the record, this is an appeal of a work card, it is heard by the Commission, not the Brothel Board.

Chairman McBride asked Sheriff Antinoro the reason for revocation of the work card.

Sheriff Antinoro: Reviewed the ordinance on work cards and explained the grounds for revocation. In this instance, there were items that were not disclosed on the application.

Chairman McBride asked the applicant for an explanation of the non-disclosure of the issues.

Vice Chairman Gilman, having a pecuniary interest in the workplace indicated, recuses himself from voting and discussion on this item.

Public Comment:

Motion: To reinstate the work card for Cheryl Ray, **Action:** Approve, **Moved by:** Commissioner McGuffey, **Seconded by:** Chairman McBride, **Vote:** Motion carried by unanimous vote, **(Summary:** Yes=2)

Chairman McBride: For the record, the Motion that was made, seconded, and approved by the Board for the reinstatement of the work card for Cheryl Ray was done by the Storey County Commissioners not the Brothel Board.

Fire Chief Gary Hames presented this item which is essentially an extension of BLM agreement to encompass the U.S. Forest Service as well. This has been worked on for several years. This will be a State-wide agreement and is no different than the current BLM agreement. This agreement expedites the billing process.

14. PUBLIC COMMENT (No Action)

Nicole Barde, Storey County Resident: Asked Chairman McBride if he attended the Supreme Court appeal for Vincent Malfitano.

Chair McBride: It was not an appeal. It was a settlement meeting set by the Court, not the parties. There was no agreement reached at this meeting. The understanding is, at some point, the Court will schedule a hearing.

District Attorney Langer: When a matter is at the Supreme Court either side can request a settlement conference, which the Supreme Court prefers. With no settlement, there will be briefings, potential oral arguments, and the interim Court and then the Supreme Court will make a decision. It's always good if the parties can settle at this type of conference. Deputy District Attorney Loomis will continue to work on and go forward with this case.

Teresa Charlton, Storey County resident: Expressed concern regarding preservation of the historical aspects of Storey County. There are tables, chairs, advertising flags and other items on the

boardwalk. Have the ordinances been changed? Non-historical items can be seen from the balcony at the Tahoe House Hotel. Questions have been raised about how some businesses are allowed to have items put out obstructing passage on the boardwalk – and others are not.

Senior Planner, Austin Osborne: With all that's going on across the County, the hardest problem to deal with is the signs and other items on C Street. Mr. Osborne has made numerous trips to this area and found what is being described by Ms. Charlton – flags, banners, easels blocking pedestrians, items being sold on the boardwalk. On occasion Mr. Osborne has asked that areas be cleaned up and for items to be removed. Most of the time, the request is complied with - however sometime later it starts creeping back. Mr. Osborne agrees with Ms. Charlton. The Planning Department is updating the sign ordinance which includes doing business on the boardwalk and these sort of activities. When the ordinance is completed, along with the new nuisance ordinances, the process for addressing these signs and illegal items will be enforced stringently. Completion of the Master Plan by the August deadline has delayed the ordinance update. Once done, the sign ordinance situation will be first on the agenda along with some other items. The C Street occupants will be involved when addressing the issues – from neon to numbers of signs, to businesses that have entrances on B and D Street, and other such items.

Community Development Department has agreed to assign the new building inspector to deal with nuisances, signs, and the boardwalk, to at least keep issues at bay until the ordinance can be updated.

Ms. Charlton: Another other issue to note is flooding causing an erosion problem on G Street.

Mr. Osborne: This issue has been looked at for some time. Public Works is aware of the problem and some work has been done to dam the (train) parking lot which works until it starts to erode. Mr. Osborne will discuss this with the team to see if something more can be done. With the up-coming sewer project a lot of streets will be dug up – there is a plan to separate storm sewer from municipal sewer. Maybe this area can be tied in to the storm drain in the long-term plans.

Ms. Charlton: Trees may be lost with the next flood. It's a problem that needs to be solved eventually.

Dear Commissioners/Board Members,

I wanted to express my great disappointment in the actions of the Storey County Sheriff. As someone who has invested major time, effort, and money into Storey County and who believes wholeheartedly in the leaders, the residents, and the future of this County, I have deep concerns about his serial harassment and abusive treatment of people who must contend with him in order to live in peace or even to work in our County.

By now it should be obvious to all that if you are a target or a political opponent of his whether a member of the public or an employee working for him, he will use his office and badge to punish or harass you. You have seen workers having a very tough time just getting a work permit from him. You've seen the Sheriff revoke work cards without notice or a hearing forcing the business to send the workers off premises – sometimes leaving the worker without a paycheck for weeks at a time, all because they made a meaningless mistake on his application form. You've seen case after case where the Sheriff did not even bother to call the applicant to inquire as to the circumstances of their mistake. In the case before you today, the worker tried to call the Sheriff numerous times, but the Sheriff's retaliation at TRI when we reported protesters who were trespassing on private land. He gave us the "run around" and actually helped the perpetrators, as documented in numerous emails and photographs.

I was at one of the work card appeal hearings in recent months and I saw with my own eyes the Sheriff basically indicate that it was too much work for him to call or talk to these applicants, and that he felt it wasn't his job to help them in the application process. The Sheriff in these cases always seems to make a mountain out of a molehill. His actions create a huge waste of time for the Commissioners and his own department—when he or his office could handle this easily with a simple phone call. Instead he refuses to lift a single finger to provide any help to these applicants. These good people pay him a fee—just for the privilege of asking him for permission to work in this County, and for most applicants that have had work cards previously, they have paid taxes to the County. For him to have this arrogant, calloused attitude toward people who are simply asking to work is indefensible. He's making this process difficult intentionally to try to embarrass these people and the business they work for.

It's bad enough that people such as the appellant here today are treated in this fashion by anyone, let alone the senior law enforcement official in our County. But when it is common knowledge that the driving motivation for the Sheriff in these work card cases is to punish Lance Gilman for opposing him politically and to try to drive him out of business, it is far beyond the pale. The Sheriff is carrying out a personal political vendetta and causing massive carnage in the day to day lives of ordinary people who can't afford to defend themselves and who are just trying to get a job and get by to their next pay check. He doesn't seem to care who he tramples down in order to achieve his political goals.

It is time right now that the Sheriff must start treating everyone equally under the law. Most importantly he needs to start treating people with the basic levels of dignity and respect expected of a professional law enforcement officer. Virtually every Department and Department Head in Storey County has set an example of excellence in customer service that has become the envy of all Nevada Counties and truly legendary in the international business community. That is all Departments but one. The Sheriff's misconduct reflects on all us in this County, and we all need to stand up, stand together, and correct this problem.

Thank you to the Commissioners for your time and compassionate judgment on this appeal and I truly appreciate you considering my remarks.

From: Sondra Rosenberg, NDOT Assistant Director, Planning Subject: Fuel Revenue Indexing (FRI/ AB191) Sample Projects

The ballot measure for AB 191, if passed, would generate revenue for roadway projects in the Counties in which the measure passes. In order to assist with understanding the impact, the Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) has generated a list of project types and example projects for each county, based on the needs we have heard from counties during our annual consultation process, including workshops and commission presentations.

The Fuel Revenue Indexing (FRI) money that would be generated can generally be spend on roadway projects in the county in which the revenue is generated. It includes a portion that would go to the County and a portion that would go to the state highway trust fund, to be used by NDOT in that county. NDOT is committed to working with the Counties to develop projects for existing and new revenue sources. It is not our intent to "tell the counties what projects we will do, but rather work with the Counties on their priorities for transportation. Based on information we have received from the Counties as well as from our District staff, NDOT anticipates the revenue to be spent on the following project types:

- Roadway Preservation and Maintenance to improve and maintain the condition of roadways
- Corridor Safety Improvements, such as shoulder widening/slope flattening and passing
- Intersection Safety and Access Improvements, such as adding turn lanes, improving configurations, and providing adequate and safe pedestrian features
- Capacity and access for current and future development. If this funding source is approved and continues it may provide a resource to develop additional capacity, such as roadway widening and in some cases, frontage roads or alternate routes.

The following are example projects, based on needs we have heard from each county. This list is not intended as a commitment of specific projects and does not include all identified needs or eligible projects, but serves as an example to allow the Counties to begin prioritizing and coordinating on needed projects that could be developed or accelerated with additional revenue. <u>Carson City</u> DMV estimated 10 year revenue: \$69.7 million (\$43.7 County, \$26 State)

Bicycle and pedestrian improvements, such as bike lanes, sidewalk improvements, pedestrian signalization, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Accommodations, and intersection safety improvements.

Intersection lighting, such as at College Parkway/ Northgate Lane, Lompa Lane/Nye Lane, King Street & Division Street

Churchill County DMV estimated 10 year revenue: \$23 million (\$13.6 County, \$9.4 State)

Roadway improvements to accommodate development, such as the Western Nevada Rail Park and Nevada Iron

Safety Projects, such as passing lanes and slope flattening on US 95

Intersection improvements, such as Sheckler Road at US 95, US 50 at Shecker Cutoff

Bicycle and Pedestrian improvements such as Maine Street to Wade Lane and Sherman to Rio Vista

Douglas County DMV estimated 10 year revenue: \$43.7 million (\$27 County, \$16.7 State)

ADA and pedestrian improvements, such as along US 395

Intersection improvements, such as US 395/Muller, SR 88 at Centerville and Waterloo

Safety improvements along US 50, including turn pockets, wider shoulders, possible bike lanes

Complete Streets improvements in downtown areas

Long term – widen and/or access control on US 395, possible truck route alternate to US 395 to bypass Minden/Gardnerville

Elko County DMV estimated 10 year revenue: \$131.5 million (\$71.3 County,\$60.2 State)

Intersection Improvements, such as Palace Parkway/Spring Creek, and along Boyd Kennedy Safety improvements, such as passing lanes on US 93

Pedestrian improvements, such as sidewalks and crossings along SR 535 and SR 225

Improve capacity and structures for freight and large vehicles.

Provide capacity and access for future development

SAMPLE ARGUMENTS & CONSIDERATIONS FOR FUEL REVENUE INDEXING

The sample arguments and considerations were prepared by the Nevada Association of Counties to assist its members, who are required to place on the ballot at the General Election on November 8, 2016 a question which asks the voters in the County whether to authorize annual increases to taxes on certain motor vehicle fuels. NACO has not taken a position to support or oppose AB191.

Sample Arguments in Support

- Inflation in the cost of street and highway construction has eroded the purchasing power of
 motor vehicle fuel taxes. The gas tax has lost 38 percent of its value since Congress last
 increased it in 1993. Passage would merely index the current rates to inflation, so that the
 purchasing power of our gas taxes remain static and county roads can be maintained
- The purpose of indexing is simply to recover the purchasing power lost by inflation; if there
 is no inflation then there is no increase in the tax rate. Other familiar forms of taxation, like
 income, sales, and property taxes, also rise naturally over time, because they're assessed
 as a percentage of a dollar figure that goes up as incomes rise and goods and property
 become more expensive.
- The indexed revenue from these county and federal fuel taxes will be under local control.
 This means that our county or regional transportation commission will get to decide where they are spent, not the feds or state.
- 100% of all indexed taxes (county, state and federal) will be spent in our county and not sent elsewhere.
- Counties currently do not receive a share of the diesel tax despite the fact that 32% of all
 heavy truck traffic in Nevada is on local roads. Passage would finally direct a portion of the
 taxes on diesel to the county where the fuel was purchased.
- Article IX, Section 5 of the Nevada Constitution requires that the proceeds from the
 imposition of any excise tax on gasoline or other motor vehicle fuel shall, except costs of
 administration, be used exclusively for the construction, maintenance, and repair of the
 public highways of this State.
- There is very little chance that a long term plan for increasing funding or revenues to repair county roads will be enacted in the near future. Voting yes on indexing the fuel tax to inflation is the quickest way to help address the short-term budget shortfall for fixing our streets and highways.

Sample Arguments in Opposition

- Each of the automatic increases represents a separate tax hike a form of taxation without representation, because the Legislature won't vote each time. If the Legislature wants to increase taxes, they should have to vote for it.
- Inflation never reverses itself and this tax burden will only increase over time with the size of the shortfall.
- Nevadans currently pay over 50 cents per gallon fuel tax. Volatile fuel prices have already driven up the cost of food, medicine, clothing, utilities, etc, and an automatic fuel tax index will add significantly to the burden of high energy costs.
- Eliminating inflationary government regulations and red tape would free up more revenue for use on our streets and highways.
- The gas tax isn't an adequate long-term response to the state's transportation needs, and the state needs a longer-term plan to shift to a new model. When the gas tax went into law, gas purchased was a rough proxy for miles driven, so that people who used the roads more paid more for their upkeep. But fuel efficiency has been rising. Electric cars, which pay no gas tax at all, are quickly becoming a reality. Over the long term, states and the federal government must update the transportation funding system to restore a linkage between what drivers pay and the wear and tear they put on roads. Question xx is not the right long term solution to this problem.
- Options are available other than this tax plan.

Other Considerations

- Does your county have enough money to operate, maintain, renew, and expand your existing road system to the standards that the community desires?
- Does the county have a list of projects and/or backlog of maintenance needs on which the revenue derived from indexing would be spent? Deferring routine maintenance on streets and highways often results in higher costs for major repairs.
- Is the county road department efficient, can they cut costs to stretch existing revenues?
- Are there other benefits the community would see with increased road funding? (Jobs, improved safety, lower cost for operating and maintaining your vehicle, improved quality of life, improved economic competitiveness)
- Funding roadways is not only a Nevada issue, it is a national issue. States across the country are having the same tough conversations that Nevada is having and likewise recognizing the limited options.
- The financial impact of fuel revenue indexing on motorists will depend on: how many miles
 they drive, the fuel efficiency of their vehicle and the increase in the fuel tax. For example, a
 motorist who drives 10,000 miles per year and averages 25 miles per gallon would see an
 increase in their fuel cost of \$120 per year (based on a per gallon increase of 3 cents).

PROPOSED NOVEMBER, 2016 CARSON CITY BALLOT LANGUAGE

(Required by Assembly Bill No. 191 (2015), relating to motor vehicle fuel tax indexing)

Question

Shall the Carson City Board of Supervisors enact an ordinance to impose, for the period beginning on January 1, 2017 and ending on December 31, 2026, annual increases to the taxes on motor vehicle fuel and various special fuels used in motor vehicles in an amount not to exceed in each year a total of three cents (\$0.03) for every gallon sold in Carson City, with the revenue generated from the increase to be used for the sole purpose of building, maintaining and repairing roads and highways located only in Carson City?

Explanation

Currently, counties in Nevada may impose certain taxes on motor vehicle fuel and special fuels used in motor vehicles (collectively, "Fuels"), and the board of county commissioners in all counties, other than in Clark and Washoe County, are required to impose additional county taxes on those Fuels if approved by a majority of the voters in those counties at the general election in November 2016. After voter approval, the board of county commissioners of those counties may also impose annual increases in the taxes for the period beginning on January 1, 2017, and ending on December 31, 2026. Before the 78th (2015) Session of the Nevada Legislature, state law required a statewide measure to be placed on the November 2016 ballot for Nevada voters to decide whether to authorize the State to impose additional state taxes to the Fuels. After the enactment of Assembly Bill No. 191, the requirements for the statewide ballot measure were repealed and instead, upon approval by a majority of the voters in the county at the general election in November 2016, the board of county commissioners of a county other than Clark or Washoe County is required to impose the state taxes in the same manner as the board is required to impose the additional county taxes on the Fuels. If this ballot question is approved, the Carson City Board of Supervisors would be required to impose these state taxes.

These additional county and state taxes are required to be calculated by applying a formula factoring a certain percentage based on certain construction inflation, and the percentage cannot exceed 7.8 percent. This practice of tying the fuel tax rate to the rate of certain construction inflation is known as fuel indexing. However, because a board of county commissioners is also authorized to use a percentage that is lower than 7.8 percent, the Carson City Board of Supervisors will apply a percentage which will result in annual increases to the motor vehicle fuel tax in an amount not to exceed in each year a total of three cents (\$0.03) for every gallon sold in Carson City if this ballot question is approved. If this ballot question is approved, the Carson City Board of Supervisors will be required to adopt an ordinance to impose the annual tax increases and the revenue collected from the annual increases in these taxes will be required to be used in accordance with state law and for purposes related to the construction, maintenance and repair of roads and highways located only in Carson City.

A "YES" vote would allow Carson City to enact an ordinance to impose, for the period beginning on January 1, 2017 and ending on December 31, 2026, annual

increases to the taxes on certain motor vehicle fuels sold in Carson City, with the revenue from those increases to be used solely for improvements to roads, streets and highways located in Carson City.

A "NO" vote would prohibit Carson City from enacting an ordinance to impose, for the period beginning on January 1, 2017 and ending on December 31, 2026, annual increases to the taxes on certain motor vehicle fuels sold in Carson City, and also prevent improvements to roads, streets and highways located in Carson City that would have been funded by the increases.

Digest

If passed, this measure would create, generate or increase public revenue. Passage or defeat of this measure by the voters of Carson City would not add to, change or repeal Nevada state laws which govern county taxes on fuel (NRS chapter 373) and how such taxes must be spent (NRS chapter 365). If passed, this measure would require the Carson City Board of Supervisors to enact an ordinance before imposing the additional taxes authorized by Assembly Bill No. 191. Ordinances adopted by the Carson City Board of Supervisors that concern motor vehicle fuel taxes are codified in Chapter 11.20 of the Carson City Municipal Code. Therefore, passage of this ballot measure would require additions or amendments to Chapter 11.20 of the Carson City Municipal Code.

Description of Anticipated Financial Effect

If passed, this measure would authorize taxes that are cumulative where subsequent increases are added to prior years' taxes. The Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles has prepared a document titled the "County Index Tax Revenue Projections FY17-FY26" which estimates that the additional taxes could potentially generate approximately \$40 Million of additional revenue for Carson City by the end of 2026.

5.12.005 License required.

The board of county commissioners finds that in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of Storey County, it is necessary to license and control those persons or businesses that are engaged in the making of, distribution or sale of alcoholic beverages. An applicant for this privileged license does not have any right to a license. Any license issued pursuant to the provisions of this title is a revocable privilege, and a holder does not acquire any vested right in any license. The liquor board determines that alcoholic beverages may not be dispensed or sold in any place where, in the judgment of the liquor board, the distribution or sale creates or may create a public nuisance.

The board of county commissioners further determines that the liquor ordinances adopted by the liquor board may be adopted by the board of county commissioners and be set forth in the Storey County code and utilize the code's numbering system.

(Ord. 83 § 6, 1983)

5.12.006 Definitions.

Unless the context requires otherwise, the following words have the following meanings:

- A. Alcoholic beverages or liquor include alcohol, spirits, wine and beer, and every liquid or solid containing alcohol and are intended for human consumption.
- B. **Bar** means any bar, cocktail lounge, club or tavern, with or without live or recorded entertainment, and with or without dancing.
- B. The **liquor board** consists of the members of the board of county commissioners and the sheriff.

5.12.008 - Meetings of liquor board.

A. The liquor board must meet as often as its business requires during or immediately following a meeting of the board of supervisors.

- B. Three or more members of the board constitute a quorum and each member has one vote.
- C. A majority vote of the members present is necessary to authorize the issuance of any license or to transact any other business.
 - D. In the event of a tie vote, the matter being voted upon is not approved.
 - E. All members of the board serve without additional compensation.
 - F. The board must elect a chairman from among its members.
 - G. The clerk treasurer serves as the clerk of the board.

5.12.010 Application form and aAccompanying data.

In addition to holding a business license issued pursuant to chapter 5.04, aAll new applicants for a liquor license, authorizing the sale of all alcoholic beverages, on or off the premises, within the county, shall must provide a completed application, on forms approved by the liquor board, and a current picture to the administrator for the county liquor license board with the following, including but not limited to:

- A. Proof of financial standing to warrant an expected satisfactory and profitable business operation:
 - B. A complete background as to the applicant's criminal record. and
 - C. The applicant's experience in the saloon or liquor vending business;.
 - D. A credit report from a national agency that is dated within sixty days of the application.
 - E. A complete list of licenses applied for and information for each license.
- \subset E. A one-thousand-dollar \$1000 nonrefundable investigative fee, unless otherwise specifieed in this chapter, with the annual fee as set forth in this Cchapter 5.04 of this title.
- DF. An authorization for the county to conduct an investigation into the applicant's criminal history and an authorization signed by the applicant for the submission of the applicant's fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigations for a National Background check. The licensing authority shall may fingerprint the applicant or have the applicant submit a completed fingerprint Electronic Livescan request form and shall submit a complete set of the applicant's fingerprints, in accordance with the applicant's authorization, to the Central Repository for Nevada records of criminal history and to the Federal Bureau of Investigations as authorized by NRS 239B.010(1)(a). (Ord. 83 § 1, 1983) (Ord. No. 08-215, § 1, 9-2-2008)

5.12.020 Application confidentiality.

Information submitted by the applicant showing the applicant's personal information, finances, net worth, earnings or revenues that is submitted as part of an application must be treated as confidential except when:

- A. Used in the ordinary course of the administration of this chapter. This includes liquor board members and county staff that work in the application approval process.
 - B. Subject to a subpoena or other order of a court of competent jurisdiction.
- C. Released to a duly authorized agent of a governmental agency acting pursuant to the agency's authority and function.

5.12.020 Application-Form.

- A. All applications shall be on forms as provided by the county liquor board and sheriff's department, and all information of a personal nature shall be kept confidential.
 - B. Separate applications shall be provided for each type of license requested.
 - C. No separate beer and wine license shall be issued, but off sale liquor licenses may be

5.12.030 Application--Investigation period.

A. Application for a new regular liquor license and any additional licenses for the business may be submitted and considered for first reading by the liquor license board following a thirty-day investigative period. The administrator must receive the report from the sheriff and comptroller before the item is put on the board's agenda. The first reading may be delayed for aAdditional investigative time may be taken by the administrator licensing authorities, if required. If the investigation is continued beyond thirty days, the administrator must notify the applicant and the liquor board in writing.

B. New applicants may not operate until all inspections are completed and licenses approved. (Ord. 83 § 3, 1983)

5.12.040 Temporary license.

The administrator or the liquor board may issue a temporary liquor license for the purpose of continuing an existing business during the period in which a liquor license application has been made, and prior to its approval or disapproval by the liquor license board. No additional fee is required.

A temporary license may be approved where there is a request for a new license for the addition of new partners or change of corporate officers or directors of licensee or where the new applicant is a member of the immediate family of a licensee who cannot continue operating the business due to death, incompetency, retirement or other similar disability of present licensee. The immediate family of a licensee includes one or more of the following: surviving spouse, son, daughter, mother or father.

(Ord. 83 § 2E, 1983)

5.12.050 Hearing on application.

- A. All licenses referred to in this chapter must be heard at two meetings of the liquor license board before being acted upon. The administrator must include in the board's agenda packet for the hearing: a copy of the application with personal information redacted, a summary of the investigation of the applicant's criminal history and a summary of the comptroller's review of the applicant's financial standing, and any documents not considered confidential submitted by the applicant with the application. Confidential information may be reviewed by the liquor board members at the administrator's office or by delivery of a sealed packet that is reviewed by the member and returned to the administrator in a manner that preserves confidentiality.
- B. The liquor license board must consider the evidence presented at the hearing on the application and may approve the license if the applicant meets the requirements of this chapter, deny the application based on good cause, or continue the hearing.
- C. The liquor license board is authorized to issue temporary licenses or continue temporary licenses approved and previously given by the administrator, until final action on the license is taken.
- D. Before the liquor license board may approve a liquor license, the premises must be inspected and approved by the state health department, the fire district, and the building official or any other governmental agencies that may be required.
- E. If the liquor license board denies an application the applicant may not reapply until six months from the date of the board's denial.

5.12.055 Grounds for denial.

The grounds for denial of an application must be based on good cause, which includes but is not limited to:

- A. An application that is incomplete or that contains false, misleading or fraudulent statements.
- B. The applicant fails to satisfy any requirement imposed by this chapter or any local, state, or federal law, regulation or policy pertaining to the license.
- C. The applicant has been subject to administrative action imposing discipline or fines relating to a liquor license in any jurisdiction, or denied a license or a work card due to suitability issues.
- D. The applicant has, within five years immediately preceding the date of the application, been convicted, regardless of the jurisdiction of the conviction, of any of the following criminal offenses:
 - 1. A felony or any crime which under the laws of Nevada would be a felony.
 - 2. Any crime with theft, fraud or intent to defraud is an element.
 - 3. Sales or trafficking of a controlled substance.
 - 4. Solicitation, prostitution or pandering.
 - E. Any cause reasonably related to protecting public health, safety and welfare.

5.12.060 Liquor license fees and regulations.

Unless otherwise provided for in a fee resolution, the liquor board imposes the following fees:

- A. These fees are in addition to any other business license fees in chapter 5.04
- B. Fees:
- 1. An application investigative fee of \$1000.00, if investigative costs exceed \$1000, the applicant is responsible to pay any additional costs.
 - 2. The off-sale license fee is \$100.00 per year.
- 3. The on-sale regular license fee, which includes the right to sell beer, wine and liquor off-sale, is \$500.00 per year.
 - 3. The additional service bar fee is \$50.00 for an additional service bar.
 - 4. A special events liquor license fee is \$10.00.
 - (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.12.070 Off-sale license.

The liquor board may approve an off-sale liquor license, provided:

- A. An investigative fee is paid and the investigation shows the applicant meets the requirements of this chapter.
 - B. The applicant has a business license.
- C. The licensee is responsible to make sure off-sale alcoholic beverages are not consumed on the premises. (Ord. 83 § 2H, 1983)

5.12.080 Regular liquor license--Requirements.

A. Each business for the sale of alcoholic beverages is required to have a regular liquor license issued by the county. Any additional licenses may be approved or denied by the board at the same time as the regular license. A regular liquor license is subject to the following

requirements:

- 1. The license is limited to one contiguous location in a building.
- 2. Additional full service bars in the same location require additional licenses.
- 3. No investigative fee or detailed application in addition to the fee and investigation done for the regular license is required for an additional license.
- B. A regular liquor license is required before applying for an additional licenses or the application for a regular license and any other type of liquor license may be submitted at the same time, except for temporary liquor licenses or off-sale liquor licenses. (Ord. 83 § 2A, 1983)

5.12.085 Bar liquor license.

A regular liquor license may be approved where the primary purpose of the business is the operation of a bar.

5.12.090 Supplemental bar liquor license.

A. Any regular liquor licensee or applicant may apply for a supplemental liquor license for an additional full bar to be operated in the same building. No investigation fee or detailed application in addition to the fee and investigation done for the regular license is required.

B. Payment of an additional annual regular license fee is required. (Ord. 83 § 2F, 1983)

5.12.100 Service bar liquor license.

In addition to a regular liquor license, a service bar liquor license may be required and issued under the following conditions:

- A. The service must be for additional area, such as a dining area.
- B. The service is limited to employees for delivery to customers in the area.
- C. No sit-down or additional service for customers is allowed at a service bar.
- D. The service bar must be in the same premises as the regular liquor license.
- E. Payment of additional annual service bar license fee. (Ord. 83 § 2B, 1983)

5.12.105 Cabaret license.

It is unlawful for any person to permit any singing, dancing, floor show or entertainment to be conducted or carried on in any establishment where alcoholic beverages are sold without first obtaining a cabaret license.

5.12.110 Restaurant liquor license.

A regular liquor license may be approved where the primary purpose of the business is the operation of a restaurant, supper club or dinner house. (Ord. 83 § 2G, 1983)

5.12.040120 Transferability of license.

Liquor licenses are not transferable. except as provided in Article II of this chapter. (Ord. 83 § 5, 1983)

5.12.050 130 Abandonment of license.

A. A liquor licensee shall be is deemed to have abandoned his liquor license if he fails to have his establishment open for business for a continuous period of six months during any one fiscal year.

B. Abandonment shall will not occur until notice and hearing by the liquor license board,

and the licensee has the opportunity to be heard.

- C. No A license shall will not be deemed abandoned if the closure was beyond the control of the licensee.
- D. No A new license shall may not be issued when the licensee abandons his liquor license until a period of one year from the date the liquor board declares the license abandoned. (Ord. 83 § 4, 1983)

5.12.060 Location of establishments limited.

Issuance of regular full licenses shall be limited to C Street in Virginia City, and Gold Hill's Main Street, in those communities, except by special application to the liquor board. (Ord. 83 § 6, 1983)

5.12.070 140 Hours of sale.

Liquor may be sold by a A licensee may sell alcoholic beverages twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. (Ord. 83 § 7, 1983)

5.12.080 150 Minors--Employment and service prohibitions.

The employment of or service to persons under the age of twenty one years, in the sale and disposition of alcoholic beverages is prohibited.

- A. Alcoholic beverages may not be served, dispensed or sold to persons under the age of twenty-one years, and persons under the age of twenty-one years are not allowed to loiter in or about a saloon unless accompanied by their parents, or unless they are in a food-service area.
- B. A person who has attained the age of 16 years and has not attained the age of 18 years may be employed in a retail food store for the sale or disposition of liquor if:
- 1. He or she is supervised by a person who is 18 years of age or over and who is an owner or an employee of the business that sells or disposes of the liquor.
- 2. The person 18 years of age or over who is supervising the person under 18 is actually present at the time that the person under 18 sells or disposes of the liquor.
- 3. The liquor is in a container or receptacle which is corked or sealed.. (Ord. 83 § 8, 1983)

5.12.160 Right of inspection.

All officials involved in the license process, the administrator, and the sheriff have access to every part and portion of the establishment for which a license is issued under the provisions of this chapter at any time when the establishment is open for the transaction of business and at all other reasonable times.

5.12.090 Regular license Conditions.

A. Each licensee shall be required to have a regular license issued by the county, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Only one contiguous location in a building for each bar license;
- 2. Bar designed for full service to individual customers and/or service bar;
- 3. Additional bars in the same location require additional licenses. No investigative fee or detailed application is required;

 - E. The Service bar must be in the same premises as the regular liquor license;
 - F. Payment of additional annual license fee. (Ord. 83 § 2B, 1983)

5.12.110 Special events license.

Excluding charitable or nonprofit events, a special events liquor license may be issued subject to the following conditions:

- A. Regular liquor license required;
- B. To be issued for the purpose of a portable bar for customers and/or employee service for holidays and special occasions only, within the same building or in another location upon approval of the liquor board;
 - C. Valid for a period of three days only;
 - D. Payment of additional fee of ten dollars. (Ord. 83 § 2C, 1983)

5.12.120 Amended license.

An amended liquor license is one issued after an application is made for the purpose of modifying and amending the person or legal entity who or which holds an existing liquor license subject to the following conditions:

- A. Findings of acceptability of new applicants;
- B. Payment of nonrefundable investigative fee of five hundred dollars per applicant;
- C. Only the following persons or entities are entitled to apply for amended liquor licenses:
 - 1. Addition of new partners or change of corporate officers or directors of licensee,
- 2. Where new applicant is a member or members of the immediate family of a licensee who cannot continue operating the business due to death, incompetency, retirement or other similar disability of present licensee;
- 3. Definition of "immediate family" of a licensee shall be one or more of the following: surviving spouse, son, daughter, mother or father,
 - 4. Transfer is not to exceed fifty percent ownership. (Ord. 83 § 2D, 1983)

5.12.130 Temporary license.

— A temporary liquor license may be issued for the purpose of continuing an existing business during the period in which a liquor license application has been made, and prior to its approval or disapproval. No additional fee shall be required. (Ord. 83 § 2E, 1983)

5.12.140 Supplemental license.

A. Any licensee may apply for a supplemental liquor license for an additional full bar to be operated in the same building in conjunction with another full bar license. No investigation fee or detailed application shall be required.

B. Payment of an additional annual regular license fee is required. (Ord. 83 § 2F, 1983)

5.12.150 Supper club or dinner house license.

A regular liquor license may be issued to an applicant where the primary purpose of the business is the operation of a supper club or dinner house upon application and payment of required fees. The determination of the nature of the business and necessity for the liquor license in conjunction therewith, shall be made after a hearing set by the county liquor board. (Ord. 83 § 2G, 1983)

5.12.160 Off-sale license.

- An off-sale liquor license may be issued upon application provided:
 - A. An investigative fee is paid as required by this chapter;
 - B. An application is made and the fee required by Chapter 5.04 of this title is paid;
- C. The off sale liquor shall not be consumed on the premises of licensee. (Ord. 83 § 2H, 1983)

5.12.170 Criminal Penalty-Misdemeanor.

A violation of any provision of this chapter is a misdemeanor. (Ord. No. 13-249, § I, 10-1-2013; Ord. 83 § 11, 1983)

SECTION III: Chapter 8.28 Special Events is amended as follows:

8.28.025 Alcoholic beverages.

A. The *administrator* county sheriff may permit the sale of alcoholic beverages in public areas in conjunction with a special event permit provided any procedures or criteria adopted by ordinance or resolution of the county board commissioners are adhered to. An application for the sale of alcoholic beverages in public areas must be filed with an application for a special event permit *on a form approved by the liquor license board* and follow all procedures therefor.

- B. A special events liquor license may be issued by the license department subject to the following conditions:
- 1. The applicant must hold a rRegular Storey County liquor license or have written permission from an existing regular liquor license holder required;
- 2. Tohe license may be issued for the purpose of a portable bar for customers and/or employee service for holidays and special occasions only, within the same building or in another location;
 - 3. Valid for a period of five (5) days only;
- 4. Any license fee applicable to the sale of alcoholic beverages as set forth in cChapter 5.12.110 of this Code must be paid in addition to any special event permit fees.
- 5. The licensee mMust adhere to the State of Nevada laws and Storey County Codes pertaining to the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages
- C. An application for the sale of alcoholic beverages in public areas must provide the following information:
 - 1. Whether alcoholic beverages will be sold or dispensed free of charge;
 - 2. Is Whether entry to the event restricted to invited guests or open to the public;
 - 3. What types of alcoholic beverages will be sold or consumed;
 - 4. What containers will be used; it is unlawful to use glass or metal containers;

- 5. Who will be the on-site supervisor of alcoholic beverage service;6. Such other information as the *administrator* eounty sheriff deems appropriate. (Ord. No. 09-224, § 1, 3-16-2010)

4. Staff summary continued:

The existing code combines sections for liquor licenses in the business license chapter. These sections have been segregated to the appropriate chapters. The investigation of applicants has been modified and language added to make sure the liquor board has the information necessary to make a decision. The requirements for approval or denial stays the same but the hearing process has been more fully set out. There may be additional changes that may be made based on the discussion at the public hearings.

Issues to be discussed:

- 1. Creation of licensing ddivision. The new ordinance creates a licensing division headed by the administrator (designated by resolution of the board) and sets up procedures and regulations for the department. NRS 364.010 provides that the sheriff of each county is the ex officio collector of county licenses provided for in chapter 244 of NRS and by other laws, unless the board of county commissioners by ordinance: (a) establishes a county license division; (b) adopts procedures for the investigation of applicants for county licenses and for the administration, collection and disposition of county license fees; and (c) provides regulations for the operation of the county license department.
- **2. Civil penalties.** The existing and new ordinance both do not have civil penalties. NRS 244.33509 allows a board of county commissioners by ordinance to provide for the imposition of a civil penalty in lieu of a criminal penalty for the violation of an ordinance enacted by the board concerning the licensing or regulation of businesses unless state law provides a criminal penalty for the same act or omission.

Ordinance No. 15-271

Summary

An ordinance amending Storey County Code section 3.60.050, chapter 5.04 Business Licenses, chapter 5.12 Sale of Alcoholic Beverages, and section 8.28.025 Alcoholic beverages, to revise the procedure for issuing and revoking business and liquor licenses.

Title

An ordinance amending Storey County Code section 3.60.050 chapter 5.04 Business Licenses, chapter 5.12 Sale of Alcoholic Beverages, and 8.28.025 Alcoholic beverages, to revise the procedure for issuing and revoking business and liquor licenses, and providing for other properly related matters.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Storey, State of Nevada, does ordain:

SECTION I: Section 3.60.050 is amended as follows:

3.60.050 Business license required.

A. The sheriff's office or the community development department must issue written business licenses, in the form approved by the board of county commissioners, upon approval of a completed application. It is unlawful for any A person, either for himself or for any other person, to may not commence or carry on any transient lodging business within the county without having procured a business license from the business license division. sheriff's office or the community development department to do so.

B. The transaction or carrying on of any transient lodging business without first having procured a business license will constitute a separate violation for each day that such business is carried on.

C. A business license may not be issued or renewed for transient lodging pursuant to this section unless it is first determined that all transient lodging taxes, penalties and interest are paid in full, and no delinquencies exist with respect to the transient lodging business whether or not the delinquencies were incurred by the applicant, whether a tenant, legal owner, or landlord of the intended place of business for license or renewal. The fair and recreation board must notify the business license division-sheriff's office or the community development department of all license holders with any current delinquencies as of May 1st of each year. (Ord. No. 08-220, 9-2-2008; Ord. No. 10-232, § 1, 8-3-2010; Ord. No. 12-240, § I, 11-13-2012)

5.04.010 License required—Violation—Criminal penalty.

A person, firm, association or corporation within the limits of Storey County may not pursue any calling, trade, business or profession, until he, she, they or it has taken out a license, and paid all fees for the license. Any person violating this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor. (Ord. No. 13-249, § I, 10-1-2013; Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.012 Definitions.

Unless the context requires otherwise, the following words have the following meanings:

- A. "Board" means the board of county commissioners.
- B. "Business" or "doing business" means all professions, trades, occupations and callings carried on for profit, and in addition includes labor unions, labor organizations and trade unions; however, "business" does not include the rental of three or less residential units.
 - C. "Cabaret" is live entertainment.
- D. "Contract office business" means a person doing business in Storey County without employees in Storey County by using the services of a shared resident office staff in Storey County.
- E. "Contractor" means a person required by the state of Nevada Contractors Board to have a license as a contractor, whether the person is a general or subcontractor.
 - F. "Employee" has the meaning in NRS 608.010.
- G. "Home enterprise" means a person, excluding contractors conducting business out of a residence and whose business does not invite the public.
- H. "Independent contractor" means a person who contracts to do a piece of work according to his or her own methods and is subject to an employer's control only as to the final result of the work. Examples are, but not limited to: insurance agents, stockbrokers, hairdressers, and shoe shiners. Employees of licensees are not independent contractors for the purpose of this chapter. Independent contractor does not include a brothel's prostitutes.
- I. "Nonprofit organization" means all institutions, corporations, organizations or associations that are registered under state or federal law, are for charitable, or civic purposes and whose donations or receipts are not used for the private gain of any person.
- J. "Off-premises sale" means a sale of goods or services held by a person licensed to make sales but which is held in Storey County at a site other than the site specified on the person's business license.
- K. "Out of county business" means a person, excluding a contractor, conducting business in Storey County without a physical address in Storey County.
- L. "Person" means a corporation, association, syndicate, partnership, club, trust, independent contractor or natural person but does not include employees of businesses licensed under this chapter unless an employee is an owner of the business.
- M. "Professional" means one whose practice of a profession requires advanced education and a license from a state licensing agency, board, commission or court.
 - N. "Special events" are those authorized by chapter 8.28.

5.04.015 Establishment of business license division and appointment of administrator.

The board establishes a business license devision to administer the duties set out in this title. An administrator of the division may be appointed only by resolution of the Storey County board of county commissioners. and requires a written resolution. The appointed administrator shall or the administrator's designee must carry out the functions prescribed to the administrator in this title. Chapter 5.05. (Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.020 Application.

All applications for licenses under this chapter, unless otherwise specified in this chapter, shall must be made to the sheriff or administrator in writing on a form approved by the board, upon blanks provided therefor, and each applicantion must include shall make signed statements thereon, of the full name of the applicant, and if a partnership, the full name of each member, and if a corporation, the list of officers and the state of incorporation, the nature of the business on what, the street address of the business and at what number it is to be carried on, when it shall will commence business, with sufficient information for the calculation of the license fee, a written declaration by the applicant, under penalty of perjury, that the information contained in the application is true and correct. the full name of the applicant, and if a partnership, the full name of each member thereof, and if a corporation, the state of incorporation. If a license is sought by a person or partnership doing business under a fictitious name, such that name shall must also be set forth in the application affidavit, and proof supplied that the requirements of state law concerning registration of fictitious names shall be have been met. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.030 Content.

All licenses issued under and by virtue of this chapter shall be printed in blank form, signed by auditor of Storey County and countersigned by the sheriff or administrator, and shall set forth the name of the party to whom issued, the type of license, profession, or business he, she, they or it is or are licensed to pursue, the time for which the same is granted, the date thereof and the amount therefor; and shall contain thereon, in addition to the matters set out in this section, the word "Nontransferable." (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.040 Nontransferable.

No license shall be assignable or transferable, nor authorize any person or persons other than those named thereon to carry on the business specified, nor shall such license authorize the earrying on of the business therein specified in any other location or building than that named therein. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.050 30 Hearing on application.

A. All business licenses referred to in this chapter, licensing board regulations, and liquor board regulations, shall must be heard read at least two one meetings of the board applicable licensing agency before being acted upon.

B. The eounty licensing board may, during the hearing, and county liquor board are authorized to issue a temporary licenses or continue a temporary license approved previously given by the sheriff administrator, until final action is taken by the board.

- C. The applicant must inform the board in writing of any change in the information submitted with the application. The county licensing board is authorized to issue temporary licenses or continue temporary approval previously given by the administrator until final action is taken.
- D. Before the board may approve final approval of any a business license referred to in this chapter, the applicant must obtain all required public safety inspections and the approval by of the state health department, fire chief, building inspector and other governmental agencies that may be required by the applicable licensing agency. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.040 Content, posting requirement.

All licenses issued under this title must be printed in blank form, signed by the administrator, and must set forth the name of the party to whom issued, the type of license, profession, or business he, she, they or it is licensed to pursue, the time for which the license is granted, the date of the license and the amount of fees paid; and must contain in plain view the word "Nontransferable."

- A. A business license for the transaction of any kind of business in any fixed or certain locality must post the license conspicuously in the establishment or place of business, and keep it conspicuously posted until the license has expired or the person ceases to transact the business. If the business does not have a fixed place of business the license must be available on request.
- B. Any person who fails to post or keep posted or have a license as required by this section may be fined not more than \$250. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.050 Nontransferable.

A license may not be assigned or transferred and does not authorize any person or persons other than those named to carry on the business specified, nor does the license authorize the carrying on of the business in any other location or building than that named in the license. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.060 Temporary licenses.

A. The board sheriff and the administrator are authorized to provide a temporary business license for the operation of a business issuable by the Storey County board of commissioners except for gaming licenses. All such temporary permission shall be license may be issued in sole discretion of the sheriff and the sole discretion of the administrator or the board, and is effective allowed until the board acts upon the license application. acted upon by the Storey County board of commissioners.

B. A temporary license may not be issued until the applicant has obtained all required public safety inspections and approval of Before temporary approval of any license referred to in this chapter, approval by the state health department, fire chief, building inspector and other governmental agencies that may be required. by the applicable licensing agency. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.070 Recordkeeping by the administrator.

It is the duty of the administrator to keep a database for active business licenses, including the amount received for fees. A report of all active business licenses, with the names of the business, the owner's name, the address of the business, and the area of the county where the

business is located, must be presented annually at the first regular meeting of the board in July of each year.

5.04.0780 Recordkeeping by the comptroller Auditor.

A. The county recorder shall monitor the automated accounting system relative to the Virginia County, Gold Hill, and Storey County business licenses issued from the Storey County sheriff's office and the administrator's office, and year for which issued and the amount therefor.

—B. The comptroller county auditor shall must audit and balance the business license account through the automated business license accounting system in the Storey County sheriff's office and the administrator's office yearly. A detailed report shall must be presented to the board Storey County commissioners at the first regular meeting in July of each year. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.080 Recordkeeping-Sheriff and administrator.

It is the duty of the sheriff and administrator to keep on computer business licenses, wherein he shall enter the names of all persons, firms, associations or corporations to whom licenses have been issued, the time for which the license has been granted, the date and expiration thereof, and the amount received. Reports shall be presented at each regular meeting of the county commissioners. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.090 Office hours for license issuance and fee payments.

The sheriff and administrator shall must keep his office open between the hours of nine a.m. and five four p.m. of every weekday, excepting Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, and declared emergencies excepted, to issue licenses. and it shall be It is the duty of everyone from whom a license-tax fee is due and owing to pay the fee same at the office of the sheriff or office of the administrator during business hours or by electronic means. The license fees are due without demand or notice by the administrator. the hours he is required by this section to keep his office open, and no personal demand or notice by the sheriff or by the administrator to such person or persons owing such license tax shall be necessary to incur the penalties of this chapter. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.100 License approval or denial Refusal.

A. The board may approve, deny, or continue a business license application or take any other action it considers appropriate. The burden of showing qualifications, acceptability or fitness for a license is on the applicant. The board may refuse to issue a license if the state health department, fire district chief, building inspector or other governmental agencies find the applicant is not in compliance with Storey County Code or state law. A license may be refused The board may refuse a license by any licensing agency until an applicant complies or agrees to comply with all other existing ordinances and laws in force, including the county master plan, and a license may be revoked for failure to comply therewith.

B. No A business license may not shall be issued or renewed when, at the time of making application for any license or renewal thereof, the applicant, whether a tenant, legal owner, or landlord of the intended place of business is indebted to the county for any unpaid real property taxes or personal property taxes, or any fees due the county. The tax receiver may enter into an agreement with any person so indebted to the county to establish a schedule for the payment of such the indebtedness and any delinquencies and interest thereon. In such the agreement, the

debtor shall must acknowledge such the debt to the county and shall agree that if any default occurs in the payment of any installment agreed to be paid thereunder, the entire amount to be paid shall will become immediately due and payable, and the subject business license may be revoked. (Ord. 188, 2004: Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999) (Ord. No. 10-232, § 2, 8-3-2010)

5.04.110 Suspension, cancellation or revocation of licenses.

A. The sheriff-administrator is authorized to temporarily suspend all licenses issued by the county licensing board and the county liquor board, such suspension and to require the licensee by written notice to appear at the next regular meeting of the applicable board. The administrator is authorized to temporarily suspend all licenses issued by the county licensing board, such suspension to require the licensee by written notice to appear at the next regular meeting of the applicable board.

Any business license issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, or any amendment thereof, for the conducting of business, may be suspended, canceled or revoked for good cause by the board of commissioners. Good cause for such suspension, cancellation or revocation shall includes, but is not be limited to:

- 1. The existence of unsanitary conditions, noise, disturbance or other conditions at, near or in the premises which cause or tend to create a public nuisance or which injuriously affects the public health, safety or welfare;
- 2. The commission of, or permitting or causing the commission of, any act in the operation of the business which act is made unlawful or is prohibited by any ordinance, rule or law of Storey County, or state or federal government; or
- 3. Fraudulent practices or misrepresentations in the operation of the business, or concealment or misrepresentation in procuring the license.
- B. Any *business* license issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter may be suspended, canceled or revoked in the following manner:
- 1. The board may, on its own motion or initiative, or upon complaint of any person, institute proceedings to suspend, cancel or revoke a license by mailing a complaint setting forth the *violations* alleged reason for such proceeding to the licensee at the last address provided to the county. of such proceeding to licensee as shown by his application or by a supplemental application filed pursuant to the provisions hereof.
- 2. The licensee shall may, within ten days of the date of such mailing, file with the county clerk a written answer to the such-complaint, under oath.
- 3. The board shall must fix a day and time and send written notice to the licensee for a hearing at which the licensee will be given an opportunity to be heard.
- 4. If the licensee fails to file a written answer within the time required, or if the licensee fails to appear at the place and time designated for the hearing, the board may order the license suspended, canceled or revoked.
- 5. The board shall *must*, within fifteen days after the date of such-the hearing, enter its order to suspend, cancel or revoke, or refuse to suspend, cancel or revoke, the license. The applicant *will* shall be allowed to operate until the order is entered with the clerk's office.
- 6. As an alternative to the procedure outlined in the foregoing sections, the board may, on its own initiative or upon the complaint of any person, require the licensee to appear before the board at a time and place fixed by the board, to show cause, why his license should not be suspended, canceled or revoked. The hearing shall not be less than five days from the date of service upon the licensee of the order by mailing a copy of the order to him at his last known

address or place of business, or by making personal service upon him thereof. The failure by the licensee to appear at the time and place designated by the board *may* shall, in and of itself, constitute sufficient grounds for suspension, cancellation or revocation of the licensee's license.

7. There shall be no reopening or review of the proceedings whatever by the board except when it subsequently appears to the satisfaction of the board that the licensee's failure to answer or appear was due to matters beyond his control, and not through negligence on the part of the licensee.

C. In all proceedings under this *title* Title or any other provision of this code, the board *has* shall have the right to *administer oaths*, *certify to official acts*, *issue* subpoenas *for the* attendance of witnesses and the production of documents, books, papers, and records. and all witnesses thus subpoenaed shall attend at the time and place appointed therein, and failure to attend at the time and place appointed in the subpoena may be regarded by the board as contempt thereof, and a finding by the board to such effect shall be duly reported to the sheriff for immediate disposition thereon, and shall constitute prima facie evidence of contempt in any trial of the offending witness in any court of the county; the penalty for each such offense shall be a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, and shall be accompanied by incarceration of not less than two days nor more than thirty days.

D. In addition to the other remedies provided in this chapter, the Storey County district attorney's office is authorized to petition the district court for an injunction restraining any business from conducting business without a valid license. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.120 Signs as proof of engaging in business.

A sign or advertisement kept, exhibited or published indicating that any person, partnership or corporation is engaged in a business, trade, or profession for which a license is required under this chapter or shall hereafter be required, or for the performance of services wherein a charge is made or compensation accepted, shall be is prima facie evidence that such the person, partnership or corporation is so engaged-therein. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.130 Definitions.

As used in this title, unless the context requires otherwise, the following words shall have the meaning as set forth in this chapter:

A. "Board" means the board of Storey Ccounty commissioners.

B. "Business" or "doing business" means, except as provided herein, all professions, trades, occupations and callings carried on for profit, and in addition includes labor unions, labor organizations and trade unions; however, "business" does not include the rental of three or less residential units.

C. "Contract office business" means a person doing business in Storey County without employees in Storey County by using the services of a shared resident office staff in Storey County.

D. "Contractor" means a person required by the state of Nevada Contractors Board to have a license as a contractor, whether the person is a general or subcontractor.

E. "Home occupation business" means a person, excluding contractors conducting business out of a residence and whose business does not invite the public.

F. "Independent contractor" means a person who contracts to do a piece of work according to his

or her own methods and is subject to an employer's control only as to the final result of the work. Examples are, but not limited to: insurance agents, stockbrokers, hairdressers, and shoe shiners. Employees of licensees are not independent contractors for the purpose of this chapter. Independent contractor does not include a brothel's prostitutes.

- G. "Off-premises sale" means a sale of goods or services held by a person licensed to make such sales but which is held in Storey County at a site other than the site specified on the person's business license.
- H. "Out of county business" means a person, excluding a contractor, conducting business in Storey County without a physical address in Storey County.
- I. "Person" means a corporation, association, syndicate, partnership, club, trust, independent contractor or natural person but does not include employees of businesses licensed under this chapter unless an employee is an owner of the business.
- J. "Professional" means one whose practice of a profession requires advanced education and a license from a state licensing agency, board, commission or court.
- K. "Nonprofit organization" means all institutions, corporations, organizations or associations that are for charitable, eleemosynary or civic purposes and whose donations or receipts are not used for the private gain of any person.
- L. "Employee" shall have the meaning in NRS <u>364.040</u>.
- M. "Special events" are those controlled by Chapter 8.28.
- N. Cabaret is live entertainment. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.140 Business license required.

- A. It is unlawful for any person to engage in or earry on any trade profession, calling or business in whole or in part within the county of Storey, or to advertise that person is conducting or carrying on any business specified herein, without first applying for, obtaining and maintaining a license as set forth in this chapter.
- B. Violation of this section shall be punishable as a misdemeanor for each day of the violation. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.150 Exemptions from licenses.

No A license is *not* required for:

- A. Ttwo or fewer garage sales in any calendar year so long as the each garage sales does not exceed three days in duration.
- *B. Providing childcare in a private residence for 6 or fewer children.* (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.160 Branch establishments.

A separate *business* license is required *f*or each branch of an establishment or location of a business. A business consisting of multiple buildings adjacent to each other is considered one location if under one business name and management. Each license authorizes the licensee to transact and carry on all business listed at the location in the manner designated on such *the* license; provided, that warehouses, distributing plants, maintenance facilities or commercial rentals used in connection with and incidental to a business licensed under the provisions of this chapter *are* shall not be deemed to be separate places of business or branch establishments; and provided further, that wWarehouses and distributing plants engaged in retail or wholesale sales are shall be deemed separate businesses and shall require separate licenses as provided in this

ehapter. A residential rental business having rentals at different locations need only have one license listing all rental locations. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.170 Agents responsible for obtaining license.

The agents or other representatives of nonresidents who are doing business in Storey County shall be are personally responsible for their principal's compliance with this chapter which includes the procurement of business licenses and payment of fees. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.180 Off-premises sales.

A person must obtain permission from the *administrator's* sheriff's office to conduct an off-premises sale. No pPermission may *not* be given to conduct more than three off-premises sales for a maximum of five days each calendar year. Off-premises sale must meet all other applicable state, or county, the town of Virginia City and the town of Gold Hill requirements. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.190 Increase or decrease of fFees set by resolution.

All fees established hereinafter in this chapter may be set or amended established, increased or decreased from time to time by resolution of the board of county commissioners. (Ord. 196, 2005)

5.04.200 Fees and exemptions from fees.

- A. Except for *documented* nonprofit organizations, upon application for a new business license, the applicant shall *must* pay a nonrefundable twenty five dollar application fee to cover the costs of the review and processing of the application.
- B. Every person, firm, association, or corporation required by this chapter to take out and pay for a license, shall *must* take out and pay for a license for each of the kinds of businesses enumerated in this *chapter* article, and for each separate class of business or trade enumerated herein, and for each place where a such business is carried on.
- C. Unless otherwise provided in a fee resolution, the following periodic fees are imposed on the following kinds of business licenses:

- E. Unless otherwise provided *in a fee resolution*, the following fees for entertainment are imposed on the following kinds of business licenses and are exempt from any other fee schedules or the business licenses specified in this chapter.
- 1. Brothels and houses of ill fame shall be established pursuant to Storey County Code Chapter 5.16.
- 2. Cabarets or other places of live entertainment on the premises one hundred fifty dollars per year.
- 3. Fortunetellers, astrologer, clairvoyant, medium, palmist, phrenologist, or others who profess to foresee the future, seven *one* hundred dollars per year; fortunetelling licenses *may* shall be approved at the sole discretion of the board of county commissioners. Any employee in an establishment licensed under this section *is* shall be subject to work permit requirements. as provided in Storey County Code Section 5.08.020(G). (Ord. 203 (part), 2006; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002; Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.210 Liquor establishment license fees and regulations.

- A. The county liquor board imposes the following controls, licenses and fees.
 - 1. These fees shall be in addition to any other fees in this article and in Title 5
- 2. Fees:
 a. Off-sale: \$100.00 per year
- b. On sale: On-sale saloon license, which includes the right to sell beer, wine and liquor off-sale, five hundred dollars per year. An additional fee of fifty dollars shall be charged for a bar as defined in Section 5.12.100
- B. No liquor shall be dispensed or sold in any place where, in the judgment of the liquor board, such distribution or sale creates a public nuisance.
- C. No liquor shall be dispensed or sold to minors, and minors shall not be allowed to loiter in or about a saloon unless accompanied by their parents, or unless they are in a bona fide food service area.
- D. The liquor board, at any time may impose a moratorium on liquor licenses for good cause shown within the city of Virginia City. Such moratorium shall not affect applications pending at the time it is imposed. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.220 Square footage fees.

A. Unless otherwise provided for in a fee resolution the following additional fees shall must be assessed annually based on the total square footage of each business within the county:

B. The fees imposed by this section do not apply to special events, home *enterprises* occupation businesses, independent contractors and out-of-county contractors. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.230 Fees for employees.

A. Unless otherwise provided for in a fee resolution the following additional fees shall must be assessed annually based on the average number of full time equivalent employees who may reasonably be anticipated to be employed, within the county, during the peak employment or production of the license period including the proprietor:

B. For contractors the fees imposed pursuant to this section shall include only those *employees* who support the contracting business and does not include seasonal construction *employees*.

C. The fees imposed by this section do not apply to contract office businesses, home *enterprises* occupation businesses, independent contractors, special events and out-of-county businesses. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.240 Members of professional partnerships to be licensed individually.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, eEach member of a professional partnership practicing in Storey County shall-must be licensed as ian individual in accordance with the provisions of this chapter. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.250 Applicant required to submit affidavit or attestation concerning industrial insurance.

- A. The board may not issue a business license unless the applicant for the license:
 - 1. Signs an affidavit affirming that the business:
- a. Has received coverage by a private carrier as required pursuant to chapters 616A to 616D, inclusive, and chapter 617 of NRS.
- b. Maintains a valid certificate of self-insurance pursuant to chapters 616A to 616D, inclusive, of NRS.
 - c. Is a member of an association of self-insured public or private employers.
- d. Is not subject to the provisions of chapters 616A to 616D, inclusive, or chapter 617 of NRS.
 - 2. Or, if the applicant submits his or her application electronically, attests to his or her

compliance with the provisions of paragraph (a).

B. The administrator must submit monthly a list of the names of those businesses that have submitted an affidavit or attestation required by subsections 1 and 2 to the administrator of the Division of Industrial Relations of the Department of Business and Industry.

C. Upon receiving an affidavit or attestation required by this section, the administrator must provide the owner of the business with a document setting forth the rights and responsibilities of employers and employees to promote safety in the workplace, in accordance with regulations adopted by the Division of Industrial Relations of the Department of Business and Industry pursuant to NRS 618.376.

5.04.260 Application for or renewal of license: Statement regarding obligation of child support required, grounds for denial.

- A. An applicant for the issuance or renewal of a business license must submit to the board the statement prescribed by the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human Services pursuant to NRS 425.520. The statement must be completed and signed by the applicant.
 - B. The board must include the statement required pursuant to subsection 1 in:
- 1. The application or any other forms that must be submitted for the issuance or renewal of the license; or
 - 2. On a separate form prescribed by the board.
 - C. A license may not be issued or renewed by a board if the applicant:
 - 1. Fails to submit the statement required pursuant to subsection 1; or
- 2. Indicates on the statement submitted pursuant to subsection 1 that the applicant is subject to a court order for the support of a child and is not in compliance with the order or a plan approved by the district attorney or other public agency enforcing the order for the repayment of the amount owed pursuant to the order.
- D. If an applicant indicates on the statement submitted pursuant to subsection 1 that the applicant is subject to a court order for the support of a child and is not in compliance with the order or a plan approved by the district attorney or other public agency enforcing the order for the repayment of the amount owed pursuant to the order, the board must advise the applicant to contact the district attorney or other public agency enforcing the order to determine the actions that the applicant may take to satisfy the arrearage.

5.04.262 Mandatory suspension of license.

- A. If the board or administrator receives a copy of a court order issued pursuant to NRS 425.540 that provides for the suspension of all professional, occupational and recreational licenses, certificates and permits issued to a person who is the holder of a license, certificate or permit to practice a profession or occupation in that county, the board or administrator must deem the license, certificate or permit issued to that person to be suspended at the end of the 30th day after the date on which the court order was issued unless the board or administrator receives a letter issued to the holder of the license, certificate or permit by the district attorney or other public agency pursuant to NRS 425.550 stating that the holder of the license, certificate or permit has complied with the subpoena or warrant or has satisfied the arrearage pursuant to NRS 425.560.
- B. The board or administrator must reinstate a license, certificate or permit to practice a profession or occupation in that county that has been suspended by a district court pursuant to

NRS 425.540 if the board or administrator receives a letter issued by the district attorney or other public agency pursuant to NRS 425.550 to the person whose license, certificate or permit was suspended stating that the person whose license, certificate or permit was suspended has complied with the subpoena or warrant or has satisfied the arrearage pursuant to NRS 425.560.

5.04.265 Social security number required for application.

An application for the issuance of a license, permit or certificate to practice a profession or occupation pursuant to must include the social security number of the applicant.

5.04.25070 Additional license required authorizing pawnbrokers to accept motor vehicles as pledged property.

A. If a pawnbroker accepts motor vehicles a pledged property or in any other manner allows the use of a motor vehicle as collateral for a loan, an additional license is required as required by NRS 244.348.

B. An additional license authorizing a pawnbroker to accept motor vehicles as pledged property shall may be issued approved by the board using the approval procedure in chapter 5.12, after report from the administrator and an investigation by the sheriff and upon payment of five one hundred dollars. The obligation for the payment of fees for the additional license is a state law requirement. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.26075 Reasonable classification.

The sheriff and administrator shall may classify businesses not specifically defined into the class which most reasonable corresponds to the operation of the applicant or business. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.27080 False alarm service charge.

The time and effort for the sheriff and deputies emergency responders through dispatch to respond to false alarms detracts from other duties. The administrator sheriff, at his discretion, shall may set fees which are presented to the commissioners to may be adopted by resolution of the board by the commissioners for false alarm charges, except that one through four false alarm calls per year shall must be handled at no charge. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.280 Modifications.

- A. If any person claims that an inequitable or unjust license fee has been levied hereunder, he may appeal the matter within ten days to the board of commissioners. The board shall forthwith set the matter for hearing at a regularly scheduled meeting and shall cause notice of the time a place be given to the applicant, which time shall not be less than five days prior to the date of such hearing.
- B. A modification or adjustment hereof may be made by the board, with or without amendment to this chapter or any section thereof, as the board may deem fit. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999

5.04.290 Annual payment prorated fee--Penalty for failure to pay-Display of license.

A. All fees for business licenses, except as otherwise provided in this chapter, shall must be paid yearly in advance. ; and all persons having taken out a business license under this chapter are required to exhibit the same in some conspicuous part of their places of business, and in case.

- B. If any person, firm, association or corporation fails to take out a license for a business for the current year as provided in this chapter, prior to the fifth day of July, he, she, they or it shall be that person is subject and liable to pay an additional penalty of ten percent over and above the amount of any fees due prescribed in this chapter for a such license.; and if any person, firm, association or corporation fails to take out a license for the current year, as provided in this chapter, prior to the fifteenth day of July, his, her, their or its license may shall, upon written notice by the administrator applicable licensing agency, be revoked.
- B C. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, During the first year in which a person, firm, association or corporation applies for a license after October 1st and before January 1st, or first applyies after January 1st, and before April 1st, the first year fees will be prorated by the administrator for the remaining quarters and shall must be paid in advance by the licensee.
- CD. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, I If a person, firm, association, or corporation first applies for a license after April 1st, and before July 1st, the first year fees will be prorated by the administrator for the remaining quarter; however, the licensee must pay a full year and one-quarter license fee shall be paid in advance. The year and one-quarter license will shall expire on July 1st of the following calendar year. Nothing in subsections A, B or C of this section permits seasonal licenses.

E. Fees for business licenses may not be refunded. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.300 Recovery of fees by civil suit.

It is the duty of the district attorney when requested to do so by the sheriff or administrator or the board, to institute civil suits on behalf of the town of Virginia City, the town of Gold Hill, or Storey County, before a court of competent jurisdiction for the recovery of the amount of license fee due from any person, firm, association or corporation who is liable to pay a license tax under the provisions of this chapter, and who refuses, fails or neglects to do so.—and a A civil suit so commenced shall not be deemed a waiver of a does not waive the right of the county to prosecute the party so neglecting, failing or refusing to pay a license fee or obtain a license as provided in this chapter. 5.04.310 Application for a special events.

Short term permits must be made in writing on a form provided by the Storey County sheriff at least fifteen working days prior to the date of the special event. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.04.320 Other required licenses and permits.

A person conducting or planning to conduct a business for which a federal or state, license or permit is required, shall must produce a copy of the license or permit or exhibit the same or affirm to the sheriff or administrator that the state or federal license has or will be issued and has complied with applicable state or federal laws and regulation affecting the business before any Storey County business license shall may be issued. (Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999; Ord. 179 § 1(part), 2002)

5.04.330 Public utilities.

A. Telecommunications Service.

1. Every business entity providing telecommunications service within Storey County must obtain and pay for an annual business license. The fee for such license is payable not later than thirty calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter and shall be is two percent of the

total gross receipts for the quarter of the fiscal year commencing after the effective date of the ordinance codified in this section.

- 2. "Total gross receipts" means:
- a. All revenue received by a public utility from customers located within the boundaries of Storey County for all intrastate telecommunications services.
- b. In the case of a public utility that provides "commercial mobile radio service" as defined in Part 20 of Title 47 of the Code of Federal Regulations, revenue received from the first fifteen dollars charged monthly for each line of access for each of its customers located within the county.
- 3. "Public utility" means a person or local government that provides a telecommunication service, if the person or local government holds a certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by the public service commission of Nevada and derives intrastate revenue from the provision of that service to retail customers.
- 4. A license fee not received or postmarked within thirty calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter shall be is delinquent and the licensee shall must pay, in addition to the license fee, a penalty of one percent of the delinquent amount per month and interest of one percent of the delinquent amount per month.
- 5. Each telecommunications provider which derives or intends to derive intrastate revenue from customers located within the county shall must, not later than sixty calendar days after the effective date of the ordinance codified in this section or thirty calendar days before the company begins to provide intrastate telecommunications service to those customers, whichever occurs later, provide to the county.
- a. An acknowledgment that the company is operating or intends to operate within the county; and
- b. The date that the company began or intends to begin to derive revenue from customers located within the county.
- 6. Each company that is subject to this section shall, not later than thirty calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter, provide to the county a statement of the amount of revenue the telecommunications company derived during that calendar quarter from the sale of all intrastate telecommunication services to each of its customers located within the county.

B. Natural Gas Service

- 1. Every business entity providing natural gas service within Storey County must obtain and pay for an annual business license. The fee for such license is payable not later than thirty calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter and shall be is one percent of the total gross receipts commencing on the date of service after effective date of the ordinance codified in this section.
- 2. "Total gross receipts" means revenue received from customers located within the boundaries of Storey County for natural gas service. Revenue includes proceeds from the sale of natural gas to retail customers located within Storey County but does not include any proceeds from the sale of natural gas to a provider of electric energy which holds a certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by the public service commission of Nevada.
- 3. A license fee not received or postmarked within thirty calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter shall be is delinquent and the licensee shall must pay, in addition to the license fee, a penalty of one percent of the delinquent fee amount per month and interest on one percent of the delinquent amount per month.
 - 4. Each natural gas provider which derives or intends to derive revenue from customers

located within the county shall must, not later than sixty calendar days after the effective date of the ordinance codified in this section or thirty calendar days before the company begins to provide natural gas service to those customers, whichever occurs later, provide to the county:

a. An acknowledgment that the company is operating or intends to operate within the county; and

b. The date that the company began or intends to begin to derive revenue from customers located within the county.

- 5. Each company that is subject to this section shall must, not later than thirty calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter, provide to the county a statement of the amount of revenue the natural gas company derived during that calendar quarter from the sale of natural gas services to all customers located within the county.
- 6. This section does not alter the terms of any existing franchise agreement between the county and any company providing natural gas services within the boundaries of the county.

C. Electric Service.

- 1. Every business entity providing electric service within the boundaries of Storey County must obtain and pay for an annual business license. The fee for such license is payable not later than thirty calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter and shall be is one percent of the total gross receipts commencing on the date of service after effective date of the ordinance codified in this section.
- 2. "Total gross receipts" means revenue received from customers located within the boundaries of Storey County for electric services.
- 3. A license fee not received or postmarked within thirty calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter shall be delinquent and the licensee shall must pay, in addition to the license fee, a penalty of one percent of the delinquent fee amount per month and interest of one percent of the delinquent fee amount per month.
- 4. Each electric energy provider which derives or intends to derive revenue from customers located within the county-shall *must*, not later than sixty calendar days after the effective date of the ordinance codified in this section or thirty calendar days before the company begins to provide electric energy service to those customers whichever occurs later, proved to the county:
- a. An acknowledgment that the company is operating or intends to operate within the county; and
- b. The date that the company began or intends to begin to derive revenue from customers located within the county.
- 5. Each company that is subject to this section-shall *must*, not later than thirty calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter, provide to the county a statement of the amount of revenue the electric energy company derived during that calendar quarter from the sale of electric energy services to all customers located within the county.
- 6. This section does not alter the terms of any existing franchise agreement between the county and any company providing electric energy services within the boundaries of Storey County. (Ord. 161A § 2, 2000)

5.04.340 Criminal Penalty

A violation of any provision of this chapter is a misdemeanor. (Ord. No. 13-249, § I, 10-1-2013; Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.12.005 License required.

The board of county commissioners finds that in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of Storey County, it is necessary to license and control those persons

or businesses that are engaged in the making of, distribution or sale of alcoholic beverages. An applicant for this privileged license does not have any right to a license. Any license issued pursuant to the provisions of this title is a revocable privilege, and a holder does not acquire any vested right in any license. The liquor board determines that alcoholic beverages may not be dispensed or sold in any place where, in the judgment of the liquor board, the distribution or sale creates or may create a public nuisance.

The board of county commissioners further determines that the liquor ordinances adopted by the liquor board may be adopted by the board of county commissioners and be set forth in the Storey County code and utilize the code's numbering system.

(Ord. 83 § 6, 1983)

5.12.006 Definitions.

Unless the context requires otherwise, the following words have the following meanings:

- A. Alcoholic beverages or liquor include alcohol, spirits, wine and beer, and every liquid or solid containing alcohol and are intended for human consumption.
- B. Bar means any bar, cocktail lounge, club or tavern, with or without live or recorded entertainment, and with or without dancing.
- B. The **liquor board** consists of the members of the board of county commissioners and the sheriff.

5.12.008 - Meetings of liquor board.

- A. The liquor board must meet as often as its business requires during or immediately following a meeting of the board of supervisors.
 - B. Three or more members of the board constitute a quorum and each member has one vote.
- C. A majority vote of the members present is necessary to authorize the issuance of any license or to transact any other business.
 - D. In the event of a tie vote, the matter being voted upon is not approved.
 - E. All members of the board serve without additional compensation.
 - F. The board must elect a chairman from among its members.
 - G. The clerk treasurer serves as the clerk of the board.

5.12.010 Application form and aAccompanying data.

In addition to holding a business license issued pursuant to chapter 5.04, aAll new applicants for a liquor license, authorizing the sale of all alcoholic beverages, on or off the premises, within the county, shall must provide a completed application, on forms approved by the liquor board, and a current picture to the administrator for the county liquor license board with the following, including but not limited to:

- A. Proof of financial standing to warrant an expected satisfactory and profitable business operation;
 - B. A complete background as to the applicant's criminal record. and
 - C. The applicant's experience in the saloon or liquor vending business;.
 - D. A credit report from a national agency that is dated within sixty days of the application.
 - E. A complete list of licenses applied for and information for each license.
- \in E. A one thousand dollar \$1000 nonrefundable investigative fee, unless otherwise specifieed in this chapter, with the annual fee as set forth in this Cchapter 5.04 of this title.
 - \bigcirc F. An authorization for the county to conduct an investigation into the applicant's criminal

history and an authorization signed by the applicant for the submission of the applicant's fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigations for a National Background check. The licensing authority shall may fingerprint the applicant or have the applicant submit a completed fingerprint Electronic Livescan request form and shall submit a complete set of the applicant's fingerprints, in accordance with the applicant's authorization, to the Central Repository for Nevada records of criminal history and to the Federal Bureau of Investigations as authorized by NRS 239B.010(1)(a). (Ord. 83 § 1, 1983) (Ord. No. 08-215, § 1, 9-2-2008)

5.12.020 Application confidentiality.

Information submitted by the applicant showing the applicant's personal information, finances, net worth, earnings or revenues that is submitted as part of an application must be treated as confidential except when:

- A. Used in the ordinary course of the administration of this chapter. This includes liquor board members and county staff that work in the application approval process.
 - B. Subject to a subpoena or other order of a court of competent jurisdiction.
- C. Released to a duly authorized agent of a governmental agency acting pursuant to the agency's authority and function.

5.12.020 Application-Form.

- A. All applications shall be on forms as provided by the county liquor board and sheriff's department, and all information of a personal nature shall be kept confidential.
 - B. Separate applications shall be provided for each type of license requested.
- C. No separate beer and wine license shall be issued, but off-sale liquor licenses may be issued as provided by ordinance. (Ord. 83 § 9, 1983)

5.12.030 Application--Investigation period.

A. Application for a new regular liquor license and any additional licenses for the business may be submitted and considered for first reading by the liquor license board following a thirty-day investigative period. The administrator must receive the report from the sheriff and comptroller before the item is put on the board's agenda. The first reading may be delayed for aAdditional investigative time may be taken by the administrator licensing authorities, if required. If the investigation is continued beyond thirty days, the administrator must notify the applicant and the liquor board in writing.

B. New applicants may not operate until all inspections are completed and licenses approved. (Ord. 83 § 3, 1983)

5.12.040 Temporary license.

The administrator or the liquor board may issue a temporary liquor license for the purpose of continuing an existing business during the period in which a liquor license application has been made, and prior to its approval or disapproval by the liquor license board. No additional fee is required.

A temporary license may be approved where there is a request for a new license for the addition of new partners or change of corporate officers or directors of licensee or where the new applicant is a member of the immediate family of a licensee who cannot continue operating the business due to death, incompetency, retirement or other similar disability of present licensee. The immediate family of a licensee includes one or more of the following: surviving spouse, son,

daughter, mother or father. (Ord. 83 § 2E, 1983)

5.12.050 Hearing on application.

- A. All licenses referred to in this chapter must be heard at two meetings of the liquor license board before being acted upon. The administrator must include in the board's agenda packet for the hearing: a copy of the application with personal information redacted, a summary of the investigation of the applicant's criminal history and a summary of the comptroller's review of the applicant's financial standing, and any documents not considered confidential submitted by the applicant with the application. The liquor board members office may review confidential information at the administrator's office or by delivery of a sealed packet that is reviewed by the member and returned to the administrator in a manner that preserves confidentiality.
- B. The liquor license board must consider the evidence presented at the hearing on the application and may approve the license if the applicant meets the requirements of this chapter, deny the application based on good cause, or continue the hearing.
- C. The liquor license board is authorized to issue temporary licenses or continue temporary licenses approved and previously given by the administrator, until final action on the license is taken.
- D. Before the liquor license board may approve a liquor license, the premises must be inspected and approved by the state health department, the fire district, and the building official or any other governmental agencies that may be required.
- E. If the liquor license board denies an application the applicant may not reapply until six months from the date of the board's denial.

5.12.055 Grounds for denial.

The grounds for denial of an application must be based on good cause, which includes but is not limited to:

- A. An application that is incomplete or that contains false, misleading or fraudulent statements.
- B. The applicant fails to satisfy any requirement imposed by this chapter or any local, state, or federal law, regulation or policy pertaining to the license.
- C. The applicant has been subject to administrative action imposing discipline or fines relating to a liquor license in any jurisdiction, or denied a license or a work card due to suitability issues.
- D. The applicant has, within five years immediately preceding the date of the application, been convicted, regardless of the jurisdiction of the conviction, of any of the following criminal offenses:
 - 1. A felony or any crime which under the laws of Nevada would be a felony.
 - 2. Any crime with theft, fraud or intent to defraud is an element.
 - 3. Sales or trafficking of a controlled substance.
 - 4. Solicitation, prostitution or pandering.
 - E. Any cause reasonably related to protecting public health, safety and welfare.

5.12.060 Liquor license fees and regulations.

Unless otherwise provided for in a fee resolution, the liquor board imposes the following fees:

- A. These fees are in addition to any other business license fees in chapter 5.04
- B. Fees:
- 1. An application investigative fee of \$1000.00, if investigative costs exceed \$1000, the applicant is responsible to pay any additional costs.
 - 2. The off-sale license fee is \$100.00 per year.
- 3. The on-sale regular license fee, which includes the right to sell beer, wine and liquor off-sale, is \$500.00 per year.
 - 3. The additional service bar fee is \$50.00 for an additional service bar.
 - 4. A special events liquor license fee is \$10.00.

(Ord. 161 § 2(part), 1999)

5.12.070 Off-sale license.

The liquor board may approve an off-sale liquor license, provided:

- A. An investigative fee is paid and the investigation shows the applicant meets the requirements of this chapter.
 - B. The applicant has a business license.
- C. The licensee is responsible to make sure off-sale alcoholic beverages are not consumed on the premises. (Ord. 83 § 2H, 1983)

5.12.080 Regular liquor license--Requirements.

- A. Each business for the sale of alcoholic beverages is required to have a regular liquor license issued by the county. Any additional licenses may be approved or denied by the board at the same time as the regular license. A regular liquor license is subject to the following requirements:
 - 1. The license is limited to one contiguous location in a building.
 - 2. Additional full service bars in the same location require additional licenses.
- 3. No investigative fee or detailed application in addition to the fee and investigation done for the regular license is required for an additional license.
- B. A regular liquor license is required before applying for an additional licenses or the application for a regular license and any other type of liquor license may be submitted at the same time, except for temporary liquor licenses or off-sale liquor licenses. (Ord. 83 § 2A, 1983)

5.12.085 Bar liquor license.

A regular liquor license may be approved where the primary purpose of the business is the operation of a bar.

5.12.090 Supplemental bar liquor license.

- A. Any regular liquor licensee or applicant may apply for a supplemental liquor license for an additional full bar to be operated in the same building. No investigation fee or detailed application in addition to the fee and investigation done for the regular license is required.
 - B. Payment of an additional annual regular license fee is required. (Ord. 83 § 2F, 1983)

5,12,100 Service bar liquor license.

In addition to a regular liquor license, a service bar liquor license may be required and issued under the following conditions:

A. The service must be for additional area, such as a dining area.

- B. The service is limited to employees for delivery to customers in the area.
- C. No sit-down or additional service for customers is allowed at a service bar.
- D. The service bar must be in the same premises as the regular liquor license.
- E. Payment of additional annual service bar license fee. (Ord. 83 § 2B, 1983)

5.12.105 Cabaret license.

It is unlawful for any person to permit any singing, dancing, floor show or entertainment to be conducted or carried on in any establishment where alcoholic beverages are sold without first obtaining a cabaret license.

5.12.110 Restaurant liquor license.

A regular liquor license may be approved where the primary purpose of the business is the operation of a restaurant, supper club or dinner house. (Ord. 83 § 2G, 1983)

5.12.040120 Transferability of license.

Liquor licenses are not transferable. except as provided in Article II of this chapter. (Ord. 83 § 5, 1983)

5.12.050 130 Abandonment of license.

- A. A liquor licensee shall be is deemed to have abandoned his liquor license if he fails to have his establishment open for business for a continuous period of six months during any one fiscal year.
- B. Abandonment shall will not occur until notice and hearing by the liquor *license* board, and the licensee has the opportunity to be heard.
- C. No A license shall will not be deemed abandoned if the closure was beyond the control of the licensee.
- D. No A new license shall may not be issued when the licensee abandons his liquor license until a period of one year from the date the liquor board declares the license abandoned. (Ord. 83 § 4, 1983)

5.12.060 Location of establishments limited.

Issuance of regular full licenses shall be limited to C Street in Virginia City, and Gold Hill's Main Street, in those communities, except by special application to the liquor board. (Ord. 83 § 6, 1983)

5.12.070 140 Hours of sale.

Liquor may be sold by a A licensee may sell alcoholic beverages twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. (Ord. 83 § 7, 1983)

5.12.080 150 Minors--Employment and service prohibitions.

The employment of or service to persons under the age of twenty one years, in the sale and disposition of alcoholic beverages is prohibited.

- A. Alcoholic beverages may not be served, dispensed or sold to persons under the age of twenty-one years, and persons under the age of twenty-one years are not allowed to loiter in or about a saloon unless accompanied by their parents, or unless they are in a food-service area.
 - B. A person who has attained the age of 16 years and has not attained the age of 18 years

may be employed in a retail food store for the sale or disposition of liquor if:

- 1. He or she is supervised by a person who is 18 years of age or over and who is an owner or an employee of the business that sells or disposes of the liquor.
- 2. The person 18 years of age or over who is supervising the person under 18 is actually present at the time that the person under 18 sells or disposes of the liquor.
- 3. The liquor is in a container or receptacle which is corked or sealed. (Ord. 83 § 8, 1983)

5.12.160 Right of inspection.

All officials involved in the license process, the administrator, and the sheriff have access to every part and portion of the establishment for which a license is issued under the provisions of this chapter at any time when the establishment is open for the transaction of business and at all other reasonable times.

5.12.090 Regular license—Conditions.

- A. Each licensee shall be required to have a regular license issued by the county, subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. Only one contiguous location in a building for each bar license;
 - 2. Bar designed for full service to individual customers and/or service bar;
- 3. Additional bars in the same location require additional licenses. No investigative fee or detailed application is required;
- B. A regular liquor license is required before any application for any other type of liquor license may be submitted, except temporary liquor licenses or off-sale liquor licenses. (Ord. 83 § 2A, 1983)

5.12.100 Service bar license.

- A service bar liquor license may be issued under the following conditions:
 - A. Regular liquor license required;
 - B. Service for additional area, such as a dining area;
 - C. Service only to employees for delivery to customers;
 - D. No sitdown and additional service at service bar;
 - E. The Service bar must be in the same premises as the regular liquor license:
 - F. Payment of additional annual license fee. (Ord. 83 § 2B, 1983)

5.12.110 Special events license.

Excluding charitable or nonprofit events, a special events liquor license may be issued subject to the following conditions:

- A. Regular liquor license required;
- B. To be issued for the purpose of a portable bar for customers and/or employee service for holidays and special occasions only, within the same building or in another location upon approval of the liquor board;
 - C. Valid for a period of three days only;
 - D. Payment of additional fee of ten dollars. (Ord. 83 § 2C, 1983)

5.12.120 Amended license.

An amended liquor license is one issued after an application is made for the purpose of

modifying and amending the person or legal entity who or which holds an existing liquor license subject to the following conditions:

- A. Findings of acceptability of new applicants;
- B. Payment of nonrefundable investigative fee of five hundred dollars per applicant;
- C. Only the following persons or entities are entitled to apply for amended liquor licenses:
 - 1. Addition of new partners or change of corporate officers or directors of licensee,
- 2. Where new applicant is a member or members of the immediate family of a licensee who cannot continue operating the business due to death, incompetency, retirement or other similar disability of present licensee;
- 3. Definition of "immediate family" of a licensee shall be one or more of the following: surviving spouse, son, daughter, mother or father,
 - 4. Transfer is not to exceed fifty percent ownership. (Ord. 83 § 2D, 1983)

5.12.130 Temporary license.

— A temporary liquor license may be issued for the purpose of continuing an existing business during the period in which a liquor license application has been made, and prior to its approval or disapproval. No additional fee shall be required. (Ord. 83 § 2E, 1983)

5.12.140 Supplemental license.

A. Any licensee may apply for a supplemental liquor license for an additional full bar to be operated in the same building in conjunction with another full bar license. No investigation fee or detailed application shall be required.

B. Payment of an additional annual regular license fee is required. (Ord. 83 § 2F, 1983)

5.12.150 Supper club or dinner house license.

A regular liquor license may be issued to an applicant where the primary purpose of the business is the operation of a supper club or dinner house upon application and payment of required fees. The determination of the nature of the business and necessity for the liquor license in conjunction therewith, shall be made after a hearing set by the county liquor board. (Ord. 83 § 2G, 1983)

5.12.160 Off-sale license.

- An off sale liquor license may be issued upon application provided:
 - A. An investigative fee is paid as required by this chapter;
 - B. An application is made and the fee required by Chapter 5.04 of this title is paid;
- C. The off sale liquor shall not be consumed on the premises of licensee. (Ord. 83 § 2H, 1983)

5.12.170 Criminal Penalty-Misdemeanor.

A violation of any provision of this chapter is a misdemeanor. (Ord. No. 13-249, § I, 10-1-2013; Ord. 83 § 11, 1983)

SECTION III: Chapter 8.28 Special Events is amended as follows:

8.28.025 Alcoholic beverages.

- A. The *administrator* county sheriff may permit the sale of alcoholic beverages in public areas in conjunction with a special event permit provided any procedures or criteria adopted by ordinance or resolution of the county board commissioners are adhered to. An application for the sale of alcoholic beverages in public areas must be filed with an application for a special event permit *on a form approved by the liquor license board* and follow all procedures therefor.
- B. A special events liquor license may be issued *by the license division* subject to the following conditions:
- 1. The applicant must hold a rRegular Storey County liquor license or have written permission from an existing regular liquor license holder required;
- 2. Tohe license may be issued for the purpose of a portable bar for customers and/or employee service for holidays and special occasions only, within the same building or in another location;
 - 3. Valid for a period of five (5) days only;
- 4. Any license fee applicable to the sale of alcoholic beverages as set forth in $c \in$ hapter 5.12.110 of this Code must be paid in addition to any special event permit fees.
- 5. *The licensee m*Must adhere to the State of Nevada laws and Storey County Codes pertaining to the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages
- C. An application for the sale of alcoholic beverages in public areas must provide the following information:
 - 1. Whether alcoholic beverages will be sold or dispensed free of charge;
 - 2. Is Whether entry to the event restricted to invited guests or open to the public;
 - 3. What types of alcoholic beverages will be sold or consumed;
 - 4. What containers will be used; it is unlawful to use glass or metal containers;
 - 5. Who will be the on-site supervisor of alcoholic beverage service;
- 6. Such other information as the *administrator* county sheriff deems appropriate. (Ord. No. 09-224, § 1, 3-16-2010)

The moratorium on such residential development will ensure that the public interest in protecting the planning process for the master plan furthers and balances with the private hardships that may result from the imposition of controls; to ensure a uniform, orderly, and managed process by which development may proceed concurrently with the master plan in a manner that complements the nature and extent of the available resources, facilities and services; and to promote and protect the health, safety and general welfare by contributing to the physical and economic well-being of the people by promoting adequate facilities and services, and protecting Storey County's economic bases, resources and character. The following types of applications may be approved while the interim development guidelines are in effect: (a) approvals of variances; (b) issuance of a building permit on an existing parcel; (c) approval of parcel maps or divisions into large parcels; and (d) approval of a special use permit other than for a planned unit development.

Summary

An ordinance extending interim development regulations affecting titles 16 and 17 of the Storey County Code by creating title 16A establishing minimum interim requirements for subdivision map approvals and title 17A limiting master plan amendments for and approvals of planned unit developments during the master plan approval process.

Title

An ordinance extending interim development regulations affecting titles 16 and 17 of the Storey County Code by creating title 16A establishing minimum interim requirements for subdivision map approvals and title 17A limiting master plan amendments for and approvals of planned unit developments during the master plan approval process, and providing for other properly related matters.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Storey, State of Nevada, does ordain:

SECTION I: Title 17 is amended to create title 17A as follows:

17A.02.020 Purpose.

It is the policy of the board of county commissioners that existing and future development in Storey County will be guided by the master plan that provides for orderly development, and the timely provision of facilities and services. This policy recognizes the need for and the public's interest in protecting the master plan process by controlling subdivision and other development application processes to ensure that the master plan may be developed, revised or amended in an orderly fashion.

The board finds and declares that Storey County would be affected by the premature

development of residential property during the master plan process.

The board further finds that a premature amendment to the master plan for a large residential development or the subdivision of property for residential use during the revision of the master plan may jeopardize the ability of the Storey County to ensure orderly development and adequate provision of services and facilities, and that certain types of development initiated before the master plan is revised may prevent the best possible development pattern and the county's ability to economically provide necessary services and facilities.

The board further finds that interim development controls and regulations, including controls on the division of lands through subdivision maps and master plan amendments are necessary to protect the planning process for the revision of the master plan.

It is the purpose of this ordinance to enact temporary development regulations and standards, which limit the approval of subdivisions or planned unit development (PUDs) and master plan amendments for subdivisions or planned unit developments, that expire on June 30,2016 August 31, 2016, or on the adoption of the master plan whichever occurs first, to ensure that the public interest in protecting the planning process for the master plan furthers and balances with the private hardships that may result from the imposition of controls; to ensure a uniform, orderly, and managed process by which development may proceed concurrently with the master plan in a manner that complements the nature and extent of the available resources, facilities and services; and to promote and protect the health, safety and general welfare by contributing to the physical and economic well-being of the people by promoting adequate facilities and services, and protecting Storey County's economic bases, resources and character.

The following types of applications may be approved while the interim development guidelines are in effect:

- A. Approvals of variances.
- B. Issuance of a building permit on an existing parcel.
- C. Approval of parcel maps or divisions into large parcels.
- D. Approval of a special use permit other than one for a planned unit development.

17A.02.030 Application.

Notwithstanding any provisions of the Storey County Code to the contrary until July 1, 2016 August 31, 2016, or the adoption of a revised master plan for Storey County, whichever occurs first, these interim guidelines apply to all of Storey County except where real property is subject to an existing development agreement (NRS 278.0201).

17A.03.080 Hearing.

Notwithstanding any provisions of the Storey County Code to the contrary until July 1, 2016 or the adoption of a revised master plan for Storey County, whichever occurs first, the board must hold a public hearing on the progress of the master plan within 6 months of the effective date of this ordinance.

17A.03.110 Amendments.

The board may amend these regulations before July 1, 2016 August 31, 2016, or the adoption of the master plan if it determines that one or more of the provisions is substantially detrimental to the welfare of the Story County during the interim period and that the amendment will not jeopardize the purpose of these regulations.

SECTION II: Title 16 is amended to create title 16A as follows:

Subdivision interim development regulations

16A.04.010 Purpose.

It is the policy of the board of county commissioners that existing and future development in Storey County will be guided by the master plan that provides for orderly development, and the timely provision of facilities and services. This policy recognizes the need for and the public's interest in protecting the master plan process by controlling subdivision and other development application processes to ensure that the master plan may be developed, revised or amended in an orderly fashion.

The board finds that a premature division of property during the revision of the master plan may jeopardize the county's ability to ensure orderly development and adequate provision of services and facilities, and that certain types of development initiated before the master plan is revised may prevent the best possible development pattern and the county's ability to economically provide necessary services and facilities.

The board further finds that interim development controls and regulations, including controls on the division of lands through subdivision maps, and controls on other development processes, are necessary to protect the planning process for the revision of the master plan.

16A.16.020 Approval process-planning commission.

Notwithstanding any provisions of the Storey County Code to the contrary until July 1, 2016 August 31, 2016, or the adoption of a revised master plan for Storey County, whichever occurs first, the planning commission may not approve a tentative map for a subdivision or PUD that involves any of the following:

- A. The project requires the expansion or construction of any sewer plant or capacity.
- B. The project results in the greater use of septic tanks or domestic wells in areas planned for sewer or a community water system or than would be permitted for land uses authorized under the existing mater plan.
- C. The project results in a reduction of service level on impacted road segments and intersections.

The approval of any tentative subdivision map or PUD by the planning commission must be accompanied by a finding the no significant impact on ground water quality or quantity will result from the proposed subdivision.

16A.16.030 Board action.

Notwithstanding any provisions of the Storey County Code to the contrary until July 1, 2016 August 31, 2016, or the adoption of a revised master plan for Storey County, whichever occurs first, the board may not approve a tentative map for a subdivision that involves any of the following:

- A. The project requires the expansion or construction of any sewer plant or capacity.
- B. The project results in the greater use of septic tanks or domestic wells in areas planned for sewer or a community water system or than would be permitted for land uses authorized under the existing mater plan.
- C. The project results in a reduction of service level on impacted road segments and intersections.



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1. Background & Analysis

1.1 Site location and characteristics




Figure 1: Area Map with parcels and zoning

The property is located at 790 South A Street, in the Virginia City. The parcel is approximately 22,869 Square Feet (.525 acres), and is improved with an about 2,140 square foot single family residence and almost 700 sqft garage. The area properties are mostly zoned CR. (Figure 1 - Area Map). The Applicant's property is located in the Divide, between Virginia City and Gold Hill.

Access to the property is from C Street (SR 342), then on South Street, then up either A or B Street to their private driveway. B Street is at the eastern side of the subject property and A Street is on the West.

1.2 Proposed Use

The Applicant proposes to operate a high end automobile restoration business from his property. The work will include body, engine, transmission, suspension, electrical, interior, or anything else needed. The vehicles are expected to be almost entirely disassembled and reassembled on site. There are no needed site improvements other than to meet the public safety requirements. These restorations are expected to be extremely fine in quality and of value to an exclusive customer.

The onsite work is expected to be performed inside, with all storage inside an existing detached garage. The garage is about 40 feet from the house and 150 feet to the MX Trophies/Divide Fitness building which is the nearest off site building. The work is not expected to cause any offsite noise, fumes, or vapors. The business is expected to be marketed through word of mouth, clubs, and other online activities. Additional traffic associated with this business should be minimal.

1.3 Special Use Permit Required

The purpose and intent of the CR commercial-residential zone are established to provide for the development of mixed use commercial and residential uses and to prohibit the development of uses that are incompatible and detrimental to the commercial/residential blended environment. SCC 17.30.30.B states that automobile services including service are permitted in the CR zone subject to a special use permit.

1.4 Surrounding Uses

The property to the east contains Divide Fitness and MX Trophies light manufacturing businesses, one

to the southeast is Nevada Bell, and the other adjacent properties are vacant including BLM to the west.

1.5 Area Impacts

SCC 17.30.030 Reads, "Unless stated otherwise, the following uses may be permitted subject to securing a special use permit as provided for in chapter 17.03 Administrative provisions: "Paragraph E in section 30 reads, "Automotive services including service and fueling stations, repair, sales, and rentals." The intended use is within the intent of the identified zoning.

With the expected use, the potential impacts include noise, odor, dust, smoke/fire, or excessive vehicular traffic. The business will be conducted inside the garage and should not present




Figure 2: South Street from C Street

excessive impacts to the area. Furthermore, there are no residential properties in the area. This limits any potential conflicts even further. Each of the following sections addresses a potential impact and offers mitigation measures for the public safety.

- 1. Noise. Sound emissions generated from automobile restoration, impact wrenches, and paint facilities typically originate from high-pressure pneumatic compressors. Despite the applicant's claim that noise generation is minimal, operations and equipment will be required to remain within the enclosed shop building. Emanating sounds exceeding 45 decibels (A-weighted) at the parcel boundary will need to be abated.
- 2. Airborne Containments. Automobile body work including coatings is covered by the EPA under regulation 40 CFR part 65 and enforced by the Nevada Department of Environmental Protection (NDEP). This regulation regulates maximum VOCs or CFCs. Automobile painting activities must be performed in a certified paint spray booth. Fugitive airborne containments regulated by 40 CFR part 63 must be within NDEP guidelines at all times.
- 3. Fire Suppression. Despite the non-flammable nature of the activities used on-site, the following items and activities are required:
 - a. Install a commercial KNOX Box
 - b. Install address letters 12 inches minimum
 - c. Provide secondary containment for all flammable fluids greater than 45 gallons
 - d. Provide a fire cabinet for all aerosol
 - e. Painting must be contained in a sprinkled paint booth with proper ventilation (IFC section 914.9)
 - f. A, B, and C rated fire extinguishers

4. Traffic. The facility and its owner-operator (no employees) have the capacity to accommodate one vehicle or customer item at a time. For vehicle storage and customer return visits, only one is allowed

at a time. Vehicle storage must be enclosed. Excessive vehicle traffic or heavy loads might degrade public streets. Applicant assumes responsibility for maintaining South Street, A and B Streets in areas where excessive traffic or heavy loads degrade these streets.

It appears that the proposed automobile restoration business will impose no adverse impacts on the surrounding lands when the above items are addressed.




Figure 3: View of the buildings from A Street

2. General Compliance with Storey County's Guiding Documents

2.2 Compliance with Storey County Master Plan

On page 5 of the Master Plan, Goal 1 under Economy, Goals and Objectives: "Enhance diversification of economic opportunities within the county."

This special use permit appears to add to the diversity of Virginia City and the business appears to add to the local economy.

3. Compliance with the Storey County Code

3.1 Uses Subject to Special Use Permit

SCC 17.30.030

"Unless stated otherwise, the following uses may be permitted subject to securing a special use permit

as provided for in chapter 17.03 Administrative provisions:

E Automotive services including service and fueling stations, repair, sales, and rentals." The intended use is within the intent of the identified zoning."

This passage of the SCC allows for the applicant's potential special use permit.

3.2 Stated when to allow a special use permit

SCC 17.12.018

"Uses listed as requiring a special use permit are considered as special exceptions within each zone. Any special permitted use must meet with the regulations for special use permits and any conditions imposed by the board. In addition to the special use permit, all necessary federal, state, and county permits and licenses are required."

The applicant is in compliance with this section of the code. This passage of the SCC illustrates when to allow a special use permit and this situation is in compliance.

3.3 Sign sizes

Any signs used on the property are expected to be compliant with SCC 17.84 Signs and Billboards.

3.4 No Other Non-compliance Problems

All other aspects of the business are expected to be within the county code.

4. Public Comment

4.1 Public Comment

As of June 13, 2016 (date of posting) Staff has not received any comments from the public.

5. Findings

5.1 Motion for Approval

The following findings of fact are evident with regard to the requested Special Use Permit when the recommended conditions of approval in Section 6 Recommended Conditions of Approval are applied:

- 5.1.1 The Special Use Permit complies with all federal, state, and county regulations.
- 5.1.2 The Special Use Permit will not impose substantial adverse impacts or safety hazards on the adjacent properties or the surrounding area.
- 5.1.3 The conditions of the Special Use Permit adequately address potential fire hazards and require compliance with the applicable fire codes, including fire protection ratings.
- 5.1.4 Use will not adversely affect the existing South Street, B or A Street, and if the use does impact the road, the applicant will maintain effected streets to conditions as of SUP approval.
- 5.1.5 Any paint and/or body work will be mitigated appropriately to maintain public health and safety.

5.1.6 The conditions under this The Special Use Permit do not conflict with the minimum requirements in SCC Chapter 17.12 General Provisions, Chapter 17.30 CR Commercial Residential Zone and Chapter 17.03.150 Special Use Permits, or any other federal, state, or county regulations, including building and fire codes.

5.2 Motion for Denial

Should a motion be made to deny the Special Use Permit request, the following findings with explanation of why should be included in that motion.

- 5.2.1 Substantial evidence shows that the Special Use Permit may conflict with the purpose, intent, and other specific requirement of SCC 17.12 General Provisions, Chapter 17.30 CR Commercial Residential Zone and Chapter 17.03.150 Special Use Permit or other federal, state, or county regulations.
- 5.2.2 The conditions under the Special Use Permit do not adequately mitigate potential adverse impacts on surrounding uses or protect against potential safety hazards for surrounding uses.

6. Recommended Conditions of Approval

All conditions must be met to the satisfaction of each applicable County Department, unless otherwise stated.

- 1. Compliance. This Special Use Permit (SUP) No. 2016-008 shall be for the purpose of an automobile restoration business to be performed at 790 South A Street, Virginia City, Storey County, Nevada (APN: 001-041-12). The business activities will include automobile chassis, mechanical, electronical, body, interior and paint restoration including complete disassembly and reassembly of engine, transmission, suspension, etc. work. The operation shall remain in compliance with all of the provisions set forth by this SUP and federal, Nevada State, and Storey County codes and regulations. Issuance of this SUP does not convey property rights of any sort or any exclusive privilege, nor does it authorize any injury to persons or property, any invasion of other private rights, or any infringement of state or local laws or regulations.
- 2. **Requirements**. The Permit Holder shall apply for all required permits and licenses, including business license, for the project within twelve (12) months from the date of final approval of SUP No. 2016-008, and continuously maintain the validity of those permits/licenses, or this approval shall be null and void. This SUP shall remain valid as long as the Permit Holder remains in compliance with the terms of this SUP and Storey County, Nevada State, and federal regulations.
- 3. **Transfer of Rights.** This SUP shall inure to the record owner of the Subject Property and to the Permit Applicant(s) (Kevin and Ambre Chevalier) and shall run with the land defined herein. This SUP permit, subject to its terms and conditions, may be transferred by the permit holder, its successors, heirs or assigns. The record owner may lease the land; however, the record owner is ultimately responsible for compliance with the SUP permit regulations. Any/all transfers of SUP 20016-008 shall be advised in writing to Storey County Planning Department 90 days prior to assignee taking over operation of facility. The operators of the facility must sign and accept all stipulations and requirements of SUP 2016-008.
- 4. Fire Suppression/Materials Management. The premises shall contain a KNOX Box, address lettering 12 inches high minimum, secondary containment for all flammable fluids greater than 45 gallons, a fire cabinet for all aerosol, painting must be contained in a sprinkled paint booth with proper ventilation per IFC section 914.9, and A, B, and C rated fire extinguishers as directed by the

Storey County Fire Department. Storage of paints, chemicals, solvents, and other hazardous materials shall comply with Storey County Fire District requirements and the applicable Nevada Revised Statutes.

- 5. **Traffic.** For customer visits, only one is allowed at a time. Additional business related traffic shall be negligible. Applicant assumes responsibility for maintaining South Street, A and B Streets in areas where excessive traffic or heavy loads degrade these streets to a standard equal to the condition when this SUP is approved.
- 6. **Noise.** Noise at the property line shall be limited to 84 decibels (A-weighted, SCC 8.04.020) and shall be subject to further reasonable limitations as determined by Storey County.
- 7. **Airborne Containments.** All work performed subject to this SUP, will be compliant with all NDEP air quality standards. Automobile painting activities must be performed in a certified paint spray booth. Fugitive airborne containments must be within NDEP guidelines at all times.
- 8. **Operation.** The applicant will operate the business primarily inside of a structure. It will not generate excessive odor, dust, smoke, or other disturbances.
- 9. **Health, Safety and Welfare**. The applicant will not adversely affect the health, safety or general welfare of the citizens of the county.
- 10. **Storage.** The applicant will store all vehicles, parts, and other items related to the business inside an entirely enclosed building. Except, one vehicle may be temporarily stored in enclosed open storage or in an open sided garage.
- 11. **Taxes paid.** Before obtaining a business license, the Applicant must show the Community Development Department evidence that all property taxes on the land are paid to-date.
- 12. **Indemnification**. The Applicant warrants that the future use of land will conform to requirements of Storey County, State of Nevada, and applicable federal regulatory and legal requirements; further, the Applicant warrants that continued and future use of the land shall so conform. The Applicant and property owner(s) agree to hold Storey County, its officers, and representatives harmless from the costs and responsibilities associated with any damage or liability, and any/all other claims now existing or which may occur as a result of this Special Use Permit.

7. Power of the Board & Planning Commission

At the conclusion of the hearing, the Board of County Commissioners must take such action thereon as it deems warranted under the circumstances and announce and record its action by formal resolution, and such resolution must recite the findings of the Board of County Commissioners upon which it bases its decision. The decision of the Planning Commission in the matter of granting the Special Use Permit was advisory only to the Board of County Commissioners and that governing body must consider the report and recommendation and must make such a decision thereon as it deems warranted.

8. Proposed Motions

This Section contains three motions from which to choose. The first motion for approval allows full restoration including body work and is recommended by Staff and the Planning Commission in

accordance with the findings under Section 5.1 of this report. Those findings should be made part of that motion. The second potential motion only allows restoration without body work and should be made in accordance with applicable findings in Section 5.1 of this report. The last motion for denial may be made and that motion should cite one or more of the findings shown in Section 5.2. Other findings of fact determined appropriate by the Board of County Commissioners should be made part of any motion.

8.1 Recommended Motion (Motion for approval)

In accordance with the recommendation by Planning Commission and Staff, the Findings under Section 5.1 of the Staff Report and other Findings deemed appropriate by the Board of County Commissioners, and in compliance with the conditions of approval in Section 6 of this report, I [County Commissioner] hereby recommend conditional approval of Special Use Permit Application Number 2016-008 for the operation of the automobile restoration business, including local body and paint work, located at 790 South A Street, Virginia City, Storey County, Nevada (APN: 001-041-12).

Summary: Approval of special use permit with conditions and local body work

8.2 Alternative Motion (Motion for approval of automobile restoration without local body work)

In accordance with the recommendation by Staff, the Findings under Section 5.1 of the Staff Report and other Findings deemed appropriate by the Board of County Commissioners, and in compliance with the conditions of approval in Section 6 of this report, I [County Commissioner] hereby recommend conditional approval of Special Use Permit Application Number 2016-008 for the operation of the automobile restoration business, not including local body and paint work, located at 790 South A Street, Virginia City, Storey County, Nevada (APN: 001-041-12).

Summary: Approval of special use permit with conditions without local body work

8.3 Alternative Motion (motion for denial)

In accordance with the Findings under Section 5.2 of the Staff Report and other Findings deemed appropriate by the Board of County Commissioners, I [County Commissioner] hereby recommend denial of Special Use Permit Application Number 2016-008 for the operation of the automobile restoration business located at 790 South A Street, Virginia City, Storey County, Nevada (APN: 001-041-12).

9. PLANNING COMMISSION SUMMARY

The Planning Commission heard this application on June 2, 2016. The Planning staff presented the application as a Special Use Permit to operate a business for classic automobile chassis, mechanical, and body restoration in a CR Zone. The applicant was available for questions, with a few minor questions asked. The Planning Commission recommended the application for approval (including local body work) with the additional condition of only inside storage.
