- The UNR mining competition will be held March 20 thru 23. This is a new event this year all hotels are booked.
- "The Devil Made Me Do It" Saloon Crawl is set for February 9th
- The Father/Daughter Day and Dance will be held at the end of the month. Due to past large turnout, there will be two shows.

Community Services Director Cherie Nevin:

- Emergency generator project at the High School has been completed and is up and running. This will allow the school to be a site for emergency evacuations if needed.
- Senior Service Focus Groups to discuss senior services will be held as follows:
 - o February 21, 5pm to 6pm, at Lockwood Community Center
 - o March 12, 6pm to 7pm, at Highlands Fire Station
 - o March 21, 5pm to 6pm, at Mark Twain Community Center
 - o April 4, 5pm to 6pm at Virginia City Senior Center

Operations/Projects Coordinator Mike Northan:

- Public Works crew is doing a great job keeping roads clear.
- Plans and cost estimates are being drawn up for a new Director's office at Pipers Opera House.
- There is an effort to repair and replace the stairs at the Sharon House.
- A general improvement plan is being drawn up for the Fairgrounds.
- The architect is working on a digital 3D model for the new Justice Center.
- A necessary easement has been obtained for the Six Mile Drainage project this will reduce costs for that portion of the project. A meeting with the engineer is scheduled for next week.
- Original window sashes have been restored and installed at Pipers. A couple of windows had to be reproduced.

Fire Chief Jeff Nevin:

- The Fire Department responded to 175 service calls 129 EMS related, in January.
- Personnel are being trained on nine new defibrillators recently received. These replace 2006 units.
- Fuels grant continues, finishing in Bailey Canyon and moving to the Highlands. Fire personnel will be at Homeowners Association meetings to answer questions.
- Open burning continues in Mark Twain and Painted Rock. Call Virginia City Fire Station for permits.
- U Call/We Haul trailers are available to residents.

James Deane, IT Director:

- 75% of this year's capital expenditures have gone to replacing firewalls for the fiber at the courthouse and jail.
- HP Enterprise nimble storage devices have been installed. Storage is expected to last the next 5 years.
- HP switching has also been installed at the courthouse and the jail this should last 10 years.
- These purchases should significantly reduce next year's budget.
- Rapid progress is being made with wiring at the cottage and Pipers. The wiring will allow leveraging of the phone and internet system in the court house a new phone system will not be necessary for the cottage or Pipers.
- There is a lot of unseen success with the new (Tyler) Incode System. There have been no major technical problems.
- Another success is with the (Tyler) Eagle Recorder System there haven't been any technical support problems from the Recorder' Office.
- The County is well-positioned for the future using "cutting edge" technology.
- Plans are to replace the exchange (Outlook) server with Office 365 in the next budget year.

Mike Nevin, Special Projects Manager:

- Met in Gold Hill, and down to Dayton, with NDEP staff to determine any outflow to the Carson River. They are confident that it does not reach the river. Follow up meetings will be held with NDEP.
- Staff met with USDA regarding the possibility of using the \$555,000 leftover from the waterline towards the replacement and repair of the water tanks. NDEP has issued a notice regarding the condition of the tanks. Cost figures from the engineer should be available by the end of the week. USDA is in agreement as they want to see a completed project.

Sr. Building Inspector Pete Renaud:

- There were 78 inspections for the month of January.
- The cell tower in the Highlands has been completed and is up and running.

Administrative Officer/Planning Director Austin Osborne:

- The County's lobbyist group in Washington is meeting with the BLM regarding the Lands Bill which is moving forward. Language for the National Historic Preservation Act is also being worked on.
- The Dayton Valley area Master Plan studies are 80% complete. There still needs to be validation but the areas of flooding can be seen. Some substantial issues were expected modeling is showing there is a reasonable expectation for a lot of mitigation. This is good news for the Mark Twain community.
- The USGS continues the underground water study in the Highlands. An update is expected at the February or March Planning Commission.

County Manager Pat Whitten:

- The March 5th BOC meeting is cancelled due to attendance at the NACO Legislative meeting in Washington DC. Vice Chairman Gilman will attend group meetings with members of Nevada NACO. Thank you also to Vice Chairman Gilman for attending a "surprise" NACO meeting in Las Vegas.
- Thank you to the entire Public Works crew for all their work in the recent snow storms.

- Meetings have been held with Comptroller Gallagher, Deputy District Attorney Loomis, and TRI attorney Bob Sader, to determine payment sources.
- There have been discussions with the Sheriff and attorney Bob Morris about cleaning up the brothel ordinance.
- The last two items are key projects Mr. Whitten would like to get done prior to retirement.

Vice Chairman Gilman:

- The NACO conference in Las Vegas was very rewarding. He was assigned to the Legislative Committee, and will be calling in every Friday reviewing all of the bill drafts and potential impact.

Community Relations Director Cherie Nevin said this Resolution closes out substantial completion of the waterline replacement project. The (USDA) permanent loan will not be closed at this time due to the need to use remaining funds for the water tanks.

12. DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION: Approval of National Radon Action Month Proclamation

Cherie Nevin, on behalf of UNR Cooperative Extension, explained this is an annual program presented each January. Free test kits are available at Virginia City Senior Center and Lockwood Community Center until the end of February. Residents are urged to test for radon.

Ms. Nevin read the Proclamation:

WHEREAS many Storey County residents don't know about radon, yet need to know, for the safety and health of their families, as radon is a colorless, odorless, naturally occurring radioactive gas that is the primary cause of lung cancer among nonsmokers; the second leading cause of lung cancer for smokers; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. EPA estimates 21,000 people in the U.S. die each year from lung cancer caused by indoor radon exposure, and lung and bronchus cancer kill more people in a year than any other cancer; and

WHEREAS, radon kills more people than secondhand smoke, drunk driving, and home fires combined; and

WHEREAS, any home in Storey County may have elevated levels of radon, even if neighboring homes do not, and living in a home with an average level of 4 picocuries per liter of air poses a similar risk of developing lung cancer as smoking a half a pack of cigarettes a day; and WHEREAS, testing is the only way to know if a home has an elevated radon level, and testing is easy and inexpensive, and when identified, homes can be fixed; and

WHEREAS, University of Nevada Cooperative Extension, the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health, and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency support efforts to encourage all Storey County residents to test their homes for radon, mitigate elevated levels of radon, and have new homes built with radon-reducing materials and features.

NOW, THEREFORE, We, the Storey County Board of Commissioners do hereby proclaim January 2019 as "National Radon Month" in Storey County, Nevada

County Manager Whitten: The current lessees are model renters. They bring people up to B Street playing a pivotal role in adding to the number of visitors off of C Street. The rent is fair and reasonable. There are a few additions to the terms. Staff recommends renewing the lease.

14. DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION: Consideration and possible action to approve lease of Old Corner Bar to VC Ponderosa Saloon LLC for a monthly rental of \$1,800.00 per month until December 31, 2021 with a possible two year renewal.

Chairman McBride disclosed that he has a liquor establishment within proximity of this establishment – his vote on this item does not affect this business any more than on anyone else with the same licensing.

Vice Chairman Gilman made the same disclosure.

15. DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION: Possible approval of contract for professional services between Michael Workman and Storey County regarding due diligence review of TRIGID change in governance, and authorize the County Manager to sign evidencing approval.

Vice Chairman Gilman, holding a pecuniary interest in the subject matter, recused himself from discussion and vote on this item.

County Manager Whitten explained that TRIGID legal counsel has asked if (the County) would consider changing the governance structure of the GID Board of Trustees. The County is not taking over the GID. The Board of County Commissioners can sit as the governing board. There is no recommendation regarding a change in governance being made at this time. The County needs an independent person to provide information and recommendations regarding the process. Mike Workman, retired Lyon County Water Services Director, is being recommended. The GID has agreed to reimburse Mr. Workman's fee up to \$10,000.

Public Comment:

Sam Toll, Gold Hill resident: Agrees with this suggestion and is concerned with the conditions of roads and sewer pipes in that area. Mr. Toll asked about the financial relationship (liability) between the County and the GID.

Deputy District Attorney Loomis said there is no County liability for operations of the GID, a separate government agency. It is the governance that is proposed to be changed. The County is not obligated to take on the debt of the GID.

Mr. Whitten explained the GID has taxing authority and could raise taxes and/or raise rates if needed. The County is not talking about taking over the GID, only having the (County) Commissioners be the governing board.

Mr. Toll asked if Commissioner Gilman would be on that Board.

Mr. Whitten: That would have to be determined. This item is just to approve Mr. Workman's contract and his recommendations.

Nicole Barde, Storey County Resident asked for a description of the scope of work Mr. Workman would be doing.

Mr. Whitten: The main goal would be to validate the accuracy of information and recommendations from engineer Brent Farr. He would look at the capital improvement plan, previous NDEP approvals for a water system, among other things. He would be out there to validate what is being seen by others. This does not include roads which are separate. Sewers are the GID's, they have never been the County's.

Mr. Gallagher explained the County's tax rate must be submitted to the Department of Taxation during February. The rate is used for 2019-20 property tax estimates. The County's tax rate is no greater than a lot of others – there are only three counties with lower rates.

Mr. Whitten commented that the County's key financial advisors have advised against a tax rate decrease because there are governors on raising rates back up if that would become necessary. Discussions have been held with the individual Commissioners regarding what could be done for those people in need of services by utilizing tax funds where there would be the most impact.

Chairman McBride said the current tax rate has been the same since 2008. Taxes have gone up only because property values have increased.

Public Comment:

Sam Toll: Is encouraged that the tax rate is remaining the same and appreciates Mr. Whitten's comment about maximizing services for people who need it most and suggests including the Community Chest. The direct impact on the Senior Center and Community Chest is some of the best spent money in the County.

20. DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION: Review of the 2nd Quarter 2018 Unaudited Budget to Actual Review.

Comptroller Gallagher: This will be a discussion only, no action – no public comment, item as this review is unaudited.

Mr. Whitten said there should be discussion.

Mr. Gallagher presented a summary of the budget for the first six months of the fiscal year – reviewing each fund and department. Expenditures are at 43% - rather than 50%, thanks to department heads. Mr. Gallagher also reviewed the special revenue funds. He reviewed options to control overages and augmentations.

22. DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION: Special Use Permit 2018-056 is a request by the applicant to allow for construction of a 90-foot high wireless commercial communication facility, including a tower, equipment shelters and other associated equipment. The tower will be configured as a water tower to disguise the proposed antenna equipment. The tower and associated equipment will be located on an approximate 35' x 35' leased area on Storey County property. The subject property is located at 160 E. Toll Road, Virginia City, Storey County, Nevada and having Assessor's Parcel Number 002-023-11.

Planner Kathy Canfield presented this application for a commercial, wireless communication tower. A Special Use Permit is required as the height is over 45 feet in a public zoned area. AT&T will be utilizing a 35'x35' area. The equipment will be designed to look like a water tower and will be up to 90 feet high. No property owner objections were received, staff and Planning Commission recommend approval.

Mr. Loomis indicated that a licensing of the area (to AT&T) is being worked on rather than a lease of the area. The licensing agreement can be approved at a later date.

Ms. Canfield recommended modifying Condition I to indicate this change.

AT&T representative, Carl Jones, was in attendance via phone.

Mr. Whitten thanked AT&T for bringing cell coverage to this area.

Public Comment:

Sam Toll said he is encouraged this project is going through and asked how much the lease is, and would this involve the Jeep Posse. Mr. Toll encourages AT&T to bring internet services in the area into the 21st century.

Mr. Osborne: \$2,900 per month, the same as the existing Verizon lease.

Mr. Whitten: This has not been discussed with the Jeep Posse – we are not that far yet. That will most likely be decided through the budget process.

Ms. Canfield read the findings of fact:

Toll Road, Virginia City, Storey County, Nevada and having Assessor's Parcel Number 002-023-11.
- 2) The Special Use Permit conforms to the 2016 Storey County Master Plan for the Public Facilities designated area in which the subject property is located. A discussion supporting this finding for the Special Use Permit is provided in Section 2.D of this staff report and the contents thereof are cited in an approval of this Special Use Permit. The Special Use Permit complies with the general purpose, goals, objectives, and standards of the county master plan, the zoning ordinance and any other plan, program, map or ordinance adopted, or under consideration pursuant to the official notice by the county.
- 3) The proposed location, size, height, operations, and other significant features will be compatible with and will not cause substantial negative impact on adjacent land uses, or will perform a function or provide a service that is essential to the surrounding land uses, community, and neighborhood.

- 4) The Special Use Permit will result in no substantial or undue adverse effect on adjacent property, the character of the neighborhood, traffic conditions, parking, public improvements, public sites or right-of-way, or other matters affecting the public health, safety, and general welfare, either as they now exist or as they may in the future be developed as a result of the implementation of the provisions and policies of the county master plan, this title, and any other plans, program, map or ordinance adopted or under consideration pursuant to an official notice, by the county, or other governmental agency having jurisdiction to guide growth and development.
- 5) The proposed use in the proposed area will be adequately served by and will impose no undue burden on any of the improvements, facilities, utilities, or services provided by the county or other governmental agency having jurisdiction in the county.
- 6) The Special Use Permit, with the recommended conditions of approval, complies with the requirements of Chapters 17.03.150 Special Use Permit, 17.12 General Provisions, and 17.15 Public Zone.
- 7) The Comstock Historic District has reviewed and approved the proposed project at their October 8, 2018 meeting.

February. Mr. Whitten mailed announcements to 16 Nevada counties and to some cities. Mr. Whitten reviewed perspective names of staff and citizen panels.

Mr. Gallagher gave explanations for departments whose expenses were over appropriations.

No retail sales of product will occur at the site. The property is approximately 2.70 acres in size and is located at 144 Elizabeth Lane, Mark Twain, Storey County, Nevada, Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 003-314-23.

Planner Kathy Canfield presented this Special Use Permit request for beekeeping, home grown-produce, and aqua farm for raising fish. 20 bee hives have been requested for this 2.7 acre property. Research was conducted regarding beekeeping. Ms. Canfield reviewed the information she received. Based on research, staff is recommending applicants be allowed to have 10 hives. Applicants could apply for additional hives after review in two years. The Planning Commission added a condition of a one year review to determine if there is any impact on neighbors. They also added two other conditions. A letter was received in support of the project.

Chairman McBride asked applicants if they would have adequate supply of water for the number of bees 20 hives would have, and to also raise fish.

Applicant Stacy Grimes said there is a water source at each colony. Aaron Grimes described the water system that would be installed. Mr. Grimes explained he wants to install a greenhouse with water tanks to raise the fish. A cistern to collect water is being looked at with a water system that would re-circulate. This should use minimal amount from the well.

Vice Chairman Gilman commented there may be an issue with the State regarding domestic water use versus commercial.

Commissioner Carmona applauded applicants as bees are integral part of society.

Ms. Canfield pointed out that under the Conditions of Approval applicant must provide documentation from the State Division of Water Resources showing adequate water rights exist for all uses on this property.

Public Comment:

Steve Massicotte, Mark Twain resident: Commented that three businesses were being put on one residential property impacting the area and expressed opposition and concern about children in the area. The Board (Planning Commission) approved ten hives without investigation. This is too much for a residential area and there is not enough food to sustain the bees.

Kris Thompson, Storey County resident and Planning Commission member: The Planning Commission considered, at length, the concerns about public safety. Mr. Thompson reviewed the information presented by applicants at the Planning Commission meeting regarding the number of bees and where they forage. The Planning Department staff did a lot of research of this issue which was presented to the Commission. There is an environmental benefit to having the bees.

Ms. Canfield indicated the number of ten hives is consistent with the Carson City ordinance for this size property. No one in Carson City brought up any issues with this number of bees.

Commissioner Carmona said that parents of children who are allergic to bees most likely are pro-active and send an epi-pen to school. To say children are in danger is going overboard.

Chairman McBride sees the concerns. If there are any issues, this SUP can be brought back to the Board to be revoked.

Ms. Canfield read the findings of fact:

This approval is for Special Use Permit 2019-001 to operate a home enterprise. The home enterprise will consist of beekeeping (with a maximum of <u>10</u> hives), a greenhouse to grow produce and an Aqua farm structure for raising fish. No retail sales of product will occur at the site. The property is approximately 2.70 acres in size and is located at 144 Elizabeth Lane, Mark Twain, Storey County, Nevada, Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 003-314-23.

The proposed project complies with the general purpose, goals, objectives, and standards of the county master plan, this title, and any other plan, program, map, or ordinance adopted, or under consideration pursuant to official notice by the county.

The proposal location, size, height, operations, and other significant features will be compatible with and will not cause substantial negative impact on adjacent land uses, or will perform a function or provide a service that is essential to the surrounding land uses, community, and neighborhood.

The proposed project will result in no substantial or undue adverse effect on adjacent property, the character of the neighborhood, traffic conditions, parking, public improvements, public sites or right-of-way, or other matters affecting the public health, safety, and general welfare, either as they now exist or as they may in the future be developed as a result of the implementation of the provisions and policies of the county master plan, this title, and any other plans, program, map or ordinance adopted or under consideration pursuant to an official notice, by the county, or other governmental agency having jurisdiction to guide growth and development.

Taylor Tremaine from Community Chest said her goal is to provide resources and contacts for seniors, and those in need, at little to no cost.

Cherie Nevin, Community Services Director, commented this was the first time Storey County has done this MOU. Many other counties and agencies are already participating in similar support and services.

At your March 19, 2019 regular meeting, you will be presented with 3 finalists for the position of Storey County Manager - Ron Knecht, Austin Osborne and Marena Works.

The position announcement was posted on January 8, 2019 and was viewed over 230 times. The position announcement was also sent to every county, as well as to rural cities in Nevada. As of February 1, 2019, we received a total of 20 applications and expressions of interest. After reviewing the applications against the education and experience requirements set forth in the position announcement, 8 applicants were chosen for telephone interview. We received two more applications after these interviews were completed, however, neither of those applicants possessed the minimum experience requirements. Of the 8 interviewed by phone, 7 were selected for interview with citizen and staff interview panels. Prior to the interviews, 3 candidates withdrew their names from consideration - one because of a promotion, one because the Storey County residency requirement presented a hardship due to prior commitments and one because the salary was not sufficient. The final 4 candidates were interviewed by the panels on February 26, 2019. The top two candidates chosen by the panels were as follows:

Prior to the panel interviews, the applicants prior employment and education were verified by a third party. Other written references have been submitted directly the County Manager and will be provided prior to the interviews.

At the interviews, you will have the opportunity to ask the candidates 3 questions each. It is important that each candidate is asked the same question. All Commissioners are welcome to ask follow-up questions, however, the question should be a follow-up to the answer given by the candidate. A follow-up question should not vary widely from the subject of the original question.

After the interviews, you will be given the opportunity to select one of these finalists as the successful candidate, subject to passing a criminal background investigation and successfully negotiating a salary. If the Board decides that none of these candidates meet with your approval, you may direct staff to repeat the recruitment process.

NEVADA CONTROLLER RON KNECHT, MS, JD & PE

Ron Knecht, an economist, financial and policy analyst, Professional Mechanical Engineer (registered in California) and law-school graduate, became Controller on January 5, 2015. As Controller, he also serves on Nevada's Board of Finance, Executive Audit Committee and Department of Transportation Board of Directors.

Ron, his Deputy and team cut Controller's office spending 13% from the levels passed by the Legislature and Governor based on his predecessor's request. While returning over \$1-million to the state treasury, they made innovations and he wrote most of Nevada's first three Controller's Annual Reports (CARs), which won awards.

He inherited a troubled debt collection IT development project based on a flawed contract. Ron and the team worked tirelessly with the developer and others to twice renegotiate the contract and successfully turn around the project. In the first year using the new system, they increased debt collection revenues 3.5 times. Ron is also co-leading the business process re-engineering for all state agencies and development of a huge all-functions enterprise resource management IT system (SMART21) to fully integrate the agencies IT systems by 2022.

Ron wrote the detailed analysis showing why all of the new CAR (a/k/a Popular Annual Financial Report, or PAFR) should be included in Nevada's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR), as it now is. His Chief CAFR Accountant required Nevada state and local agencies to reform their reporting of pension-related information to fully conform to Government Accounting Standards Board requirements.

He led a team that developed an alternative state budget in 2015 that would have obviated a tax increase. Since the Legislature passed and the Governor signed Nevada's largest tax increase ever, he has led efforts to repeal the worst part of the increase, the Commerce Tax. He has also led efforts to reform the forecasting of returns on state pension investments and expected employee counts to avoid a crisis due to underfunding.

Before becoming Controller, Ron divided 44 working years between public service and entrepreneurial small business, all in managerial/executive and senior professional positions. He's been a founder, executive or director for 12 firms, charities, community-service and public-interest groups.


In previous jobs, he testified extensively as an expert witness on a number of subjects. In 2012-14, 1986-2001 and 1976-78, he was a consultant, expert witness and business executive. In 2001-12, he was a senior economist at Nevada's Public Utilities Commission. He held principal economics, finance, policy and technology positions in 1978-86 at California's Energy and Public Utilities Commissions, and he also served in management roles.

In 2009-13 he co-taught about ten two-day seminars for SNI. Financial on utility finance, cost of capital, and economic and policy issues for regulators, professionals, managers and securities analysts. In 1973-77, he was a Research Associate and Research Engineer at the University of Illinois. In 1972-73 he was Assistant City Engineer in Urbana, Illinois. He's been a columnist for print and on-line papers and has taught part-time at two colleges.

Controller's Duties

The Controller is the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State of Nevada and as such has a very wide range of duties. He also serves on Nevada's Board of Finance (which requires investment expertise), its Executive Audit Committee (which needs audit experience) and the Board of Directors for the Department of Transportation (which calls for a full range of policy, procedures and operations knowledge, including subject matter understanding). The Controller's office is charged with the day-to-day back-office management and operations functions for the whole state, including:

- * preparing the single audit and summary of prior year findings;
- * running numerous financial and accounting systems;
- * preparing the Comprehensive Annual Financial Reports (CAFRs) and the Popular Annual Financial Reports (PAFRs, a/k/a the Controller's Annual Report, or CAR);
- * overseeing the Government Accounting Board (GASB) implementations;
- * making "Rainy Day" and Disaster Relief transfers;
- * liaison with external auditors:
- * managing agency services to other state and local government departments;
- * preparing the CMIA annual report and interest calculations;
- * bank reconciliation oversight and processing reverted checks:
- * various federal income tax oversight and reporting;
- * garnishment review and signature;
- * managing the office's internal information technology operations;
- * working on special IT projects, including co-leading the all-agency, all-function enterprise resource planning and management IT system (SMART21) development for 2022, including especially extensive business processing re-engineering for all state agencies;
- * working with IT vendors and other agencies and overseeing system implementations;
- * identifying, tracking and assisting in compliance with laws, rules and regulations related to IT operations (e.g. PII and PCI);
- * full coordination with state risk management department and operations;
- * interfacing with other CIO agencies and providing help desk functions;
- * preparing and managing the office's budget;
- * registering vendors for state and providing necessary related services to them;

- * running debt collection operations, including processing payment plans, referring accounts for writeoff, and communicating with outside collection agencies and state agencies;
- * automating debt collection processes and monitoring contracts for automation;
- reviewing and approving debt collection transfers to agencies and the debt recovery fund;
- * ensuring compliance with federal and state debt collection laws;
- * writing and processing RFPs and RFQs for debt collection and other services and supervising contractors;
- * hiring, managing (allocating), supervising and disciplining staff and all other needed resources;
- * interfacing with all other state branches and agencies as required; and
- * preparing and presenting testimony before the Legislature and other bodies as required.

In addition to all these back-office functions, Nevada's Controller has a statutory duty promote state frugality and economy, plus better management of the state's fiscal affairs and creditworthiness, and better understanding of all these matters for everyone (public, press, legislators and other officials). Openness, transparency and accountability are paramount in these areas.

The Controller also holds hearings on payroll overpayments and public employee union dues, and writes decisions to resolve those matters. And answers Nevada Public Records (FOIA-type) requests and provides information to the public upon request and necessity.

My work in 2012-14 as a private consultant, which is not separately listed here, was similar to my work at B&K, QED, Spectrum and ETAG, but without as much management cimponent.

<u>Duties as Commissioner's Senior Advisor and Principal Regulactry Specialist at CA Energy Commission</u>

Professional duties essentially the same as at CPUC, but didn't include much about ratemaking. Instead, electric and gas resource planning, plus power economics, planning and technical matters and policy analysis for energy, especially alternatives and conservation. As Commissioner's Senior Advisor, I dealt with all subject matter and procedural issues that came before the commission, plus policy, personnel and management issues. Filed court testimony for commission as an expert witness on nuclear and other power production matters.

1. Taxes Approved by the Legislature and Counties

School districts in Nevada receive several types of taxes that are specifically earmarked for capital needs. These taxes present several challenges to school districts. First, school districts lack the authority to impose taxes on their own. Instead, this authority rests with the Nevada Legislature. In some cases, the Legislature

During the Great Recession, several new types of bonds were allowed by the Federal government to spur infrastructure construction and create jobs. Collectively, this group of bonds were known as Buy America Bonds and they involved a subsidy of interest expenditures from the Federal government. During this time, CCSD issued debt under the Buy America Bonds (known as Qualified School Construction Bonds). While CCSD was still obligated to service the principal and interest of the bonds, the Federal government has provided an annual revenue to reimburse or subsidize the interest expenditures, effectively creating an interest-free borrowing. However, the amount of subsidy was lowered during the sequester (2013) and has not been restored so the subsidy no longer fully subsidizes the interest of the bonds.

NRS 387.331 Imposition of tax in school district whose population is less than 55,000; limitation on amount; deposit of proceeds.

1. The tax on residential construction authorized by this section is a specified amount which must be the same for

(a) Lot for a mobile home;

(b) Residential dwelling unit; and

(c) Suite in an apartment house.

imposed on the privilege of constructing apartment houses and residential dwelling units and developing lots for mobile homes.

2. The board of trustees of any school district whose population is less than 55,000 may request that the board of county commissioners of the county in which the school district is located impose a tax on residential construction in the school district to construct, remodel and make additions to school buildings. Whenever the board of trustees takes that action, it shall notify the board of county commissioners and shall specify the areas of the county to be served by the buildings to be erected or enlarged.

3. If the board of county commissioners decides that the tax should be imposed, it shall notify the Nevada Tax Commission. If the Commission approves, the board of county commissioners may then impose the tax, whose specified

amount must not exceed \$1,600.

4. The board shall collect the tax so imposed, in the areas of the county to which it applies, and may require that

administrative costs, not to exceed I percent, be paid from the amount collected.

5. The money collected must be deposited with the county treasurer in the school district's fund for capital projects to be held and expended in the same manner as other money deposited in that fund.

(Added to NRS by 1979, 1287; A 1983, 1635; 1989, 1924; 1997, 2358; 2001, 1987; 2011, 1247)

NRS 387.332 Duty of Nevada Tax Commission to review need for tax. The Nevada Tax Commission shall, every 4 years after it has approved the imposition of a tax on residential construction in a particular county or area of a county, review the need for the tax under the circumstances existing at the time of the review. If the Commission finds that the tax is no longer needed, it shall so inform the board of county commissioners of that county, who shall repeal the tax as of the end of the current fiscal year.

GENERAL INFORMATION BUILDING PERMITS ON RESIDENTIAL LOTS

This information is provided to aid in preparing applications to obtain required building permits on residential lots in unincorporated Lyon County. Please review this information and the application carefully. Due to office space limitations incomplete applications cannot be accepted and held while missing information is gathered. Incomplete applications inadvertently accepted may be returned. A deposit to cover plan review costs will be required with the permit application.

Generally, <u>all</u> new construction, repair or remodeling of buildings or structures on residential lots will **require** permits from the Building Dept. Exceptions include fences (call for height limitations) and a <u>detached</u> accessory structure less than 200 SF with no electric or plumbing. All structures must comply with the current (2012) building codes (including energy conservation) adopted by Lyon County. Amendments to the published codes are as cited in County Code Title 10, Chapter 7.

A residence must be the first building permitted, constructed and approved for occupancy. Electric service to the lot must be associated with a building permit.

Under Nevada law you may apply as an Owner/Builder in certain circumstances. Appropriate affidavits must be signed which acknowledge the requirements of an Owner/Builder permit. Plans submitted must indicate Owner/Builder and be signed and dated. You must then occupy the building for at least one year after final approval. (An O/B cannot construct a duplex.)

No application can be accepted unless provisions for water/sewer services are addressed. Appropriate "will serve" letters from the utility district, well driller's contract, septic application with perc test data or evidence of existing utilities are required. Sewer/water facilities must be on the same lot as the building being served. State law establishes minimum lot sizes which may use a septic system (an additional reserve leach area is required). Single-family residences cannot "share" a domestic water well.

Lots in FEMA designated **flood hazard areas** require a "Floodplain Development Permit" from the Planning Dept. You must furnish an elevation certificate, on the prescribed form, establishing the design and then verifying that the actual built lowest floor components are elevated above flood levels per Lyon County Title 12 & 2012 IRC. In some areas the certificate must be prepared by a licensed engineer or surveyor.

Properties accessing county roads or state highways must furnish a copy of the appropriate access permit from the County Road Dept. or NDOT.

Site preparation involving mass grading of the lot (beyond excavation for building and utility lines) will either require a **grading permit** (currently issued by the Planning Dept.) or may be included in the building permit. In either case site plans prepared by a licensed NV civil engineer will be <u>required</u> for review by the County Engineer for compliance with county drainage requirements.

Each application must contain two complete sets of drawings and calculations as described in the application forms. Although "Architect" quality is not required, the drawings must be neatly drawn (straight lines, true angles, etc), fully dimensioned in proportional scale, and contain sufficient detail that would enable a competent person to build exactly what you want, where you want it. We will not accept "free-hand" sketches or the like. We cannot accept plans prepared by out-of-state vendors/designers unless stamped by professional designers licensed in Nevada. All structural engineering including required truss sheets must contain the "wet-seal" stamp of the engineer. All plans must be prepared by NV licensed designers, licensed contractors for their own scope of work, or an owner/builder. Each drawing must indicate the preparer with original stamps, license numbers and signatures. Documents submitted for building permits are not regarded as in the public domain. Copies may only be obtained with written authorization of the preparer.

Taxes on new dwelling construction and lot development have been adopted for roads, parks and schools. These taxes could typically amount to \$3500.00 and are in addition to building permit fees. Effective 7/1/2015 a processing fee of \$25.00 will be charged in addition to building permit fees for each permit that is issued.

Inclusionary Housing (aka Inclusionary Zoning): Inclusionary housing programs allow local governments to either incentivize or else require developers to include a certain percentage of affordable renter or owner-occupied units in new market-rate residential developments. To offset the development cost, jurisdictions will often permit a density bonus in return for the provision of affordable units.

Low Impact Development (LID): Low impact development refers to development practices that reduce stormwater runoff from sites by increasing on-site detention and natural filtering mechanisms, such as swales. LID practices help to protect water quality and aquatic life and help to reduce the need for large scale stormwater management systems.

Manufactured Housing: Manufactured housing is housing that is transported to a site on a chassis and which is also known as HUD Code Homes. Manufactured homes previous to 1976 are usually still referred to as mobile homes. The National Manufactured Housing Act regulates the inspection of these homes, which are not regulated by local building codes. The Nevada Housing Division is responsible for inspecting manufactured homes in Nevada.

Modular Housing: Modular, or Factory Built Housing, is constructed on-site and must comply with local building codes.

National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS): The National Ambient Air Quality Standards cover six different air pollutants regulated under the 1970 Clean Air Act and include ozone, particulate matter, carbon monoxide, nitrogen dioxide, sulfur dioxide, and lead.

Nonpoint Source (NPS): A nonpoint source of water pollution means contaminants such as oil, sediment, pesticides, bacteria, and nutrients are carried into surface water directly or through storm drains when rain, snowmelt or irrigation water flows over developed land. There is no point or direct discharge source for the pollutants.

Permitted Use: A land use that is permitted by right in a specific zoning district and requires no review by the local planning department. Although a permitted use may be permitted by right, there may be specific standards that apply. For example, home occupations may be a permitted use in all residential dwellings, provided certain standards are met, such as no signage and no outside employees.

Poverty Rate: The poverty rate is the percentage of people below the federal poverty level. The 2016 poverty level for one person is \$11,770 and the poverty level for a family of four is 24,250.

Prime Farmland: Prime Farmland includes soils that offer the best physical and chemical characteristics for producing food, feed, forage, fiber, and oilseed crops.

Public Land: Public Land is defined as land or interest in land owned by the US and administered by the Secretary of the Interior through the BLM without regard to how the US acquired ownership, except lands located on the Outer Continental Shelf and land held for the benefit of Indians, Aleuts, and Eskimos (source: Bureau of Land Management, Public Land Statistics, 2013).

Receiving Area: A designated location for development rights transferred off sending areas. A receiving area is a future land use designation in the Douglas County Master Plan and does not change the underlying base zoning district.

Residential Construction Tax (RCT): The residential construction tax is authorized under Nevada state law to help jurisdictions pay for parks, schools, and transportation. In Douglas County, the RCT for parks is either \$1,000 or 1 percent of the valuation for each dwelling unit, \$1,600 for schools, and \$500 per dwelling unit or \$0.50 per square foot for non-residential development for transportation. The school RCT is only permitted for school districts (counties) with less than 55,000 population.
